CLARK PATRIOTS' NIGHT LIGHTS UP THE TOWN



KIWANIS CLUB OF CLARK AIDS FAMILY IN TOWN

When the floodwaters rose from the remnants of Hurricane Ida in early September, several families in Union County were affected. The Mekkawy family, residents on Valley Road in Clark, lost their belongings and the entire home. Not only was the house and its contents destroyed, but significantly important, the

wheelchair, walker, and leg braces for 13-yearold daughter Sima were gone.

A posting in "nextdoor," a neighborhood app that includes Union County and beyond, reached one of the Kiwanis Club of Clark members, and she was moved. A mother's plea for prayers by Mrs. Salma Mekkawy was heart-wrenching. The message read, "Please pray for us! We lost everything even my handicapped daughter's wheelchair and walker!! Evacuated the house with our PJ's and slippers." The philanthropic organization that focuses on helping children, wanted to do something more than just pray. The club immediately collected money from its members and a few friends to assist the family that was being housed temporarily at the Holiday Inn in Clark. They presented Mrs. Mekkawy with a gift of \$900 as well as a basket of school supplies for the children.

The Mekkawy family consists of a single mom, a teenage girl, an adult daughter who attends Union County College in Cranford, and a son who attends Carl H. Kumpf Middle School in Clark. Mrs. Mekkawy met with the Kiwanis Club of Clark's president Cara Hund to tell of their plight. She explained that on top of it all, both she and her adult daughter lost their cars in the flood. Currently, the Mekkawy family is still residing at the Holiday Inn in Clark. Because the flooding is considered a "catastrophic weather event" their insurance company will not cover any damage to the home. "We just felt we wanted to help this mother and her children in our community as soon as we could," Ms. Hund said.

For the last few years the New Jersey Veterans Network and its mobile outreach team has been aggressively seeking out veterans in need and providing them resources to have a better way of life. This is only possible because of our volunteers' commitment and dedication with helping our veteran community. Donations are wonderful and help us purchase food, clothing, medical equipment and other life changing items, however someone's time is what makes an enormous difference.

During our charity's existence, we have provided meals for thousands of veterans and servicemen, dropped off PPE and clothing to veterans, provided medical equipment for disabled veterans, had 30 cars donated to disabled veterans, and most importantly we successfully saved the lives of veterans who were in some type of a dangerous crisis.

Every day we lose approximately 22 veterans to suicide and unfortunately this number hasn't changed over the years. Depression, PTSD and trauma run extremely high among our veterans provide peer support sponsors for any veteran in and their family members. There are countless lifesaving programs out there for veterans, however it's a difficult task to get veterans to trust others and go get the help they need to live a better life.

The New Jersey Veterans Network also has a program called Operation Rebound that consists of a mobile outreach team that helps to train veterans for events like races, hiking, and other athletic activities. The goal of Operation Rebound is to do athletic events from 5k races to long distance Iron Man competitions in order to empower the veterans and show the public how people can do amazing things with the proper support. It is truly incredible to see the veterans go from no physical activity to completing these tremendous athletic challenges.

Our charity has been able to work alongside other amazing charities that always put veterans first and are capable of rapidly providing them with essential resources. Recently, we formed a veteran anti-suicide and PTSD awareness coalition, called Uniformed Heroes, that will need. Our peer support sponsors will be trained by the VA and Penn Med and our goal is to have volunteers statewide to help veterans in need.

To make this upcoming Uniformed Heroes campaign successful, we are in desperate need of volunteers from both the veteran and civilian communities. There are numerous events and daily tasks that our charity could use assistance with and we are always looking to have more volunteers willing to help us reach veterans in need.

Our goal is to provide all veterans in need with a peer support sponsor that will do whatever they can to help veterans with obtaining the resources needed to live a better life. This is not an easy thing to do, but the New Jersey Veterans Network has already been able to make a huge difference because of the team's volunteers and its strong partnerships with other charities.





SCOUT EXECUTIVE SPEAKS TO ROTARY CLUB

Marc Andreo, the Scout Executive and CEO of the Patriot's Path Council, Boy Scouts of America spoke to the Rotary Club of Westfield on Tuesday, September 21, 2021. His topic was to update the club on the state of the local Scouting. The pandemic has decreased the scouting program somewhat, but it is still going strong, and they are planning to rebuild it to where it was before the shutdown.

