# **NEW PRINCIPAL SAYS SCHOOL IS HER HOME AND HER HEART**

Linden Public Schools

When Gwendolyn Long was a student at Soehl Middle School in Linden in the mid-1980s, she never imagined that one day she would be principal. But that's exactly where she sits today, and it seems to be a perfect fit for her

"I am Soehl Middle School," she said. "This is me. This is my heart. I embody it."

Long is taking over the top job for the 2021-22 school year after spending five years as vice principal. She had joined the district in 2000 and taught language arts and social studies for many years at McManus Middle School. But returning to her alma mater as VP and now principal feels like a homecoming.

"There's something about Soehl," she said. "I can remember when I was a student in '86, Soehl always had a special place in my heart. The teachers, the family environment – no disrespect to McManus, because I was a McManus girl when I taught there – but this is home for me. I love it."

Superintendent Dr. Marnie Hazelton said that Long is the natural person to maintain continuity of leadership at Soehl.

As principal, one of Long's top priorities will be restorative practices. These are strategies that help students learn how to navigate conflict resolution, take ownership of their behavior, practice empathy, and learn from their mistakes.

Long said her favorite part of the job, whether as a teacher or an administrator, is interacting with and getting to know the students.

"I love the kids," she said. "That was my biggest fear in going into administration, that it would take me away from the connection with our students. But it doesn't have to. I can still get through all the paperwork, all of what needs to get done, and still reach out or walk into the classrooms. Visit kids, get to know kids, and make that a part of our everyday process."

Long grew up in Linden always knowing that she wanted to be a teacher. She attended School Nos. 5 and 1, then Soehl, and graduated from Linden High School in 1992. After graduating from Kean University, she sought to return to her hometown school district. Because she still lives in the neighborhood – in her childhood home, in fact – Long gets to know many of the students outside of school before they even get to Soehl.

"I like when they look at me and say, 'Ms. Long, you're the principal?' And they're like, 'Oh, my God, I know her! She lives down the street from me!' I like that," she said. "A lot of the kids are within my ward, so I know a lot of them, their families, maybe even some of their grandparents. So it's home. I have a vested interest to make sure everyone is successful and making sure that this school is the best."

Long, who has master's degrees in administration and the art of teaching, also says she has big shoes to fill, following prior principals Isabella Scocozza and Richard Molinaro, who have moved into district administrator roles.

"Ms. Scocozza, another Linden person, did a great job with this school,

especially with her 21st Century after-school program and the success that it has had for our students and parents," she said. "And also Mr. Molinaro brought a lot of great things to this building, so I just want to keep the flow going and put my spin on things."

Long says she has gotten a lot of positive feedback about her promotion from students, staff and parents. She said that is critical to her success and the success of the school.

"This job I don't take lightly," she said. "I make sure people know that I didn't do this by myself. You have to have the support of your students, your staff, and your parents. They have to be able to trust you. For them to be able to trust me and know that I have their best interest, that means the world to me. It really does something to my spirit and it motivates me to want to make sure that I maintain their support by doing what I have to do for the best interest of everyone involved."

That kind of support from parents and the community at large helps to spread the word about the great things a school offers and helps to battle misconceptions.

# LINDEN HIGH SCHOOL TO ENHANCE RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

Linden Public Schools

Linden High School has been accepted into a three-year pilot program to expand restorative justice practices to help turn around student behavior and create a more positive culture for students and teachers.

Out of hundreds of applicants, LHS is one of just 15 schools statewide to be accepted into the program created by the New Jersey Department of Education and implemented by Kean University.

"We are very excited to participate in the Restorative Justice in Education pilot program," said LHS Principal Yelena Horré. "It is really in line with the goals that we have always set at Linden High School to create a more positive culture and to build a community that enriches and supports the kids. This program will help us to build a broad culture where we're all pulling in the same direction."

The restorative justice initiative is designed to assist schools in achieving the following goals:

Reducing racial disparities in school discipline. Improving the socioemotional and behavioral responses of students through the use of more appropriate, and less punitive, interventions.

