A newly-formed New Jersey non-profit organization, the Westfield Arts Collective, announced today that it has signed an agreement to purchase the Rialto building in downtown Westfield.

The announcement comes ahead of the closing weekend of Complements, an art exhibit being presented in the newly renovated lobby of the Rialto. The exhibit features original Charles Addams art alongside art from multimedia artist Suzanne Heilmann.

"We are excited that so many people have stopped by the Rialto to see the exhibit, with many expressing interest in the building's future," said Beth Cassie, President of the Westfield Arts Collective. "We are proud to announce the Center for Creativity at the Rialto, a community gathering space for creating, experiencing, and enjoying art in many forms. Our vision is to build a creative hub in downtown Westfield where makers, artists, actors, writers, and musicians of all ages and experience can connect, create, learn, and build community. Westfield is a town of artists, and preserving the iconic Rialto is the best way to ensure that the arts have a permanent place to thrive in our community."

The Tee and Charles Addams Foundation has generously provided initial seed capital for this effort and has committed to underwriting future art endeavors, with the intention of eventually endowing the Center with Addams works and funding in perpetuity.

"It has brought the Foundation such joy to witness how this community has embraced AddamsFest, annually celebrating the life and work of Charles Addams including not only the iconic and timeless Addams Family, but also his classic work as an artist, New Yorker cartoonist, and as a fixture in the prominent New York social circles of the 1960's," said Kevin Miserocchi, Executive Director of the Tee and Charles Addams Foundation. "We're thrilled that Charlie will return to the hometown that inspired his work and that his legacy will live on through the many artists that will benefit from the Center for Creativity at the Rialto."

"We are also thankful to the current owners of the building, Jesse and Doreen Sayegh, who have been true partners in the negotiation of this purchase," added Cassie. "None of this would have been possible without their generosity and shared vision to retain this historic building and keep the arts alive in Westfield."

The initial phase of the project includes renovating the lobby and restoring one large theater. The lobby will host small gatherings, including author and poetry readings. Once restored, the main floor theater will be made available for film screenings, live performances, and other programs and presentations.

Subsequent phases will include planning for the additional five theaters and office space and will involve gathering public input.

"There is still much work to be done, but we're thrilled to have started with the lobby, which will remain available as a rotating gallery," said Westfield Arts Collective board member Margaret Smith. "We'll begin rolling out our vision for a re-imagined Rialto over the next few months,



and we are excited to invite the Westfield community to learn more and get involved."

John Rzeznik, Westfield resident and guitarist and frontman of the Goo Goo Dolls, announced his support for the project.

"As a Westfield local, it is an honor to be working with my fellow residents to bring a permanent home for the arts to Westfield," said Rzeznik. "I have offered my name and platform to raise money for this very cool project and hope others will do the same."

"I congratulate the Westfield Arts Collective on this historic accomplishment and thank the Tee and Charles Addams Foundation and current Rialto owner Jesse Sayegh for being strong community partners in this bold and imaginative effort," said Westfield Mayor Shelley Brindle. "This effort brings us a giant step closer to our goal of making Westfield a regional destination for arts and culture."

"The vision for AddamsFest, which included annual exhibits of Charles Addams work, was to honor a local celebrity and infuse the arts into Westfield's culture," said Westfield Councilwoman Dawn Mackey, Chairperson of AddamsFest. "I'm so happy that AddamsFest could be the catalyst for the relationship with the Tee and Charles Addams Foundation which ultimately led to this project."

IMAGINE IS SEEKING VOLUNTEER FACILITATORS

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss offers free peer grief support groups for grieving families that are facilitated by a wonderful group of trained volunteers. Imagine's volunteers are an essential part of Imagine's programs and they're looking to grow their community of facilitators. Are you interested in joining Imagine's team of volunteers? If so, we'd like to tell you more about Imagine's programs.

Imagine offers free peer support groups for children ages 3-18 who have experienced the death of a parent, sibling or close family member. Groups are also available for young adults ages 18-30, and for the parents and guardians of the children in the program. Groups for Spanish speaking bereaved adults are also available. All groups are currently being held virtually, with some set to transition to in-person as soon as it is safe to do so. Other groups will remain virtual.

Support groups are facilitated by trained adult volunteers who attend a three-day training totaling 24 hours, as well as regular continuing education. Volunteers come from all walks of life and no special background is required other than a willingness to listen, a heart inclined to serve, and the ability to be with children and adults in grief without trying to fix, solve or give advice. No prior experience is necessary. Volunteers must be 21 years or older. Bilingual (Spanish speaking) volunteers are needed as well. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving and help create a space where participants can share tears and embrace the joys of life.

