EMERGENCY SQUAD'S 17TH ANNUAL "SNOW VILLAGE"

Free, Family Fun - A Delight for Kids of All Ages

It's the most wonderful time of the year - the Chatham Emergency Squad proudly presents the 17th annual Winter Wonderland / "Snow Village" taking place throughout the month of December at its Chatham Borough building, located at 31 North Passaic Avenue.

The impressive display features more than 100 Department 56 model houses, cars and figurines with a working ski lift, ice skating rink and more, set amidst the backdrop of a snow-filled winter wonderland and a model train running through the center of town. Children of all ages are invited to see the exhibit for themselves and find hidden treasures among the exhibition during the numerous open houses held at the Squad building.

This year is particularly exciting since the exhibit was disassembled and packed into multiple cartons when it became clear that COVID would prevent a 2020 show. Despite the thousands of parts, a team of five volunteers, including several members of the all-volunteer Chatham Squad, working over multiple weekends, were able to recreate the magic of the experience. "We're excited to continue this annual holiday tradition which has helped spread holiday cheer to, quite literally, a generation of Chatham residents," said Bryan McGookin, an active member of the Squad who has carefully maintained the private collection, which remains on loan by Mark Spinner (Spinner retired in 2018 after 40 years of service and relocated to another community). "Much like the arrival of Santa himself, the Chatham Emergency Squad "Snow Village" has become a fixture of our community, signaling the arrival of the holiday season throughout Chatham," added McGookin.



The Winter Wonderland / Snow Village will be open from 3:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. every Saturday in December except Christmas Day; and from 12:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. each Sunday in December. In addition, open houses will be held from 3:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. on December 8th, 16th, 24th and 27th. The full schedule is available at .chathamemergencysquad.org. The Squad is happy to consider special times and group tours if staffing is available. These can be arranged by submitting a request through the website.

The Chatham Emergency Squad is an all-volunteer organization funded almost exclusively by donations. The Squad never charges for its services. They have responded to nearly 1,100 emergency calls so far in 2021 and have continued to provide free training in CPR to teachers, coaches and emergency personnel despite COVID restrictions on class size. 

Wintertime does not stop Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA and Venturers from having fun!


Firstly, Cub Scouts are for boys and girls in grades K-5. Even though boys and girls are in the same pack, dens are all-boy or all-girl. Dens are small groups of Cubs who are in the same grade and the Scouts continuously meet with their own dens. For the annual Pinewood Derby, the Cubs met with their entire pack, which are all the dens coming together, and built their own cars!

In addition, Scouts BSA are for boys and girls ages 11-18, however, troops are boy-only or girl-only. Scouts BSA meet weekly to learn new



SCOUT EXECUTIVE SPEAKS TO ROTARY CLUB

Marc Andreo, the Scout Executive and CEO of the Patriot's Path Council, Boy Scouts of America spoke to the Rotary Club of Westfield on Tuesday, September 21, 2021. His topic was to update the club on the state of the local Scouting. The pandemic has decreased the scouting program somewhat, but it is still going strong, and they are planning to rebuild it to where it was before the shutdown.

Paul Harris, the man who started Rotary International in 1905, was great friends with James E. West who started the Boy Scouts of America in 1910. Paul gave advice on how to spread the program throughout the US, mirroring the way Rotary clubs were spreading. Both organizations have a lot of similarities, including an ethical code, teaching leadership skills, being community based and service oriented. Rotary clubs currently charter 1,000 scout units across the US.

The Patriot's Path Council, BSA consists of 5 counties in northern New Jersey with more than 10,000 scouts and 4,000 adult volunteers. They are in the counties of Sussex, Morris, Somerset, Union and northern Middlesex. The headquarters in Cedar Knolls has only 25 full-time staff. There are two scout shops one in Cedar Knolls, and one in Mountainside.

The Council offers three Day Camps: at Watchung Reservation; Johnson Park, New Brunswick; and Camp Wheeler at Mt. Allamuchy Scout Reservation. The Council offers four overnight camping opportunities: Winnebago Scout Reservation in Rockaway, NJ; Mt. Allamuchy in Byram Township; Sabattis

Adventure Camp in Long Lake NY, and the four national high adventure bases: The Summit in West Virginia; Northern Tier in Minnesota, Sea Base in the Florida Keys, and Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico.


Recent changes to the Scouts include welcoming girls to the Cub Scout and the legacy Boy Scout programs three years ago. The purpose was to include entire families in the activities. To accommodate this change, the "Boy Scout" program for ages 5th grade through age 18 was renamed the "Scouts BSA". The name of the parent organization remains the Boy Scouts of America. The Cub Scout program is for children from K through 5th grade; Scouts BSA is for children 5th grade through age 18. Other programs have been coed for many decades, including Explorers - who explore career opportunities, Venture Crews - who go on high adventure trips, Sea Scouts who learn mariner skills, and a relatively new program - STEM- in which students explore science related careers. These last four programs welcome boys and girls from ages 14 to 21.