Reducing recidivism rates among students who violate the school district code of conduct.

Superintendent of Schools Dr. Marnie Hazelton said the program is a great opportunity for LHS.

"It is so important to continue to examine our disciplinary practices, and restorative justice a big part of that," she said. "This program will assist our Linden High School educators in keeping students on the right path and ensuring that justice is handed out in an equitable and fair manner for all students."

Horré and school social worker Ryan Devaney will work with facilitators at Kean in Year 1 of the program to train LHS staff members. Year 2 will be for implementation of the program, and Year 3 will see further implementation, data analysis, and adaption.

"For students who are making mistakes or going down the wrong path, we want to bring them back onboard," Horré said. "We want them to understand that they are not defined by the mistakes that they make. We want to allow everyone to reinvent themselves and give students and their teachers the tools to do that."

### FIFTH-GRADER'S KINDNESS HELPS STRUGGLING NEWCOMERS

#### Linden Public Schools

Imagine showing up for your first day of school, and not only do you not know anyone, but you can't understand a word that anyone is saying.

That was what two young brothers, ages 5 and 6, faced recently when they arrived at School No. 1 in Linden. The boys came to live with relatives in the Unites States after they were displaced from their home by the Aug. 14 earthquake that devastated Haiti. Besides each other, the two boys had no one in school to turn to, or even talk to

That is until fifth-grader Renal Ali stepped in. "They did not speak one word of English," said Acting Principal Michael Walters. "So I knew right away that we needed some help here. I wasn't aware of any Haitian Creole speaking teachers or staff, so I went to a fifth-grade class and asked, 'Does anyone speak Haitian Creole?' and Renal immediately said yes."

Walters explained that he and some other staff members tried to connect with the boys by being

jovial and excited, but they did not respond. Renal, however, got down on their level and spoke softly to them.

"He very calmly said something in Haitian Creole, and right away both of their heads snapped up and they made eye contact," Walters said. "It was a connection right away. And those kids were glued to him."

Renal was born in the United States and knows English and Haitian Creole well, so he has never been through a similar situation, but he said he could understand how the two boys felt.

"There's a lot of people out there that don't know how to speak English or don't know anything about the country, and I just wanted to help them," he said. "I think they felt like they had someone who can understand what they're going through."

Walters said the two brothers have since been

transferred to School No. 9, where they are getting guidance from the district's English as a Second Language program for students who speak Haitian Creole. But their first couple of days at School No. 1 were made much more bearable because of a friendly voice from Renal, who checked in on the brothers throughout the day, at recess, and after school to let them know they weren't alone.

"He just completely saved the first day for those kids," Walters said. "What could have been a horrible experience turned out to be something very positive."

Renal, who is in Sabina Robinson's fifth-grade class, said he got praise from teachers and his friends after he helped the two boys.

"It made me feel like a star," he said. "My mom was proud of me. She was happy, and she said, 'Keep it up."

### SALUTE TO VETERANS FILM FESTIVAL

After a year off because of the pandemic, the Linden Public Library is proud to once again present its annual "Salute to Veterans Film Festival". Four very different films about the Second World War will be presented during November. Each one is based on real events during and after the war.

On Monday, November 8 at 1:00 p.m., the library will show the 2018 film The Catcher Was

a Spy. This film stars Paul Rudd as former big league catcher, Moe Berg, who was known as "the brainiest man in baseball" and was described by Casey Stengel as "the strangest man ever to play baseball". While only an average player during his baseball career, Berg served as an undercover member of the Office of Special Services in leading espionage missions during the war. This film was based on a book of the same title.

On Friday, November 12 at 1:00 p.m., the 2002 film Windtalkers will be shown. Two U.S. Marines are assigned to protect Navajo Indian members of the Marine Corps, who use their native language as an unbreakable radio cypher against the Japanese. This film stars Nichols Cage, Mark Ruffalo and Christian Slater.