"In order to continue to grow our English and Spanish speaking programs, we need to constantly recruit and train new volunteer facilitators," said Veronica Ortiz, Imagine Program Manager. "Our programs are growing because of the great need in this community, especially in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. Over 220 children and adults have been participating in our virtual support groups this year. We have recently launched a new program year, but there is more demand for our programs than we're able to meet with our current number of facilitators. Doing this additional training will ensure that no child will ever have to wait to get the support they need."

Are you interested in joining Imagine's incredible community of volunteers and help us eliminate a wait list for our groups? Imagine is planning to offer a virtual facilitator training from Friday, November 5 through Sunday, November 7 from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. each day. CASA VOLUNTEERS FOR FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

The latest class of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster youth have taken their oath before a Union County Superior Court Judge and are now ready to be matched to their case as the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County.

The nonprofit, which began in Union County in 2005, recruits, trains, supports, and supervises volunteers to serve local child-victims removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect or abandonment, and living in foster care. It is the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for Union County judges hearing youth cases.

Superior Court Judge James Hely presided over the swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; once matched to their youth or sibling set, advocates will begin putting their 30-hours of training into practice. The newest CASA volunteers for Union County are Janet Colman of Warren, Komal Nankani of Summit, Karime Herrera and James Walker Jr. of Elizabeth, Mike Caporaso of Lebanon, Regina O'Connor of Fanwood, and Veronica Gardner of Union.

Volunteers need no special prior background or experience to serve as advocates; each undergoes a thorough training process and is supported by CASA staff. Successful advocates bring with them varied life experiences and professional backgrounds. No matter the age of the youth to whom they are assigned, advocates' commitment to being a consistent presence – many foster youth experience a revolving door of professionals in addition to the separation from family members – and ensuring needs are identified and recommendations are made to the judge and stakeholders, the trajectory of a child's life can be changed for the better.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth, foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers in order to identify and report to the judge any

concerns and needs in order to protect best interests.

The organization remains committed to serving every Union County youth in foster care; to do that, more community volunteers are needed to step up and train as an advocate for a local child-victim who could range from birth to age 21. For the last few years the New Jersey Veterans Network and its mobile outreach team has been aggressively seeking out veterans in need and providing them resources to have a better way of life. NEW PLAY REUNITES TEACHER AND STUDENT

When Deirdre Louise MacNamara was a high school student, she performed in several plays at Roselle Catholic High School, directed by Maurice J. Moran. Now, MacNamara has written a play that will be performed in New York City, directed by Moran. "Order Up!" consists of five one-act plays that take place in a "typical NYC diner." It will run in November for a limited engagement in Manhattan.

Moran, a resident of Rahway, has been directing plays for New Jersey high schools, community theatres, and professional summer stock for 50 years. MacNamara, who grew up in Elizabeth, has acted in New York and New Jersey. Together, they had worked on several projects prior to the pandemic, including her one-woman show that she performed in Brooklyn and Greenwich Village.

"Order up!" is her first full-length play. Each act is titled with "diner speak," reflecting the intriguing descriptions servers use to communicate with the cook. "Blonde with Sand," for example, one of the plays, is "Coffee with milk and sugar." The other plays include "In the Weeds," "Blue Plate Special," "Adam and Eve on a Raft," and "Pittsburgh." Each play features characters who use the diner as a meeting place to discover the different meanings of love, from friendship and family to romance.



Michelle Audino, a junior at Westfield High School and member of Girl Scout Troop 40491, completed 100 tote bags for her Girl Scout Gold Award – Tees 2 Totes – with the help of local Girl Scout Troops, community residents, and the Holy Trinity Youth Group in Westfield.

"I recycled T-shirts into tote bags to reuse old clothes instead of throwing them away, and to use as a replacement for plastic bags. The tote bags I made from the T-shirts are large and thick," Audino said.

Audino says that recycling T-shirts into totes bags will address two environmental issues: 1) cutting down fast fashion pollution, and 2) cutting down plastic pollution in landfills and oceans.

According to Audino, the clothing industry is the second largest industrial and freshwater

polluter. In addition, she noted that single-use plastic bags will be banned from stores in New Jersey effective May 2022.

On September 7th, she met with Deacon Keith Gibbons of Holy Trinity Roman Catholic Church in Westfield to donate 40 totes, which included 27 T-shirt totes and 13 bags, to the Westfield Food Pantry. The totes will be used to transport food to families in need. Attached to each tote bag is a business card designed by Audino. The card includes a QR code, which when scanned with a cell phone camera, links to a YouTube tutorial prepared by Michelle for detailed instructions on how to make your own totes.

Despite the lingering threat of rain, the L'Oreal Volunteers, worked tirelessly to spread


the gravel, weed garden beds, clean windows and the porch, and take on other maintenance tasks throughout the Reeve House and property.



