# **NEW PLAY REUNITES TEACHER AND STUDENT**

When Deirdre Louise MacNamara was a high school student, she performed in several plays at Roselle Catholic High School, directed by Maurice J. Moran. Now, MacNamara has written a play that will be performed in New York City, directed by Moran. "Order Up!" consists of five one-act plays that take place in a "typical NYC diner." It will run in November for a limited engagement in Manhattan.

Moran, a resident of Rahway, has been directing plays for New Jersey high schools, community theatres, and professional summer stock for 50 years. MacNamara, who grew up in Elizabeth, has acted in New York and New Jersey. Together, they had worked on several projects prior to the pandemic, including her one-woman show that she performed in Brooklyn and Greenwich Village.

"Order up!" is her first full-length play. Each act is titled with "diner speak," reflecting the intriguing descriptions servers use to communicate with the cook. "Blonde with Sand," for example, one of the plays, is "Coffee with milk and sugar." The other plays include "In the Weeds," "Blue Plate Special," "Adam and Eve on a Raft," and "Pittsburgh." Each play features characters who use the diner as a meeting place to discover the different meanings of love, from friendship and family to romance.





In a virtual meeting of over 110 participants, including visitors from other CAP squadrons, attended and the speakers shared the goal and purpose of this new branch of the military, talked about their jobs, gave advice to the cadets considering the path and much more. There was time for a Q&A session, where the speakers provided valuable information towards a wide range of cadet/senior member questions. Cadets took away extensive information to inspire them about this new exciting path of space research and operations.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the US Space Force is an independent branch of the military that was carved out of the Air Force in December 2019. With their Command motto as "Guardians of the High Frontier", the US Space Force is considered a critical asset, impacting everyday

life. Although it is currently the smallest of the US armed services, the Space Force is responsible for operating and defending military satellites and ground stations and supports communication and navigation on Earth. It provides a much needed position of strength, especially technology-wise, for protecting US interests in space or going on offense, if needed, in the future. Civilian life cannot survive without our space capabilities. Our military based missions are now largely supported by space operations. Additionally, as space tourism is about to lift off in the coming years, the US will have a growing space community.

As an empowerment message to the young cadets, Maj Almanzar and Capt Nguyen talked about the Space Force's need for bold and diverse leaders with new ideas. They stressed the

For the last few years the New Jersey Veterans Network and its mobile outreach team has been aggressively seeking out veterans in need and providing them resources to have a better way of life. This is only possible because of our volunteers' commitment and dedication with helping our veteran community. Donations are wonderful and help us purchase food, clothing, medical equipment and other life changing items, however someone's time is what makes an enormous difference.

During our charity's existence, we have provided meals for thousands of veterans and servicemen, dropped off PPE and clothing to veterans, provided medical equipment for disabled veterans, had 30 cars donated to disabled veterans, and most importantly we successfully saved the lives of veterans who were in some type of a dangerous crisis.

Every day we lose approximately 22 veterans to suicide and unfortunately this number hasn't changed over the years. Depression, PTSD and trauma run extremely high among our veterans and their family members. There are countless lifesaving programs out there for veterans, however it's a difficult task to get veterans to trust others and go get the help they need to live a better life.

The New Jersey Veterans Network also has a program called Operation Rebound that consists of a mobile outreach team that helps to train veterans for events like races, hiking, and other athletic activities. The goal of Operation Rebound is to do athletic events from 5k races to long distance Iron Man competitions in order to empower the veterans and show the public how people can do amazing things with the proper support. It is truly incredible to see the veterans go from no physical activity to completing these tremendous athletic challenges.

Our charity has been able to work alongside other amazing charities that always put veterans first and are capable of rapidly providing them with essential resources. Recently, we formed a veteran anti-suicide and PTSD awareness coalition, called Uniformed Heroes, that will provide peer support sponsors for any veteran in need. Our peer support sponsors will be trained by the VA and Penn Med and our goal is to have volunteers statewide to help veterans in need.