On Tuesday, November 16 at 1:00 p.m. we offer an inside look at the biggest secret and most fantastic weapon of World War II as we present the 1989 film, Fat Man and Little Boy. The Manhattan Project is brought to the big screen as

a Spy. This film stars Paul Rudd as former big league catcher, Moe Berg, who was known as "the brainiest man in baseball" and was described by Casey Stengel as "the strangest man ever to play baseball". While only an average player the first atomic bombs are built and tested in the New Mexico desert. Paul Newman stars as Army General Leslie Groves while Dwight Schultz plays the project's top scientist, Robert Oppenheimer.

The final film in the series will be shown on Friday, November 19 at 1:00 p.m. American Traitor: The Trial of Axis Sally details the trial for treason of an American-born citizen, Mildred Gillars, who lived in Germany throughout the war. She spoke both English and German and worked for the Nazi Propaganda Ministry as a radio announcer, reaching out to American G.I.s in Britain and the Mediterranean. The film stars Meadow Williams and Al Pacino.







"Support from our families and community are essential for our schools to be able to give our students the outstanding education and support they deserve. The teamwork they have demonstrated at School No. 10 lays the foundation to allow our students to soar."

Walker credited the teachers and support staff for their outstanding work.

"A great big thank you to all of you for your efforts to include our families in the educational process, and for the overall support you always provide to our families and in our work with the PTA," Walker wrote in an email to staff announcing the honor. "It truly makes a difference in the lives of our students."

The school worked to be more inclusive of different cultures by adding cheerful signs around the building in multiple languages and using ClassDojo to communicate with families, allowing messages to be translated into 35 different languages.

"Our community and our school are evolving and changing, and it is important that we do so as well, so that we can meet and exceed the needs of our families," Walker said.

of their culture.

School No. 10 also forged a partnership with Atria Senior Living Community, located in Cranford just around the corner from the school. The school hosted residents for a celebration of military veterans in 2019, and fifth-grade students visited the senior community to sing and perform for Valentine's Day in 2020.

Walker said that although the COVID-19 pandemic has been very difficult on staff, students, and families, it also gave the school an opportunity to put its increased family and community outreach into action to make sure everyone stayed informed and included.

"This has been a very illuminating and transformative process to undertake, we also

know that our work continues, and that we can still improve," Walker said.

Two School No. 10 staff members paraprofessional Sherre Carbone and fifth-grade teacher Mary Lee – are on the PTA executive board for the upcoming school year, and Walker said together they will focus on continuing to improve family engagement supporting student success, specifically in the areas of literacy, math, and science.

"We have grown tremendously as a school as a result of our work in the National PTA School of Excellence process," he said, "and we are looking forward to not only being recognized for the work we have done, but also committing to further improvement."

There was time for a Q&A session, where the speakers provided valuable information towards a wide range of cadet/senior member questions. Cadets took away extensive information to inspire them about this new exciting path of space research and operations.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the US Space Force is an independent branch of the military that was carved out of the Air Force in December 2019. With their Command motto as "Guardians of the High Frontier", the US Space Force is considered a critical asset, impacting everyday life. 

The goal of Operation Rebound is to do athletic events from 5k races to long distance Iron Man competitions in order to empower the veterans and show the public how people can do amazing things with the proper support. It is truly incredible to see the veterans go from no physical activity to completing these tremendous athletic challenges.

Our charity has been able to work alongside other amazing charities that always put veterans first and are capable of rapidly providing them with essential resources. Recently, we formed a veteran anti-suicide and PTSD awareness coalition, called Uniformed Heroes, that will provide peer support sponsors for any veteran in need. Our peer support sponsors will be trained by the VA and Penn Med and our goal is to have volunteers statewide to help veterans in need.

To make this upcoming Uniformed Heroes campaign successful, we are in desperate need of volunteers from both the veteran and civilian communities. 

# RETIRING ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRINCIPAL LEAVES LEGACY OF LOVE

Linden Public Schools

School No. 1 Principal Dona Preston is retiring after 33 years in Linden Public Schools, leaving behind a legacy of love for her neediest students and leadership for the many teachers who have served with and learned from her.