Therefore, a bike can make a huge difference in a persons life. Bicycles do not create air pollution, and creates jobs because now the village needs a bike shop to repair tires, fix chains, etc.


Off road bikes are sent to countries which do not have paved roads. Road bikes are sent to countries with paved roads. Children's bikes are important to help kids get to school.

Sewing machines are also collected and shipped. A sewing machine can give a single mother a way to support her family.

"WE RIDE FOR THOSE WHO DIED"

The Westfield Police Department sent a team to ride in the 2021 Police Unity Tour. The riders ended their 4-day, 320-mile bicycle ride on Thursday, October 14th by riding through the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial.

According to The National Law Enforcement Memorial and Museum website, nleomf.org, between 1,200 and 1,300 riders were expected to ride into the Memorial to remember and honor the fallen. The ride begins in New Jersey with a 45 to 50 mile ride. The next day, the riders travel to Wilmington, DE. From Wilmington, they will ride about 100 miles to Annapolis, MD. The last leg of the trip riders travel 60 miles to the Memorial in Washington, DC.

A Candlelight Vigil ends the 2021 Police Unity Tour. During the vigil the names of 701 law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty – including 434 who died in 2019 and 2020 – are formally dedicated on the evening of October 14, during the 33rd Annual Candlelight Vigil, held on the National Mall and produced by the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund.

The mission of the National Law Enforcement Memorial and Museum is to honor the fallen, tell the story of American law enforcement, and make it safer for those who serve.

In May 2020, the Police Unity Tour was proud to donate more than \$2.0 million to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, bringing the total donations to more than \$30 million since their inception in 1997.

On June 29, 2021, Captain "Bud" Jackson Composite Squadron (NJ-102) of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP), an Auxiliary of the United States Air Force, had special guest speakers from the US Space Force - Major Jose Almanzar and Captain Ronald Nguyen. In a virtual meeting of over 110 participants, including visitors from other CAP squadrons, attended and the speakers shared the goal and purpose of this new branch of the military, talked about their jobs, gave advice to the cadets considering the path and much more. There was time for a Q&A session, where the speakers provided valuable information towards a wide range of cadet/senior member questions. Cadets took away extensive information to inspire them about this new exciting path of space research and operations.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the US Space Force is an independent branch of the military that was carved out of the Air Force in December 2019. With their Command motto as "Guardians of the High Frontier", the US Space Force is considered a critical asset, impacting everyday life. Although it is currently the smallest of the US armed services, the Space Force is responsible for operating and defending military satellites and ground stations and supports

Eight Westfield High School students have received special honors from the College Board National Recognition Programs.



"Temple Emanu-El has a long history of actively supporting the Food Bank in Hillside, and they recently reached out to us again," says Nancy Manket, the organizer and coordinator of the volunteer effort. "CFBNJ had a 60% drop in volunteers last year, and desperately needs help.

This commitment to Tikkun Olam, or "healing the world," says Manket, is what inspires Temple Emanu-El's army of volunteers to regularly immerse themselves in a variety of social action projects intended to make life better for others in the surrounding communities and beyond. In addition to food bank and emergency food drive projects, the Tikkun Olam Committee houses the homeless, handcrafts "blankets of love" that provide comfort to children and teens with cancer, and grow vegetables in their own "mitzvah garden" that they donate to the Westfield Food Pantry.

Volunteers working in CFBNJ's kitchen that day helped assemble and pack 425 lunches for the after-school Kids' Café Program, which distributes nutritious meals to young people throughout Central Jersey and North Jersey. Daryl Walker has been the Chef and Production Manager for five years, and is passionate about what he does. "It feels amazing to know that I'm able to help feed young kids and seniors," says Walker. "It's been a life-changing experience for me, knowing that every single day I'm helping to make a real difference in our communities."

The CFBNJ is the largest anti-hunger, anti-

than 1,000 community partners in eleven New Jersey counties, including local soup kitchens, food pantries, emergency shelters and child and senior feeding programs. But their hunger-relief programs also address the substantial need by delivering after-school meals for children, distributing bags of supplemental food for families, and providing job training for people looking for a second chance. And they also run a diaper program for those who can't afford to buy them, prepare meals for people returning home with cancer, and offer a 16-week culinary course that provides free chef training for those in need. "New Jersey has been hit hard by COVID-19," says Traci Hendricks, Volunteer Resources Specialist for CFBNJ. "We will have distributed a record 90 million meals by the end of this fiscal year, and probably more next year. We want our communities to know that we are going to help them. We are going to feed them, no matter what. And we couldn't possibly accomplish all this without our volunteers; they are our lifeline."




