WHY ARE THE NAMES OF RAHWAY BANKS ON UNITED STATES CURRENCY?

We all know what American dollars look like. No matter the denomination, the appearance of our paper money is something we readily recognize. Yet when introduced to the currency from another time period, one might easily assume it's just some kind of "play money," especially if the names of Rahway banks are prominently displayed on the front of the bills. In reality, the "Rahway" bills actually were United States legal tender and were circulated by four Rahway banks for portions of over seventy years.

Before the Civil War, banks were chartered by the state governments where they were

located. Different states developed different regulations and policies creating a system that was poorly integrated across state lines. As a result, it became more and more obvious that a nationally regulated banking structure was needed.

In February, 1863, the National Banking Act was created by President Abraham Lincoln with a three-fold purpose: to create a national chartering and regulatory system, to float Federal war bonds to help finance the Civil War, and to establish a national currency. After the Act was passed by Congress, more than 1,500 state banks, including two in Rahway, converted to the National banking system. Two more national banks would be established in the city after 1900. The national banks would be chartered and supervised by the Office of the Comptroller of Currency, an agency in the U. S. Treasury Department.

The new currency would be designed and printed in Washington D.C. Local banks were given the option of having the name of their bank added on the face side. The Rahway banks took advantage of the offer.

The following are images of the four Rahway national banks and samples of the bills circulated by each.



(left) The National Bank of Rahway, formerly the Farmers' and Mechanics', a state bank, received a national charter in 1865 and transacted business for the next twenty-two years. The bank was located on the NW corner of Main and Poplar Streets. The building was razed in 1905.

(left) The Union National Bank was housed in the Exchange Building, SW corner of Irving and Cherry Streets. Chartered in 1865, the bank was in business until 1878. The building was razed in 1911 to clear the way for the elevation of the railroad tracks.

(left) The architecturally beautiful Rahway National Bank was constructed in 1900 on the NW corner of Irving Street and Vail Place. It maintained its national charter until 1962 when it switched to a state charter. The building still stands, but over the years has been altered, added to, and modernized completely changing the façade.

(left) The Citizens' National Bank lasted only seven years (1925-1932). Located on the SE corner of Irving and Lewis Streets, the building still stands and looks much the same as it did in the 20s. When it closed, its deposits were assumed by the Rahway National Bank, its neighbor across the street.

HANUKAH: A CELEBRATION OF RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Hanukah is one of the Jewish religion's most popular holidays. No doubt, part of Hanukah's popularity derives from its proximity to Christmas and the bundling of a variety of religious, ethnic and cultural holidays that occur at this time of year creating a festive holiday season.

You might be surprised to know however, that unlike Christmas, Hanukah is not one of Judaism's major holidays. That billing goes to Rosh HaShanah (the Jewish New Year) and Yom Kippur (the Day of Fasting and Atonement) and the Pilgrimage Festivals of Passover, Sukkot and Shavuot that are explained and discussed in The Book of Leviticus (Chapter 23).

But Hanukah is important for many reasons. In the first place, next to the Passover Seder, more Jews celebrate Hanukah than any other Jewish ritual or holiday observance. We celebrate two miracles on Hanukah: the military victory of a small, outmanned Jewish army winning out over a superior Syrian-Greek King Antiochus Epiphanes, who forbade the Jewish people to study their scriptures, keep their calendar, observe their holidays or offer sacrifices in the Temple. The King wanted the Jews to sacrifice to the Greek Gods and study the best of Greek culture. King Antiochus was jealous of the God of Israel and sought to eradicate distinctive Jewish practices and culture.

The second miracle of Hanukah is the story in Rabbinic tradition, that when the revolt ended and the Jewish people sought to rededicate and purify the Holy Temple in Jerusalem that had been defiled by the decree of King Antiochus by lighting the Menorah, the religious candelabrum that served as a major symbol of religious Jewish life in the Temple, that there was only enough purified olive oil to last for one day, but the lamp remained burning for eight days!