Paul Harris, the man who started Rotary International in 1905, was great friends with James E. West who started the Boy Scouts of America in 1910. Paul gave advice on how to spread the program throughout the US, mirroring the way Rotary clubs were spreading. Both organizations have a lot of similarities, including an ethical code, teaching leadership skills, being community based and service oriented. Rotary clubs currently charter 1,000 scout units across the US.

The Patriot's Path Council, BSA consists of 5 counties in northern New Jersey with more than 10,000 scouts and 4,000 adult volunteers. They are in the counties of Sussex, Morris, Somerset, Union and northern Middlesex. The headquarters in Cedar Knolls has only 25 full-time staff. There are two scout shops one in Cedar Knolls, and one in Mountainside.

The Council offers three Day Camps: at Watchung Reservation; Johnson Park, New Brunswick; and Camp Wheeler at Mt. Allamuchy Scout Reservation. The Council offers four overnight camping opportunities: Winnebago Scout Reservation in Rockaway, NJ; Mt. Allamuchy in Byram Township; Sabattis Adventure Camp in Long Lake NY, and the four national high adventure bases: The Summit in West Virginia; Northern Tier in Minnesota, Sea Base in the Florida Keys, and Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico.

Recent changes to the Scouts include welcoming girls to the Cub Scout and the legacy Boy Scout programs three years ago. The purpose was to include entire families in the activities. To accommodate this change, the "Boy Scout" program for ages 5th grade through age 18 was renamed the "Scouts BSA". The name of the parent organization remains the Boy Scouts of America. The Cub Scout program is for children from K through 5th grade; Scouts BSA is for children 5th grade through age 18. Other programs have been coed for many decades, including Explorers - who explore career opportunities, Venture Crews - who go on high adventure trips, Sea Scouts who learn mariner skills, and a relatively new program -STEM- in which students explore science related careers. These last four programs welcome boys and girls from ages 14 to 21.

Cub Scout Dens may be all boy and all girl, or coed. Scouts BSA Troops are either all girl or all boy. This year there are 250,000 young women in the scouts, and 1,000 girls were the first graduating class of female Eagle Scouts. Only 4% of all scouts ever achieve the rank of Eagle, making it a mark of distinction.

The residents of Westfield are enthusiastic supporters of Scouting. There are 12 units: 7 Cub Scout Packs and 5 Scout Troops, with nearly 500 youth, which is double the national average. Last year the Patriots' Path Council recognized 315 Eagle Scouts and Scouts collectively earned more than 6,200 merit badges. The Rotary Club of Westfield has been a long time supporter of the Scouts. Several members are Eagle Scouts, and many of the


children of Rotarians are in the Scouting program, and a number have earned the rank of Eagle. The club likes to support Eagle Service projects financially.

Scout Executive Marc Andreo asked the Rotarians to help spread the word about local Scouting. With units and camps open again, they are seeking more youth to join the local programs. Please visit beascout.org to locate a unit near you!





MAKING MAGICAL MEMORIES AT CAMP FATIMA

Like most nonprofit organizations, Camp Fatima of New Jersey is experiencing major challenges due to COVID-19. Founded in 1968 by four Seton Hall seminary students, the camp offers free sleep-away programs for disabled children and adults. And it's determined to continue doing so. Seeing the smiles on the faces of those it serves, and providing a respite to their families, is not something that can be sacrificed due to a pandemic.

And smile they do. It's not called FATIMAGIC for nothing. The campers, regardless of their disabilities, get to do things that most able-bodied children and adults take for granted. They splash around in pools, sing songs, eat s'mores, dance, and take part in arts and crafts. Every child has his or her own dedicated counselor to ensure the utmost care, so each activity can be individually tailored according to the camper's ability.

Its mission statement, "Camp Fatima provides free, life enriching camp experiences for children and adults with developmental disabilities," says it all. Some of the campers are in wheelchairs, while others have neurological, sensory or other serious issues. Camp Fatima and its volunteers open their hearts to all who come. It truly is a magical place.

The volunteers come from diverse ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. Most have experience working directly with the disabled, and include teachers, nurses, police officers, firefighters, college students and other professionals. For these selfless individuals, the sounds of laughter and the looks of pure joy on the campers' faces are all the payment they need.