To make this upcoming Uniformed Heroes campaign successful, we are in desperate need of volunteers from both the veteran and civilian communities. There are numerous events and daily tasks that our charity could use assistance with and we are always looking to have more volunteers willing to help us reach veterans in need.







"In order to continue to grow our English and Spanish speaking programs, we need to constantly recruit and train new volunteer facilitators," said Veronica Ortiz, Imagine Program Manager. "Our programs are growing

## **SWEET POTATOES**

#### SWEET POTATOES (IPOMOEA BATATAS)

Sweet Potatoes belong to a large family of tropical vines, many with thick fleshy roots which includes Morning Glories. Today 'sweet potato vines' are a popular ornamental plant used by gardeners in pots to add trailing interest in an arrangement, often referred to as a 'spiller'. These are not good sweet potatoes for eating because they are too hard to chew and lack flavor.

#### **HISTORY OF SWEET POTATOES**

Our popular edible orange or purple Sweet Potatoes have been cultivated in Central and South America for over five thousand years. There are also white and yellow varieties. Researchers believe its origin was in the Andes Mountains where it was grown by the ancient Peruvian people in what became the Inca Empire. The great Inca Empire survived for centuries before the arrival of Columbus and his compatriots.

The Spanish Europeans believing anyone who was not a Catholic was fair game plundered the New World. The Conquistadors stole shiploads of gold and silver and shipped it home to Spain.

On Columbus' forth return journey to Spain he also bought back to Spain many of the vegetables we eat today. Potatoes, tomatoes and chili peppers to name a few. In the centuries to follow these New World foods were going to change and enrich the cuisines of the Old World, Europe and Asia.

There is at least one vegetable on our Thanksgiving Day tables that traveled without the help of Europeans, the sweet potato.

Researchers have discovered evidence that the sweet potato made the trip first from the mountains of Peru to the west coast of South America and from there began its incredible journey. The sweet potato traveled five thousand miles to the islands of Polynesia four hundred years before King Ferdinand and Isabella's ships landed in the Americas.

Capt. James Cook's crew picked up some of the root vegetables in Polynesia in 1769. Examining the genetic blueprint of Cook's sweet potatoes allowed scientist to trace the Polynesian Sweet Potato's evolution all the way back to Ecuador and Peru. Additional research suggests the sweet potato was a staple in Polynesian diets since 1,000 AD.

It is now well known that the Polynesians were





a mighty seafaring culture traveling hundreds or even thousands of miles for trade. Many scientists credit the Polynesian travelers for spreading the sweet potato on their trading expeditions.

Some researchers believe the sweet potato may have traveled without any human assistance, but was spread by birds carrying it in their wings or internally passing seeds though their bodies.

Today we add to the confusion by lumping sweet potatoes and yams together, often confusing the two. Actually, the two are not even related. Sweet Potatoes are from the morning glory family and Yams are related to lilies and grasses.

White potatoes are only distantly related to sweet potatoes. Although they both came from same region, white potatoes belong to the nightshade family (Solanaceace), which also includes many other important crops like peppers, tomatoes, tomatillos, eggplant, tobacco and others.

#### **SWEET POTATOES ARE A SUPER FOOD**

Today the edible sweet potatoes, especially the orange or purple type are highly nutritious and considered a super food. They are a great source of fiber, vitamins, and minerals. In order to get the highest benefit, it is important to eat the skin also.

Sweet Potatoes are rich in antioxidants that protect your body from free radicals. (Free radicals are unstable molecules that can damage DNA and trigger inflammation.) Eating them can help fight off chronic illnesses like cancer, heart disease, and aging.

As if these advantages aren't enough, the fiber

and antioxidants in purple sweet potatoes are advantageous to stomach health. Sweet potatoes contain two types of fiber, soluble and insoluble.

Test-tube studies have found that antioxidants in purple sweet potatoes promote the growth of healthy stomach bacteria. Yellow sweet potatoes lack many of the benefits we are discussing in this article.

When the Portuguese introduced the sweet potatoes to Africa, they brought the white and yellow varieties. Today many humanitarian groups are introducing the orange sweet potatoes successfully increasing vitamin A intake in their daily diets. This has proven to cut mortally rates in Africa by 25 percent.