"I was really lucky in my career," she said. "I've worked with seven different superintendents, phenomenal supervisors, wonderful teachers, and truthfully I've been blessed by all the people who have helped me in my career."

But it was always the students who came first for Preston, who started in 1988 as a special education teacher at School No. 5. She had previously worked with autistic students in Jersey City and emotionally disturbed children in New York City. She used kindness to try to reach the most troubled students.

"For me, it was making a dent with the special ed population," Preston said. "Kids that were really down and out. Kids that lived with grandparents, foster kids. If the kid falls asleep on the desk, it's not, 'Oh, the kid's bored, the kid's this or that.' The kid is falling asleep for a reason and we have to figure out what the reason is.

"So I think empathy and kindness and just helping them was my shining star. Especially when they come back to visit. That's just the best."

The story of one young girl stands out from Preston's days at School No. 5. She was a 6-year-old emotionally disturbed girl who was between foster families and out of control. Preston ended up adopting her.

"I got her out of her situation, to teach her what love is. To teach her what a family is like," she said.

But it wasn't always an easy situation.

"She had more problems than I can tell you," Preston said. "So she was in and out of my house and in the system. But now she has a family of her own. She came to visit me the other day.

"She always came back. So even though she might not have been in my house every year, she was always with me."

It wasn't always certain that Preston was going to be a teacher. After her stints in Jersey City and New York, she owned a florist in Elizabeth and The Sub Shoppe sandwich shop on Wood Avenue in Linden in the 1980s.

But after those, she said, "If I'm going back to work, I'm going back to what I love. And so I saw an ad in the paper for Linden, and I applied."

Preston was a special education teacher at School No. 5 for 13 years, then served as supervisor for special services for five years. After a year as principal at School No. 10, she became principal at School No. 1 in 2006, and has been there since.

"Ms. Preston is leaving an incredible legacy behind in Linden Public Schools," said Superintendent Dr. Marnie Hazelton. "She has touched countless lives of students and staff members alike and we wish her the best in a well-deserved retirement."

Preston gives great credit for her success to her mentor, Alexis Jarose, who was her principal at School No. 5 and went on to be assistant superintendent.

"She taught me how you love kids, how discipline doesn't work, everything I think that I am today is truly because of Alexis Jarose," Preston said. "And so many of the administrators have worked under her, and we always talk about how many people she has touched. She was a great mentor."

Preston has tried to emulate her mentor by helping young teachers learn and grow.

"That's been another highlight of my career, seeing people go from young and inexperienced, and gaining and gaining," she said. "That's really nice to see."

One of those who credits Preston with helping her become a better educator is School No. 5 Principal Dr. Laura Scamardella.

"Dona encourages her staff to strive for personal and professional excellence," Scamardella said. "She can see the potential that lies within each staff member and cultivates the confidence needed in a safe and loving way, so success is met. Dona will be missed every day and remains a consummate professional in our district."

Her colleagues' love for her was on display in her last few weeks on the job, when the staff at School No. 1 held a surprise retirement barbecue in her honor and a "clap-out" of applause as she left the building. Preston was taken completely by surprise.

"I pride myself in knowing everything," she said with a laugh. "I know the ins and outs, I know the gossip. But I knew nothing. It's just amazing that somebody thinks they know everything. But they got me."

She was also surprised by a visit from the district's other elementary school principals for a visit at the end of the school year to say goodbye.

"When the principals came marching in, it was like, oh, my God," Preston said. "We have formed such a great bond. We help each other, we do things together. The collaboration has always been there. That's been a very strong bond."

When contemplating what she will miss the most as she retires, it of course came back to her students and her staff.

"There are so many things," Preston said. "I'm going to miss the kids, because they are fun. Some of the things they say are just hysterical. I always say I'm going to put them in a book.

"And the teachers, because they're such good people. I've been lucky. I've always worked in great atmospheres with great people. So that will be hard."

In retirement, she expects to do more work with rescue animals, a cause that has always been close to her heart. And she is considering volunteering as a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) who advocates in schools and homes for children in need.

Stating the obvious, she said, "That's right up my alley."


