HISPANIC HERITAGE NIGHT CELEBRATED

Kenilworth Public Schools

Students love a good party, so it's no surprise that Kenilworth Public Schools' recent fiesta was hugely popular. The October 14th celebration also included the community – and a vibrant cultural theme.

The district's Hispanic Heritage Night helped represent the background of many Kenilworth students. Hispanic students make up 35 percent of the district's enrollment.

"We have students from Chile, Costa Rica, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Peru, Ecuador, and many more Hispanic countries and territories around the world," said David Brearley Middle-High School Principal, Jeremy Davies. "Events such as Hispanic Heritage Night highlight our commitment to make sure all students feel a sense of belonging."

Students served as "ambassadors" at the event, sharing information and heirlooms from their families' countries of origin. The event was partly sponsored by the New Jersey Education Association's Pride Program, which seeks to build community involvement in public schools.

Two of Brearley's World Language teachers, Kayla Khaled and Alejandro Mejia, spearheaded the night's activities. They coordinated student participation and arranged for entertainment and empanadas--both of which were big hits. A Mariachi band performed, and a Zumba instructor gave lessons. And those empanadas? They went rápido! Local restaurants donated more than 500 empanadas, which were gone within 30 minutes. Participating restaurants, La Casa del Pan in Union, Chilean Bakery in Roselle Park, and Antojitos Don Chucho of Elizabeth Port, contributed empanadas of various flavors, offering a taste of diverse regional cuisine.

"Students and community members were thrilled and appreciative that our school was able to provide an event that encouraged and inspired their interests in Hispanic culture, while also creating a cooperative approach to a collective positive school environment," Khaled said.

For extra credit, Hispanic Heritage Night also was educational. "This year we've implemented an instructional curriculum in World Language

classes that provides students with the opportunity to immerse themselves in both Hispanic culture and Spanish language," Mejia said. "The event created an authentic experience that complemented and supported our instructional goals." Cultural events such as Hispanic Heritage Night also help advance one of Kenilworth's 2021-22 district goals, namelyincreasing the focus on nurturing diversity and equity and inclusion.

Judging by the feedback from the recent event, Kenilworth should expect a crowd at upcoming celebrations such as Black History Night in February and a Women's History Night in March. One attendee said, "I am proud that I was afforded this opportunity" to participate in Hispanic Heritage Night. Another appreciated how "the beauty of Hispanic heritage was highlighted". And the words of one student might have been the most poignant: "Our school felt different. We felt united."

COMMEMORATION OF VETERANS DAY

Kenilworth Public Schools

For Kenilworth Public Schools, commemorating Veterans Day is an active duty.

This year at Harding Elementary School in Kenilworth, NJ, students created thank-you cards and presented them to veterans. Dozens of flags were placed around school grounds to honor service members in time for Veterans Day and Superintendent of Schools, Kyle Arlington, was among the speakers at the Kenilworth Veterans Center's holiday program on November 11th.

"We welcome any opportunity for our students to work with veterans," Arlington said in his remarks. "Young people can learn great lessons from their example of service and selflessness."

Around 100 people attended the Veterans Center event, which was cosponsored by VFW Post 2230 and American Legion Post 470. The turnout was higher than usual, noted Robert E. Jeans Sr., Commander of Post 2230.

Jeans led the VFW presentation, but Ed so important here in our small town." Sudnick, American Legion Post 470 1st Vice

Commander, and Jerry Dobbins, Kenilworth Veterans Center President, also spoke.

Further, community leaders, including Mayor Linda Karlovitch and Police Chief Fred Soos, joined Arlington in making remarks.

"Kenilworth Public Schools is proud of our veterans. And we are proud of the way our students honor veterans," Arlington said.

Arlington mentioned a recent example of student support for Kenilworth veterans. Last year, students in the Practical Arts class at David Brearley Middle-High School designed a nonprofit clothing line called Be Nice Co. to benefit local charities. The students and their teacher decided to give the first round of proceeds to the Kenilworth VFW.

"Kenilworth Public Schools will continue to contribute to veterans in the community," Arlington said.

"Veterans embody the community spirit that is so important here in our small town."