Cub Scout Dens may be all boy and all girl, or

coed. Scouts BSA Troops are either all girl or all boy. This year there are 250,000 young women in the scouts, and 1,000 girls were the first graduating class of female Eagle Scouts. Only 4% of all scouts ever achieve the rank of Eagle, making it a mark of distinction.

The residents of Westfield are enthusiastic supporters of Scouting. There are 12 units: 7 Cub Scout Packs and 5 Scout Troops, with nearly 500 youth, which is double the national average. Last year the Patriots' Path Council recognized 315 Eagle Scouts and Scouts collectively earned more than 6,200 merit badges. The Rotary Club of Westfield has been a long time supporter of the Scouts. Several members are Eagle Scouts, and many of the children of Rotarians are in the Scouting program, and a number have earned the rank of Eagle. The club likes to support Eagle Service projects financially.

Scout Executive Marc Andreo asked the Rotarians to help spread the word about local Scouting. With units and camps open again, they are seeking more youth to join the local programs. Please visit beascout.org to locate a unit near you!

HELP US FIND MORRIS COUNTY'S PURPLE HEART HEROES

County of Morris

In the final days of the American Revolution, on Aug. 7, 1782, General George Washington established the Badge of Military Merit to, as his general orders stated, "cherish virtuous ambition in his soldiers." It was the birth of what we now call the Purple Heart, presented to military personnel wounded in the line of duty.

Morris County has a rich and storied history of Purple Heart honorees and its historians have joined the mission of the National Purple Heart Hall of Honor in New Windsor, N.Y. to collect, preserve and share the stories of all Purple Heart recipients. The Morris County Office of Planning and Preservation wants to make a full accounting of the local men and women who earned the honor, and the office is interested in any photographs, news accounts or artifacts that help to tell the story of each soldier.

"The Purple Heart Project is another avenue for veterans to get their history out there. We want to include everyone, regardless of the conflict they served in. Veterans' history isn't just national or global history, it is also a personal history of families on a very local level – even gut level. It's important for future generations to

know what their ancestors did. Their bravery and sacrifices should not be forgotten," said Jan Williams, a Cultural and Historic Resources Specialist with the Morris County Office of Planning & Preservation.


The county has a list of more than 350 area veterans who received the Purple Heart, but historians are convinced it is only a fraction of the actual number. Williams also noted that the National Purple Heart Hall of Honor, which operates as a research center and maintains a national database of Purple Heart recipients, also is trying to make a full accounting.


"This Purple Heart database contains service members' names and units, but it has gaps and I hope that families will add this important information to the archives. For researchers and family members, it's difficult to find information sources like this, completely cost free and easily accessed from home," she explained.

US SPACE FORCE: GUARDIANS OF THE HIGH FRONTIER

Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program (NJ-102)

As we explore new horizons, the United States expands beyond what is imaginable. With the creation of the US Space Force, the country truly embodies the notion of "reaching for the stars"! On June 29, 2021, Captain "Bud" Jackson Composite Squadron (NJ-102) of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP), an Auxiliary of the United States Air Force, had special guest speakers from the US Space Force - Major Jose Almanzar and Captain Ronald Nguyen. In a virtual meeting of over 110 participants, including visitors from other CAP squadrons, attended and the speakers shared the goal and purpose of this new branch of the military, talked about their jobs, gave advice to the cadets considering the path and much more. There was time for a Q&A session, where the speakers provided valuable information towards a wide range of cadet/senior member questions. Cadets took away extensive information to inspire them about this new

exciting path of space research and operations.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the US Space Force is an independent branch of the military that was carved out of the Air Force in December 2019. With their Command motto as "Guardians of the High Frontier", the US Space Force is considered a critical asset, impacting everyday life. Although it is currently the smallest of the US armed services, the Space Force is responsible for operating and defending military satellites and ground stations and supports communication and navigation on Earth. It provides a much needed position of strength, especially technology-wise, for protecting US interests in space or going on offense, if needed, in the future. Civilian life cannot survive without our space capabilities. Our military based missions are now largely supported by space operations. Additionally, as space tourism is about to lift off in the coming years, the US will have a growing space community.

As an empowerment message to the young cadets, Maj Almanzar and Capt Nguyen talked about the Space Force's need for bold and diverse leaders with new ideas. They stressed the importance of being exposed to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) experiences and education early on - "Always take advantage of opportunities presented to you and explore the growing areas of the Space Force."
