Annual Cranford Jaycees Event Raises A Record \$50,000+ The Cranford Jaycees' Oktoberfest event returned in-person for its ninth year on October 2nd, drawing a sold out crowd to the Union

County College parking lot and raising more than \$50,000 for local causes.

The crowd enjoyed live music from both a polka and a rock band while sampling an array of beverages and food.

The event's primary beneficiary is the Cranford First Aid Squad. The all-volunteer organization relies on Oktoberfest to provide up to 25% of its annual funding in traditional years, but with their facility damaged by Hurricane Ida, their needs have increased. Through ticket sales, sponsorships, and the 50/50 raffle proceeds, the Jaycees were able to donate \$30,000 to the squad, an increase of 50% over last year's donation.

In addition, event sponsor Brighton Air Corp donated \$5,000 to be earmarked for a new vocational school scholarship fund to be administered by the Jaycees. "Trade schools set students up for wellpaying careers. I'm happy to sponsor this scholarship to help make them more accessible for Cranford students," said Brighton Air Corp owner Daniel Ghanime.

\$8,000 was also raised for the Union County College scholarship fund, and additional event proceeds will be dispersed to community

organizations at a later date. Other lead sponsors included Cranford businesses Szeles Construction and Homegotowned.

Last year's event was held in backyards across town with the Jaycees delivering food, beverages, and party supplies.

"We were so excited to be able to have this event in person again," said Shaun Rees, who oversaw the event for the Jaycees. "We really appreciate the sponsors, UCC, and everyone who came out to make this night happen. It was a great night for our community."

CRANFORD'S ANNUAL HALLOWEEN EVENTS RETURN FOR 21ST YEAR



Cranford's annual Brian Jenkins Memorial Halloween Parade, Costume Contest, and Pumpkin Chunkin' will return this year on October 31st, starting at 12:45 p.m. in the Cranford Community Center parking lot.

This is Cranford's 21st year holding the combined event, which is sponsored by the Cranford Recreation and Parks Department, in partnership with the Cranford Jaycees.

Costumes will be judged by age group (0-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9, 10-11, and 12-17), as well as Best Duo or Trio and Best Group (4 or More). Pre-registration is strongly encouraged and can be done at bit.ly/Costume2021.

Judging will begin at 12:45 p.m. in the parking lot of the Cranford Community Center, then people will begin queueing up for

the parade, which commences at 1:30 p.m. It will continue north on Walnut Avenue, across South and North Avenue, and up North Union Avenue, finishing downtown near Parking Lot #1 with the Pumpkin Chunkin', where pumpkins of increasing sizes are dropped from atop a Cranford Fire Department ladder truck.

The costume contest award winners will be announced immediately after the Chunkin'. There will also be an online contest for two categories: Best Adult and Best Pet. Details will be posted on CranfordJaycees.org.

The parade and Chunkin' are both held weather permitting. The event is named for Brian Jenkins, a Jaycee who helped make this event a beloved town tradition.

US SPACE FORCE: GUARDIANS OF THE HIGH FRONTIER

Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program (NJ-102)

As we explore new horizons, the United States expands beyond what is imaginable. With the creation of the US Space Force, the country truly embodies the notion of "reaching for the stars"! On June 29, 2021, Captain "Bud" Jackson Composite Squadron (NJ-102) of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP), an Auxiliary of the United States Air Force, had special guest speakers from the US Space Force - Major Jose Almanzar and Captain Ronald Nguyen. In a virtual meeting of over 110 participants, including visitors from other CAP squadrons, attended and the speakers shared the goal and purpose of this new branch of the military, talked about their jobs, gave advice to the cadets considering the path and much more. There was time for a Q&A session, where the speakers provided valuable information towards a wide range of cadet/senior member questions. Cadets took away extensive information to inspire them about this new exciting path of space research and operations.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the US Space Force is an independent branch of the military that was carved out of the Air Force in December 2019. With their Command motto as "Guardians of the High Frontier", the US Space Force is considered a critical asset, impacting everyday life. Although it is currently the smallest of the US armed services, the Space Force is responsible for operating and defending military satellites and ground stations and supports communication and navigation on Earth. It provides a much needed position of strength, especially technology-wise, for protecting US interests in space or going on offense, if needed, in the future. Civilian life cannot survive without our space capabilities. Our military based missions are now largely supported by space operations. Additionally, as space tourism is about to lift off in the coming years, the US will have a growing space community.

As an empowerment message to the young cadets, Maj Almanzar and Capt Nguyen talked about the Space Force's need for bold and diverse leaders with new ideas. They stressed the importance of being exposed to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) experiences and education early on - "Always take advantage of opportunities presented to you and explore the growing areas of the Space Force. The sky is not the limit so it is your time to soar!"

places, events, and people in Cranford's history, has recently been published by local historian Maureen Strazdon. The book is part of the Images of America series by Arcadia Publishing.

Using vintage photographs, Celebrating Cranford tells the town's story in six chapters, each covering 25 years, and each ending with how the town celebrated that important anniversary, ending with this year's 150th. The last two chapters include photos and descriptions of Cranford's neighborhoods and celebrate the women who were instrumental in Cranford's history and development.

"I enjoyed discovering new people and new stories about Cranford as I did the research," says Ms. Strazdon. "Places like Droescher's Mill and the Crane Phillips House are included in the book, but I tried to add some new sites, celebrations, and citizens that haven't been heard about before."

The book begins after the American Civil War as wealthy New Yorkers came to Cranford for the fresh air and charms of the Rahway River. It

Celebrating Cranford, a book highlighting follows Cranford after its incorporation in 1871, as the town grew with neighborhoods like Roosevelt Manor, Lincoln Park, and Sunny Acres that were established by Allan Eastman, Alden Bigelow, Miln Dayton, J. Walter Thompson, Severin Droescher, and the Sears Roebuck Company. Photos and descriptions of public buildings like the Opera House Block, the Casino, and grand private houses are included, as are photographs of celebrations on the Rahway River that gave birth to the nickname the Venice of New Jersey, and of ordinary and prominent Cranford citizens going about their daily lives.

Ms. Strazdon served as chair of Cranford's Historic Preservation Advisory Board for 12 years and has frequently given talks and tours on Cranford's history.

Celebrating Cranford is available at Periwinkles Fine Gifts on North Union Avenue, Cougar Headquarters on Centennial Avenue, and on Amazon. Ms. Strazdon will also have books available for purchase at several book signings around town.