Sweet Potatoes are known to be beneficial to individuals with type 2 diabetes due to the high levels of magnesium and fiber, which can aid in reducing insulin resistance and stabilizing blood sugar. Talk to your doctor before adding them to your daily diet.

Paul gave advice on how to spread the program throughout the US, mirroring the way Rotary clubs were spreading. Both organizations have a lot of similarities, including an ethical code, teaching leadership skills, being

community based and service oriented. Rotary clubs currently charter 1,000 scout units across the US.

The Patriot's Path Council, BSA consists of 5 counties in northern New Jersey with more than 10,000 scouts and 4,000 adult volunteers. They are in the counties of Sussex, Morris, Somerset, Union and northern Middlesex. The headquarters in Cedar Knolls has only 25 full-time staff. There are two scout shops one in Cedar Knolls, and one in Mountainside.

The Council offers three Day Camps: at Watchung Reservation; Johnson Park, New Brunswick; and Camp Wheeler at Mt. Allamuchy Scout Reservation. The Council offers four overnight camping opportunities: Winnebago Scout Reservation in Rockaway, NJ; Mt. Allamuchy in Byram Township; Sabattis Adventure Camp in Long Lake NY, and the four national high adventure bases: The Summit in West Virginia; Northern Tier in Minnesota, Sea Base in the Florida Keys, and Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico.

Recent changes to the Scouts include welcoming girls to the Cub Scout and the legacy Boy Scout programs three years ago. The purpose was to include entire families in the activities. To accommodate this change, the "Boy Scout" program for ages 5th grade through age 18 was renamed the "Scouts BSA". The name of the parent organization remains the Boy Scouts of America. The Cub Scout program is for children from K through 5th grade; Scouts BSA is for children 5th grade through age 18. Other

programs have been coed for many decades, including Explorers - who explore career opportunities, Venture Crews - who go on high adventure trips, Sea Scouts who learn mariner skills, and a relatively new program - STEM- in which students explore science related careers. These last four programs welcome boys and girls from ages 14 to 21.

Cub Scout Dens may be all boy and all girl, or coed. Scouts BSA Troops are either all girl or all boy. This year there are 250,000 young women in the scouts, and 1,000 girls were the first graduating class of female Eagle Scouts. Only 4% of all scouts ever achieve the rank of Eagle, making it a mark of distinction.

The residents of Westfield are enthusiastic supporters of Scouting. There are 12 units: 7 Cub Scout Packs and 5 Scout Troops, with nearly 500 youth, which is double the national average. Last year the Patriots' Path Council recognized 315 Eagle Scouts and Scouts collectively earned more than 6,200 merit badges. The Rotary Club of Westfield has been a long time supporter of the Scouts. Several members are Eagle Scouts, and many of the children of Rotarians are in the Scouting program, and a number have earned the rank of Eagle. The club likes to support Eagle Service projects financially.

Scout Executive Marc Andreo asked the Rotarians to help spread the word about local Scouting. With units and camps open again, they are seeking more youth to join the local programs. Please visit beascout.org to locate a unit near you!

# **DEPRESSION ERA BANK HEIST REMAINS UNSOLVED**

Throughout the 1930s, notorious bandits such as John Dillinger, "Machine Gun" Kelly, and "Pretty Boy" Floyd were at the height of their infamy. News agencies would follow their criminal exploits and broadcast detailed stories containing the lurid accounts of their devilry. Although those particular fore-mentioned criminals operated in mid America, bank jobs were not restricted to the rural regions of the country. High stakes robberies were also being committed in towns and cities east of the Mississippi. Even in places like Rahway, New Jersey.

One such crime actually did take place in 1931 when four armed robbers entered the Citizens National Bank and absconded with over \$70,000 (nearly 1.25 million in 2021 dollars). The four crooks, plus their getaway driver, may never have reached the notoriety of a Bonnie and Clyde or a "Baby Face" Nelson, but they did out-do them in one very important respect - they never got caught.

