
When faced with a medical emergency, it's often difficult to stay calm and think clearly. One important question always asked by first responders is, "What medications are being taken?" Would you be able to answer this quickly and accurately?

If you're taking only one, then it may be easy to remember. However, if you, or someone else in your household, is taking multiple medications, it's often hard to remember not only the names, but the dosage amounts as well. It's

important, therefore, to have an up-to-date and accurate list ready to hand over to EMTs or paramedics. This can be useful while in the ambulance itself, and upon arrival at the hospital, this information can also be given to the nurse or doctor treating you, which may help to clarify what's causing the medical episode.

For example, if a patient has cut himself and is bleeding profusely, the amount of blood may not be due to the size of the laceration, but rather because the patient is on blood thinners. Or, if a patient is having chest pains and is on high blood pressure and cholesterol medications, chances are more likely that he or she is having an actual heart attack and is not suffering from simple indigestion from an unhealthy meal. Or, if someone is confused and not responding appropriately, it may be because he is diabetic and has forgotten to take his medicine, or possibly hasn't eaten in a while.

It will only take a short time to write out a handwritten list, or even better, to type one up on a computer. This way it can be easily updated, and will also be easy to read. Since some medications have similar names, it's important that the names and dosage amounts be clearly legible.

HELP US SAVE A VET - VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

For the last few years the New Jersey Veterans Network and its mobile outreach team has been aggressively seeking out veterans in need and providing them resources to have a better way of life. This is only possible because of our volunteers' commitment and dedication with helping our veteran community. Donations are wonderful and help us purchase food, clothing, medical equipment and other life changing items, however someone's time is what makes an enormous difference.

During our charity's existence, we have provided meals for thousands of veterans and servicemen, dropped off PPE and clothing to veterans, provided medical equipment for disabled veterans, had 30 cars donated to disabled veterans, and most importantly we successfully saved the lives of veterans who were in some type of a dangerous crisis.

Every day we lose approximately 22 veterans to suicide and unfortunately this number hasn't changed over the years. Depression, PTSD and trauma run extremely high among our veterans and their family members. There are countless lifesaving programs out there for veterans, however it's a difficult task to get veterans to trust others and go get the help they need to live a better life.

The New Jersey Veterans Network also has a program called Operation Rebound that consists of a mobile outreach team that helps to train veterans for events like races, hiking, and other athletic activities. The goal of Operation Rebound is to do athletic events from 5k races to long distance Iron Man competitions in order to empower the veterans and show the public how

people can do amazing things with the proper support. It is truly incredible to see the veterans go from no physical activity to completing these tremendous athletic challenges.

Our charity has been able to work alongside other amazing charities that always put veterans first and are capable of rapidly providing them with essential resources. Recently, we formed a veteran anti-suicide and PTSD awareness coalition, called Uniformed Heroes, that will provide peer support sponsors for any veteran in need. Our peer support sponsors will be trained by the VA and Penn Med and our goal is to have volunteers statewide to help veterans in need.

To make this upcoming Uniformed Heroes campaign successful, we are in desperate need of volunteers from both the veteran and civilian communities. There are numerous events and daily tasks that our charity could use assistance with and we are always looking to have more volunteers willing to help us reach veterans in need.

Our goal is to provide all veterans in need with a peer support sponsor that will do whatever they can to help veterans with obtaining the resources needed to live a better life. This is not an easy thing to do, but the New Jersey Veterans Network has already been able to make a huge difference because of the team's volunteers and its strong partnerships with other charities.

REGINA O'CONNOR TAKES OATH AS VOLUNTEER FOR LOCAL FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

The latest class of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster vouth have taken their oath before a Union County Superior Court Judge and are now ready to be matched to their case as the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County. Regina O'Connor of Fanwood is among them.

The nonprofit, which began in Union County in 2005, recruits, trains, supports, and supervises volunteers to serve local child-victims removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect or abandonment, and living in foster care. It is the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for Union County judges hearing youth cases.

"I am thrilled to embark on my new position as a CASA! I look forward to helping improve the life of a child in my new role," said O'Connor.

Superior Court Judge James Hely presided over the swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; once matched to their youth or sibling set, advocates will begin putting their 30 hours of training into practice. O'Connor was joined by fellow classmates Janet Colman of Warren, Komal Nankani of Summit. Karime Herrera and James Walker Jr. of Elizabeth, Mike Caporaso of Lebanon, and Veronica Gardner of Union.

Volunteers need no special prior background or experience to serve as advocates; each undergoes a thorough training process and is supported by CASA staff. Successful advocates

bring with them varied life experiences and order to identify and report to the judge any professional backgrounds. No matter the age of the youth to whom they are assigned, advocates' commitment to being a consistent presence many foster youth experience a revolving door of professionals in addition to the separation from family members - and ensuring needs are identified and recommendations are made to the judge and stakeholders, the trajectory of a child's life can be changed for the better.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth, foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers in

concerns and needs in order to protect best interests.


The organization remains committed to serving every Union County youth in foster care; to do that, more community volunteers are needed to step up and train as an advocate for a local child-victim who could range from birth to age 21.