What, Where, and When in Old Kenilworth: CHRISTMASES I REMEMBER

As a young boy growing up in Kenilworth in the 1940s, '50s, and '60s, I have memories of Christmas time. Harding and McKinley schools were hubs of holiday activity. Teachers would ask who could donate this or that for classroom decorations. Before consulting parents, someone called out, "I'll get the tree." Our beloved custodian, "Mr. Bill" (William Hartshorn) built Christmas tree stands for every tree.

Miss Margaret Ray's art students made tons of white cut-out snowflakes and snowmen that found their way in abundance onto every school window and door. Students fashioned neverending chains from strips of green and red construction paper held together with a thick paste from huge jugs of peppermint-smelling paste. Some couldn't resist tasting it – I tried once - we all survived. Kids created long strands of popcorn to encircle the tree from top to bottom along with the red and green paper chains. Tree lights were brought in from home, but first had to pass Mr. Bill's safety inspection before adorning any tree.

Music teacher Miss Lorraine Conover put on Christmas concerts – as they were called back then. Every child at every grade level was featured singing or playing an instrument. The auditorium was standing room only. Fortunately, the fire marshal was in the Christmas spirit.

Santa visited the schools. One was Anna Ruscansky who arrived in her self-made Jolly Old Elf suit. For over 30 years she brought sweet treats for all. When she died at age 96 in 1996, the St. Theresa organist played "Jingle Bells" at the end of her funeral mass. For a number of years the Lion's Club brought a Santa via helicopter to Harding School on a December

weekend. When the FAA later prohibited such landings, the fire department took over and drove Santa all over town on a bell clanging fire truck. The tradition continues with sirens blaring.

Friday nights were Kenilworth's "uptown" shopping nights. Stores stayed open late. Then one year it happened! The Kenilworth Businessmen's Association and the mayor and council shared the cost for first-ever colorful lights to span the Boulevard. The towering, illuminated official Borough Christmas tree stood on the library front lawn. Shoppers scurried into Jule's and Harvey's Commonwealth Department Store or to Heller's Boro Drugs for gifts. More expensive items could be found at Dick Hage's or Donlin's Jewelers. Tools and gadgets for dad or countertop appliances for mom could be gotten at Simmenroth's Center Hardware or Charlie's Kenilworth Hardware. Hobbies and games for

children – the Kenilworth Hobby Shop was the place. Still looking for something? It was off to Whalen & Berry's 5 & 10. Still short on gifts? Order something from the Sears & Roebuck catalogue or go to shops in Elizabeth.

In my childhood home at 47 Arbor St., my sisters, brother, and I went to bed Christmas Eve with no toys or tree in sight. Miraculously, the next morn there was a fully decorated tree with lights ablaze, an electric toy train chugging around under the tree, and most importantly, lots and lots of presents. Often still in our night clothes, there was no holding us back.

From me to you, enjoy your family and friends "Merry Christmas!"







US SPACE FORCE: GUARDIANS OF THE HIGH FRONTIER

Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program (NJ-102)

As we explore new horizons, the United States expands beyond what is imaginable. With the creation of the US Space Force, the country truly embodies the notion of "reaching for the stars"! On June 29, 2021, Captain "Bud" Jackson Composite Squadron (NJ-102) of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP), an Auxiliary of the United States Air Force, had special guest speakers from the US Space Force - Major Jose Almanzar and Captain Ronald Nguyen. In a virtual meeting of over 110 participants, including visitors from other CAP squadrons, attended and the speakers shared the goal and purpose of this new branch of the military, talked about their jobs, gave advice to the cadets considering the path and much more. There was time for a Q&A session, where the speakers provided valuable information towards a wide range of cadet/senior member questions. Cadets took away extensive information to inspire them about this new exciting path of space research and operations.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the US Space Force is an independent branch of the military that was carved out of the Air Force in December 2019. With their Command motto as "Guardians of the High Frontier", the US Space Force is considered a critical asset, impacting everyday life. Although it is currently the smallest of the US armed services, the Space Force is responsible for operating and defending military satellites and ground stations and supports

communication and navigation on Earth. It provides a much needed position of strength, especially technology-wise, for protecting US interests in space or going on offense, if needed, in the future. Civilian life cannot survive without our space capabilities. Our military based missions are now largely supported by space operations. Additionally, as space tourism is about to lift off in the coming years, the US will have a growing space community.

