NEW SUPERINTENDENT WELCOMES 2021-2022 STAFF

Westfield Public Schools

Superintendent Dr. Raymond González welcomed back staff on Wednesday, September 1 as the Westfield Public School District prepared for the return of students on Thursday, September 9.

During two opening day ceremonies for elementary and secondary educators, González - who joined the district on August 2 - welcomed 42 new staff members and applauded the teachers and staff gathered in the Westfield High School auditorium for their dedication, perseverance, and commitment to their students throughout the pandemic.

González reiterated that the educational, physical, and emotional health and wellness of students and staff remain a priority, as outlined in A Safe Return, the district's plan for the 2021-2022 school year which is posted on the district and school websites at westfieldnjk12.org.

Westfield Education Association (WEA) President Gail Alston, WEA Negotiating Team Member Lori Swanson and Board of Education President Amy Root also were on hand to welcome the educators and to praise their hard work and dedication, especially during a challenging year.

Following a delayed opening to allow staff time to address aftermath of Hurricane Ida, teachers

paraprofessionals gathered again on Thursday, September 2 for professional learning organized by Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum, Instruction and Programs Paul Pineiro and facilitated by district administrators. There workshops sessions and focusing identifying/addressing student learning gaps, subject area curriculum reviews, Social and Emotional Learning (SEL), COVID protocols/procedures, and other topics.

On August 30 and 31, the 42 new staff members attended a two-day, in-house orientation as part of the New Staff Institute (NSI). The NSI is a two-year program designed to support first-time educators and those who are new to the district. The comprehensive program is organized by Human Resources Specialist Barbara Ball and her staff, along with a leadership team comprised of seasoned Westfield educators.

"During the month since I joined the Westfield Public School District, I have enjoyed meeting our extraordinary administrators, teachers, and staff," says González. "I am inspired, but not surprised, by their unwavering devotion to their students. I look forward to the 2021-2022 school year and to our continued partnership with our school community."

Now in its 13th year, AppleFest is an annual fund-raising event, hosted on the lawn of the Reeve House on Mountain Avenue, and it draws visitors of all ages who participate in activities centered around a "theme" that celebrates a particular historical time, past or present. Pedals for Progress, in its continuing effort to recycle bicycles properly, is having a used bike collection sponsored by the Westfield Rotary Club. Anyone with an adult or child's bicycle in repairable condition is urged to donate his or her bike to this worthy cause.

Pedals for Progress does not accept bikes for parts or disassembled bikes. Bikes can be dropped off from 9 a.m. to noon on Saturday, October 9, rain or shine, at the board of education building, located at Walnut and Elm Streets in Westfield.

To date, more than 159,000 bikes and 5,100 sewing machines have been shipped to developing countries in Latin America, Africa and Eastern Europe. These bikes provide reliable transportation for commuting to work, transporting produce to market, or accessing health care and other services.

It costs \$45 to collect, process, ship, rebuild and distribute each bicycle. A donation toward shipping costs is necessary (suggested minimum \$20 per bike). All cash and material donations are fully tax deductible and a receipt will be available at the collection site.

Pedals for Progress/Sewing Peace is a 501 (c) (3) corporation and a registered charity in six states including New Jersey and New York. Brochures explaining this innovative program will be available at the collection site. Pedals for Progress seeks donations of wrenches for its overseas shops. 



The Westfield Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) will present its 2021 Harry Devlin Commendations for outstanding efforts in historic preservation at an awards ceremony and reception at Lion's Roar Brewing Company on Monday, October 18, at 7:30 p.m. Three honorary awards will also be bestowed for special achievement, including the Chairman's Choice Award - the commission's highest honor - in posthumous recognition of Robert Newell, a longtime planning board member and dedicated preservationist.