Many of these volunteers live locally. Billy Malone, a Scotch Plains firefighter and Fanwood resident, became a volunteer in 1994 and has been the chairperson for the past 13 years. Scotch Plains resident and former Scotch Plains police officer, Jamie Denman, has been a volunteer since 1979, and is the current director.

Even though no one at the camp is paid, all this magic requires funding. It costs several hundred thousand dollars to operate the two children's

summer sessions and the four adult weekends each year. Funding to support and host the more than 200 campers and over 450 on site-volunteers comes from generous benefactors, corporate matching gifts, private giving, and fundraising. Because of COVID-19, many of the usual fundraisers are not able to take place. So this year, Camp Fatima is looking for individuals to sponsor a camper. The cost to feed, house, and supply materials to each camper is more than \$1,000.

Caitlin was a selfless, loving, amazing, warmhearted girl who was one month shy of celebrating her 21st birthday when she tragically passed away. Her passion for life and devotion to helping others was remarkable.

Caitlin's brilliant smile had this way of lighting up a room. She had an incredible, dazzling charm and a sweet, warm personality. She was a fervent supporter of organ donation and strongly encouraged her family and friends to sign up to become organ donors. Caitlin gave the gift of life by donating her heart, lungs, kidneys, pancreas, and liver. She also donated over 200 bone and tissue grafts. Her gifts have already helped 50 people.

Our angel baby accomplished so much and touched so many lives in her 20 years. As a daughter, sister, girlfriend, cousin, friend, and niece, Caitlin will be missed terribly but will live on in our minds and hearts.

LIBRARY DISPLAY TO HIGHLIGHT VETERANS DAY

The American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) Unit 328 of Clark is coming to Clark Library this November to highlight Veterans Day. The display will highlight the history and works of the American Legion Auxiliary Unit 328.

May is poppy month for the American Legion Auxiliary. In May the Auxiliary distributes poppies to all and receives donations for their work with veterans. All poppy monies collected as per the Auxiliary by-laws must be used to aid veterans and their families.

The ALA library exhibit will focus on the tradition of the poppy, Auxiliary history, and its works throughout its 102 years of service. The poppy was adopted by the American Legion Auxiliary in 1919 at the end of World War One as its symbol of the sacrifice soldiers make for their country. The poppy is a small red flower which seems to survive in the worst of circumstances. This Remembrance Day symbol was mentioned in a poem, "In Flanders Field", written by a Canadian World War 1 brigade surgeon who saw red poppies on a field ravaged by battle.

Flanders Field, located in the northernmost region of the western front in Belgium, became the most devastated region of the entire battlefield. But soldiers noticed that Mother Nature never surrendered. Papaver Rhoeas, known as corn rose, red poppy, field poppy, and red weed, grew. The beautiful red poppy is classified as a weed and grows in the inhospitable, ravaged land. Indeed, it flourishes best in land that has been disturbed.

Lieutenant-Colonel John Alexander McCrae, a field surgeon with the Canadian Expeditionary Forces/ British Forces, was taking in casualties from the Second Battle of Ypres. In a letter to his mother, he wrote. "For seventeen days and seventeen nights none of us have had our clothes off, nor our boots even... In all that time while I was awake, gunfire and rifle fire never ceased for sixty seconds." His friend and former student, Lieutenant Alexis Helmer was killed in action.

McCrae conducted the burial service himself. He also noticed the red poppy and wrote a poem to remember his dead friend and those obstinate poppies. On December 8, 1915, his poem was published.

In 1919 the American Legion Auxiliary adopted the poppy to commemorate the one-year anniversary of the Armistice to end the war. The poppy recalls so many images of war: friendship, death, suffering, struggle, disease, injury, victory, defeat, love, patriotism. Images only the soldier/veteran can truly understand. But as Lieutenant-Colonel McCrae states in his poem, it is up to all of us to remember.

This Veterans Day remember every soldier who performed his duty to his country. Remember those who died in service to their country. Remember those who continue to serve today. Wear the poppy. Learn its history. Honor the tradition. Support those who distribute poppies.

Come to the Clark Library to learn about the Clark American Legion Auxiliary Unit 328 and discover what it's all about.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch: be yours to hold it high.

In Flanders fields.


