Prior to the hunt, leaders gave a brief overview of the history of our area and instructed the scouts and siblings on safe gathering techniques. Then, dressed in waders, water shoes and rain boots, the scouts set forth on their adventure. Walking slowly along the creek beds and carefully scanning the gravel areas they picked their sifting locations. Using a variety of sifting pans, the scouts were successful in finding ray and shark teeth as well as squid pen fossils and many, many curious objects. With the help of their leaders, scouts worked to identify their treasures before deciding which ones to take and which to leave for the next treasure hunters.

This event closed out a summer full of outdoor opportunities scouts leaders provided for scouts ages Kindergarten - 5th grade to continue to foster an appreciation for the outdoors while engaging in learning-rich adventures.

VOLUNTEERS LEND A HELPING HAND TO FOOD PANTRY

Warren Township

When Tropical Storm Ida tore through Somerset County, it left serious devastation to the Feeding Hands Food Pantry. Two of their distribution centers, including one in Raritan, took in several feet of water destroying everything inside.

Sadly, the Feeding Hands Food Pantry threw out roughly 25 tons of food--at least \$100,000 worth, and lost all 12 of their refrigeration units along with a delivery truck. In the past year, Feeding Hands has helped approximately 650 families by distributing more than \$1,000,000 worth of food.

On Sunday afternoon, September 12, thanks to the coordination of Fire Chief Mark Russo, a dedicated group of volunteers met at Mount Bethel Volunteer Fire Company to clean a truck filled with muddy items that were salvaged from the floodwaters. All of the items were thoroughly cleaned, sanitized allowing Feeding Hands to reopen to assist their families in need.

JANET COLMAN OF WARREN SWORN IN AS ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

The latest class of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster youth have taken their oath before a Union County Superior Court Judge and are now ready to be matched to their case as the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County. Janet Colman of Warren is among them.

The nonprofit, which began in Union County in 2005, recruits, trains, supports, and supervises volunteers to serve local child-victims removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect or abandonment, and living in foster care. It is the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for Union County judges hearing youth cases.

"The reason why I became a CASA volunteer was somewhat selfish," said Colman. My 'day

job' hadn't felt fulfilling on a personal level and I wanted to put my skillset – working with children – to better use. I cannot wait to finally get started and hope to make a difference in a child's life," she added.

Superior Court Judge James Hely presided over the swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; once matched to their youth or sibling set, advocates will begin putting their 30 hours of training into practice. Colman was joined by fellow classmates Komal Nankani of Summit, Karime Herrera and James Walker Jr. of Elizabeth, Mike Caporaso of Lebanon, Regina O'Connor of Fanwood, and Veronica Gardner of Union.

Volunteers need no special prior background or experience to serve as advocates; each undergoes a thorough training process and is supported by CASA staff. Successful advocates bring with them varied life experiences and professional backgrounds. No matter the age of the youth to whom they are assigned, advocates' commitment to being a consistent presence –

many foster youth experience a revolving door of professionals in addition to the separation from family members – and ensuring needs are identified and recommendations are made to the judge and stakeholders, the trajectory of a child's life can be changed for the better.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth, foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers in order to identify and report to the judge any concerns and needs in order to protect best interests.

The organization remains committed to serving every Union County youth in foster care; to do that, more community volunteers are needed to step up and train as an advocate for a local child-victim who could range from birth to age 21.





CALLING ALL TWEENS AND TEENS TO EXPERIENCE TEENTOBER

SCLSNJ

Did you know that approximately 14 million middle and high school students are on their own after school? In Somerset County, where individuals aged 18 years or younger makeup almost 22 percent of the population, the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) provides inclusive spaces for students to discover new experiences; form connections with their community; and explore opportunities through programs, resources, materials, and services.

In order to continue to enrich the lives of tweens and teens in the community, SCLSNJ will participate in TeenTober, a month-long commemoration organized by the Young Adult Library Services Association (YALSA) that "aims to celebrate teens and promote year-round teen services and literacies," throughout October.

During TeenTober the Library System will offer a series of virtual and in-branch programs that focus on creative expression, traditional and digital literacy, workforce development, and peer-to-peer engagement.

According to YALSA, libraries "have a strong track record of providing a variety of key services that meet the unique needs of teens." In fact, data has shown that approximately 97 percent of public libraries have a designated section for teen materials.

In addition to programming, available digital resources include Brainfuse HelpNow, which offers free one-on-one online tutoring, a writing lab, and more; and LearningExpress Library, which provides interactive tutorials, practice tests, e-books, and other tools for academic skill-building and test preparation.



The Somerset County Board of County Commissioners held a ceremony on the Historic Courthouse Green in Somerville to honor the 20th anniversary of September 11.

To commemorate the occasion, the American flag was on display in front of the historic courthouse and on Somerville Fire Department fire engines lined up alongside the Memorial Clock Tower. Other symbols of the 20th anniversary included the Somerville Rescue Squad ambulance that worked at ground zero for several days after the attacks, and seven signature boards signed by residents in 2002 at the first Somerset County 9/11 ceremony.

In addition, two new signature boards were added in honor of the 20th anniversary that are available for people to sign.

Leading the Pledge of Allegiance was Former Chief Keith Silverman of Somerset Fire & Rescue Station 56 in Franklin Township. Silverman is also an instructor at the Somerset County Emergency Services Training Academy. Also participating in the ceremony was the Somerset County Sheriff's Office Honor Guard and Somerset County Police Pipes & Drums, which performed "Amazing Grace" and the Armed Forces medley.

The Board of Commissioners took turns

reading the names of the 39 Somerset County residents killed in the attacks. Afterwards, the Sheriff's Honor Guard led the procession to the Memorial Clock Tower where Director Robinson and Deputy Director Sara Sooy placed a wreath at the base of the steel beam recovered from the World Trade Center.