"We are thrilled to resume the Devlin Awards after the pandemic forced last year's hiatus," said HPC chair Maria Boyes. "We are especially grateful to be holding the ceremony inside one of this year's winning properties, which has undergone multiple transitions over nearly a century to become an exciting new addition to Westfield's downtown. It, along with four other southside properties are among the eight commercial and residential honorees being recognized this year."

Named for Harry Devlin, a noted artist and architectural historian who was one of the founding judges, the awards program was established in 1992 to honor outstanding efforts in the restoration, expansion and maintenance of older properties. This year's awards will be bestowed in five categories: Commercial/Institutional Property; Adaptive Reuse; Sensitive Addition; Restoration and Period-Appropriate Painting/Siding; and New Construction Sensitive to the Area.




WESTFIELD ROTARIANS PROVIDE FOR HOMELESS VETERANS

FLINTLOCKS RUN CUB SCOUT WOOD TOOLS BADGE PROGRAM

the Flintlocks BSA, Inc. ran the Cub Scout Wood Tools Program at the Watchung Mountain District Spring Cub Family Camporee at Boy Scout Camp Winnebago in Rockaway, NJ this spring.

Fifty-three Cub Scouts earned a Woodcraft badge by learning about how to use wood tools, safety measures, and building a small bird house. The program starts with one of the Flintlocks explaining how to use wood tools properly and important safety measures. After the Cub Scouts build their bird house, they may practice using screwdrivers and a coping saw. The parents work with the children, and the Flintlocks offer guidance.

The Camporee has many different activities, including Archery, Batting cages, BB guns, First Aid Classes, and Fishing Derby, Climbing wall, Basketball, Volleyball, a 2-mile Hike, Rockets and Catapults. The shooting sports programs have NJ State Certified Instructors. Since it is a family camporee, and since girls may now join scouts, entire families may enjoy the fun, and the scouts earn various badges. Attendance at the camporee was 150 scouts with an equal number of parents. This was one of the first big events at the scout camp since the shutdown

over a year ago.

The Flintlocks BSA, Inc are a group of 27 retired scouters who volunteer every week all year round to help the scout camps of the Patriot's Path Council. They are incorporated as a separate 501c3. Facebook page is "Flintlocks". They do maintenance at the camps, build cabins, tent platforms, picnic tables, etc. In 2018 they built a STEM lab classroom for scientific related merit badges. The members also volunteer to help the scouts with various programs throughout the year. The Flintlocks purchase lumber from a lumber mill, then make the parts for the craft kits in their wood shop which are sold at the Council Scout shops. Bird houses have the bottoms attached with screws since a mother bird wants to build a new nest every year. The old nest needs to be cleaned out in the fall so a new family can start over again in the spring.

> Holy Trinity Parish was founded in September 1872 to serve Westfield residents whose only previous option for participating at a Catholic Mass was to travel to churches in Plainfield, Rahway, Elizabeth and Stony Hill (Watchung), according to a 1972 article in the Diocesan newspaper The Advocate, on the occasion of Holy Trinity's 100th anniversary. The earliest Masses were held in the Westfield freight station of the Central Railroad (now NJ Transit) to accommodate a growing stream of new parishioners arriving at Holy Trinity by train. Sometime later, a white frame church was built on New York Ave., now Trinity Place. Once again, the location was chosen for its proximity to the train station. An elementary school was built in 1916, followed by other structures including a rectory, convent and the current Church which was built in 1921.

"Throughout its history, Holy Trinity has been a vibrant and vital participant in the community," said Father Randazzo. "Our first 150 years have been rooted in faith. As we move ahead in love, my hopes and prayers for our people are that their faith will always be centered in the practice of Jesus' teaching with compassion and love, based in scripture but evolving in the Catholic tradition; that they continue our tradition of reaching out inter-religiously with all faith-based people, deepening our open dialogue and solidarity with all; and that they continue our strong commitment to educating and strengthening our young. We welcome all members of the Westfield community and beyond to join us in the celebration of our 150th anniversary."