As an empowerment message to the young cadets, Maj Almanzar and Capt Nguyen talked about the Space Force's need for bold and diverse leaders with new ideas. They stressed the importance of being exposed to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) experiences and education early on - "Always take advantage of opportunities presented to you and explore the growing areas of the Space Force. The sky is not the limit so it is your time to soar!"







HANUKAH: A CELEBRATION OF RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Hanukah is one of the Jewish religion's most popular holidays. No doubt, part of Hanukah's popularity derives from its proximity to Christmas and the bundling of a variety of religious, ethnic and cultural holidays that occur at this time of year creating a festive holiday season.

You might be surprised to know however, that unlike Christmas, Hanukah is not one of Judaism's major holidays. That billing goes to Rosh HaShanah (the Jewish New Year) and Yom Kippur (the Day of Fasting and Atonement) and the Pilgrimage Festivals of Passover, Sukkot and Shavuot that are explained and discussed in The Book of Leviticus (Chapter 23).

But Hanukah is important for many reasons. In the first place, next to the Passover Seder, more Jews celebrate Hanukah than any other Jewish ritual or holiday observance. We celebrate two miracles on Hanukah: the military victory of a small, outmanned Jewish army winning out over a superior Syrian-Greek King Antiochus Epiphanes, who forbade the Jewish people to study their scriptures, keep their calendar, observe their holidays or offer sacrifices in the Temple. The King wanted the Jews to sacrifice to the Greek Gods and study the best of Greek culture. King Antiochus was jealous of the God of Israel and sought to eradicate distinctive Jewish practices and culture.

The second miracle of Hanukah is the story in Rabbinic tradition, that when the revolt ended and the Jewish people sought to rededicate and purify the Holy Temple in Jerusalem that had been defiled by the decree of King Antiochus by lighting the Menorah, the religious candelabrum that served as a major symbol of religious Jewish life in the Temple, that there was only enough purified olive oil to last for one day, but the lamp remained burning for eight days!

But I also think the story of Hanukah teaches and shares important lessons for our friends and neighbors of other faiths about religious faith and belief. To me, Hanukah represents the first



victory in human history of religious freedom. In a certain sense, Hanukah is a universal holiday of religious freedom. If the Jewish people had lost this physical and spiritual war in 164 BCE (before the common era) and 164 years before the birth of Jesus, Judaism would have died out and since Christianity and Islam emanate out of and are connected to Judaism, there would not be today any adherents of these great faiths. Judaism, Christianity and Islam exist today because of the religious faith of these defenders of Judaism to stand up for their beliefs and rights.

Hanukah also teaches religious tolerance and the celebration of pluralism. Hanukah reinforces the rights of a minority to stand up for its beliefs while living in a larger secular or religious culture of other religious faiths. Our country was built on the idea of freedom of religion and the freedom to live by and practice the customs, rituals and commandments of our respective religions. Hanukah teaches me that sometimes miracles happen in the quiet constancy of our everyday practice of our respective customs, prayers and traditions and our interaction and bonds of friendship and community responsibility with our neighbors of all religions and ethnic groups.

The most enduring symbol of both Hanukah and Christmas is the celebration of light. We light a Menorah to symbolize the miracles of our survival and the dedication of our people - for over four-thousand years even in the midst of persecution or the attempt to suppress our faith and practice - to practice our customs and traditions with hope and confidence in the future as a monotheistic ethical religion and culture.

For our Christian friends, the lights of the Christmas season represent essential religious beliefs including joy, peace, kindness and service to our fellow human beings. Even with the challenges the Covid-19 pandemic has caused, among the most difficult in our lifetimes, may the lights of our respective traditions strengthen our commitment to our respective faiths and our obligation and opportunity to make a difference in our community and in the world at large. As one great rabbi wrote: "It is better to light one candle than to curse the darkness." Wishing all of us a meaningful holiday season!




