FANWOOD OFFICIALS ACCEPT STATEWIDE PLANNING AWARD

Borough of Fanwood

Fanwood Borough officials accepted a 2021 Achievement in Planning Award from New Jersey Planning Officials, the statewide association of Planning Boards and Zoning Boards of Adjustment, during an awards breakfast on October 1 at Pines Manor in Edison, NJ.

Fanwood won the award for its Station Square project, the 35-unit townhouse development by Landmark Companies located at 2nd Street and LaGrande Avenue. Station Square sits on the site of the former Dean Oil Company which left behind a polluted corner of land that sat fenced in and overgrown for a decade. Through the diligence of the developer Landmark and the support of Mayor Colleen Mahr, the Borough Council and Planning Board, the land was cleaned and finally certified by the NJ Dept. of Environmental Protection and Station Square was created. Today, these rental properties are highly desirable homes for couples, families and singles alike.

REGINA O'CONNOR TAKES OATH AS VOLUNTEER FOR LOCAL FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

The latest class of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster youth have taken their oath before a Union County Superior Court Judge and are now ready to be matched to their case as the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County. Regina O'Connor of Fanwood is among them.

The nonprofit, which began in Union County in 2005, recruits, trains, supports, and supervises volunteers to serve local child-victims removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect or abandonment, and living in foster care. It is the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for Union County judges hearing youth cases.

"I am thrilled to embark on my new position as a CASA! I look forward to helping improve the life of a child in my new role," said O'Connor.

Superior Court Judge James Hely presided over the swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; once matched to their youth or sibling set, advocates will begin putting their 30 hours of training into practice. O'Connor was joined by fellow classmates Janet Colman of Warren, Komal Nankani of Summit, Karime Herrera and James Walker Jr. of Elizabeth, Mike Caporaso of Lebanon, and Veronica Gardner of Union.

Volunteers need no special prior background or experience to serve as advocates; each

undergoes a thorough training process and is doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers in supported by CASA staff. Successful advocates bring with them varied life experiences and professional backgrounds. No matter the age of the youth to whom they are assigned, advocates' commitment to being a consistent presence – many foster youth experience a revolving door of professionals in addition to the separation from family members - and ensuring needs are identified and recommendations are made to the judge and stakeholders, the trajectory of a child's life can be changed for the better.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth, foster parents,

order to identify and report to the judge any concerns and needs in order to protect best interests.

The organization remains committed to serving every Union County youth in foster care; to do that, more community volunteers are needed to step up and train as an advocate for a local child-victim who could range from birth to age 21.

Borough of Fanwood





The New Jersey Veterans Network also has a program called Operation Rebound that consists of a mobile outreach team that helps to train veterans for events like races, hiking, and other athletic activities. The goal of Operation Rebound is to do athletic events from 5k races to long distance Iron Man competitions in order to empower the veterans and show the public how people can do amazing things with the proper support. It is truly incredible to see the veterans go from no physical activity to completing these tremendous athletic challenges.

Our charity has been able to work alongside other amazing charities that always put veterans first and are capable of rapidly providing them with essential resources. Recently, we formed a veteran anti-suicide and PTSD awareness coalition, called Uniformed Heroes, that will

need. Our peer support sponsors will be trained by the VA and Penn Med and our goal is to have volunteers statewide to help veterans in need.

To make this upcoming Uniformed Heroes campaign successful, we are in desperate need of volunteers from both the veteran and civilian communities. There are numerous events and daily tasks that our charity could use assistance with and we are always looking to have more volunteers willing to help us reach veterans in need.

Our goal is to provide all veterans in need with a peer support sponsor that will do whatever they can to help veterans with obtaining the resources needed to live a better life. 