At exactly 8:10 a.m. on Friday, November 13, an armored car arrived in front of the Citizens The fourth, flourishing his revolver, went behind National Bank at the corner of Irving and Lewis Streets. J. H. Farrell, manager of the Gibbs and Hill Construction Company, got out of the vehicle carrying two heavy sacks. He was accompanied by two Rahway policemen. The Gibbs and Hill contractors had been working on electrifying the Pennsylvania Railroad for several months and each Friday Farrell came to the bank to deposit the payroll. Once he was safely inside, the police escorts were relieved of their duty.

According to eye witnesses, at 8:20, just ten minutes after the payroll was carried in, four neatly dressed men strolled into the building. Six bank employees and five patrons were in the lobby engaged in customary banking business. Without any apparent verbal signal, the four and the men hurried out the front door. Once intruders drew their weapons and one of the robbers calmly announced, "If you utter a word or try to get away, you'll get your head blown off." A second robber lined everyone against a raced toward State Highway 25 (now U.S. 1&9).

wall while another kept an eye on the cashiers. the teller cages to the area where the head teller, two women clerks, and Farrell were counting out the Gibbs and Hill payroll. Holding his gun on the surprised counters, the robber hastily scooped the piles of cash into waste baskets. As the money was being gathered, the employees and customers who were held in the lobby were quickly herded into a back room near the vault. Strangely, the robbers showed no interest in gaining access to the vault nor did they search individuals for cash or valuables. When the entire payroll was cleared off the counting table, the gunman told Farrell and the three bank employees to lie on the floor and to keep down for five minutes. He shouted to his accomplices, outside, they jumped into a large, black sedan driven by a fifth man, sped south down Irving Street, skidded left onto Milton Avenue, and



The entire heist took less than five minutes.

The bank had no alarm system. By the time one of the cashiers telephoned police headquarters, the robbers were away from the scene and long gone. After the police arrived at the bank and assessed the situation, they flashed an alarm across the state over their new teletype system. The ensuing search for the perpetrators would weave an unusual story of escape - one filled with miscalculation and luck.

The next day, an abandoned black sedan was found far off a back road outside of town near Lambert's Dock on the Rahway River. The vehicle was discovered by two men who were hunting rabbits in the wooded fields of the Bayway oil refinery property. The men also found a bag containing three loaded pistols, packages of cartridges, and a man's overcoat. A 32-foot speedboat, its propeller buried in the soft mud, was found on the Linden side of the river. It was later learned that the boat had been reported stolen. The police also received a tip that two suspicious looking men, who appeared to be carrying money bags, had been seen getting out of a car in Newark. It was noted that after they alighted, a young man slid onto the driver's seat and drove off. A teen was later arrested at his home in Elizabeth when it was established that his license plate matched the car seen in Newark. The 17-year-old spent a night in jail, but was released when the account of his innocent involvement in the case was corroborated.

In the days and weeks that followed, the police pierced together the scenario of how the robbers had made their escape. They believed that the robbers must have spent several weeks casing the bank and that the Gibbs and Hall payroll was their sole target. The robbers knew the exact time the payroll was always delivered, the routine of the police escort, and even the layout of the bank. Their plan was to get away in the motorboat while police roadblocks were positioned on the highway. However, when the robbers discovered the motor boat had sunk during the low tide and could not be started, they set out on foot in the direction of the highway. Unfamiliar with the terrain, they soon found themselves sloshing through the muddy water of the marshland. But then luck struck for the assailants. They spied a vehicle parked on a dirt road next to the fields where a young driver was waiting for his father and uncle to return from hunting rabbits. The men, wet to the waist, got in the car, and with one of the men taking the wheel, drove to Newark. It is likely some of the gang left the car and split up during the trip. Upon reaching the big city, the remaining robbers gave the youth \$100.00 of the stolen money and told him to take his time going back.

Numerous clues would turn up, Rogues Gallery photos were examined by those who were present in the bank, and some men were taken into custody; in the end however, no one was charged. The culprits of the greatest robbery in the annals of Rahway history were never brought to justice.



Sebastián is accepted to SUNY Maritime College and will enter the Regiment of Cadets in August. His goal is to obtain a United States