But I also think the story of Hanukah teaches and shares important lessons for our friends and neighbors of other faiths about religious faith and belief. To me, Hanukah represents the first victory in human history of religious freedom. In a certain sense, Hanukah is a universal holiday of religious freedom. If the Jewish people had lost this physical and spiritual war in 164 BCE (before the common era) and 164 years before the birth of Jesus, Judaism would have died out and since Christianity and Islam emanate out of and are connected to Judaism, there would not be today any adherents of these great faiths. Judaism, Christianity and Islam exist today because of the religious faith of these defenders of Judaism to stand up for their beliefs and rights.

Hanukah also teaches religious tolerance and the celebration of pluralism. Hanukah reinforces the rights of a minority to stand up for its beliefs while living in a larger secular or religious culture of other religious faiths. Our country was built on the idea of freedom of religion and the freedom to live by and practice the customs, rituals and commandments of our respective religions. Hanukah teaches me that sometimes miracles happen in the quiet constancy of our everyday

practice of our respective customs, prayers and traditions and our interaction and bonds of friendship and community responsibility with our neighbors of all religions and ethnic groups.

The most enduring symbol of both Hanukah and Christmas is the celebration of light. We light a Menorah to symbolize the miracles of our survival and the dedication of our people - for over four-thousand years even in the midst of persecution or the attempt to suppress our faith and practice - to practice our customs and traditions with hope and confidence in the future as a monotheistic ethical religion and culture.

For our Christian friends, the lights of the Christmas season represent essential religious beliefs including joy, peace, kindness and service to our fellow human beings. Even with the challenges the Covid-19 pandemic has caused, among the most difficult in our lifetimes, may the lights of our respective traditions strengthen our commitment to our respective faiths and our obligation and opportunity to make a difference in our community and in the world at large. As



one great rabbi wrote: "It is better to light one candle than to curse the darkness." Wishing all of us a meaningful holiday season!

A SHORT HISTORY OF CHRISTMAS TREES

"Evergreen boughs have been essential seasonal decor since ancient times as part of pagan winter solstice celebrations. Evergreens at midwinter festivals were traditional, signifying the victory of life and light over death and darkness." *

In many countries it was believed that evergreens would keep away witches, ghosts, evil spirits, and illness.

There is some debate over the origin of our modern-day Christmas trees. Both Latvia and Estonia claim to have been home to the first Christmas tree. Latvia traces its Christmas tree traditions back to 1510, when a merchant guild called the House of the Black Heads carried a tree through the city, decorated it, and later burned it down. Meanwhile, Estonia has countered those claims, saying it has evidence of a similar festival hosted by the very same guild in its capital city Tallinn in 1441.

Today most historians believe our traditions started in Alsace, part of Germany at the time but now France. Historical records indicate that a Christmas tree was raised in the Strasbourg Cathedral in 1539 and that the tradition had grown so popular throughout the region that the city of Freiburg banned felling trees for Christmas in 1554.

Still, the tradition caught on among German families and slowly evolved through the years to what we know today. Protestant reformer Martin Luther is often credited with being the first to put lights on the Christmas tree with candles after a nighttime stroll through the forest with twinkling stars above. German emigrants took these traditions with them as they resettled in other countries. By the 18th century Christmas trees were all over Europe.

In 1848, Queen Victoria and her husband Prince Albert from Germany captured the imaginations of royal watchers around the world when the Illustrated London News published an illustration of their family gathered around a decorated Christmas tree. Queen Victoria was a trendsetter of her time, and so the tradition took off around the world.

Germany's Christmas tree tradition also likely arrived in the United States in the late 18th century, when Hessian troops joined the British to fight in the Revolutionary War. In the years that followed, German immigrants also brought

the tradition to the U.S. and, over time, historian Penne Restad writes that they "became a point of fascination for other Americans."

American families adopted the Christmas tree more widely after 1850, when the Philadelphiabased magazine Godey's Lady's Book republished the royal family's Christmas scene from Illustrated London News. The magazine made a few tweaks, editing out Victoria's crown and Albert's royal sash to transform them into one version of an American family.

Today, the lighting of two beloved U.S. Christmas trees is a part of our country's ritual for ushering in the holiday season. In 1923, President Calvin Coolidge oversaw the lighting of the first National Christmas Tree in Washington, D.C.

A decade later, in 1933, New York City lit the first Christmas tree at Rockefeller Center which has since become a must visit for tourists and New Yorkers alike each holiday season. Both trees have been illuminated every year since, save for a few years in the 1940s when they went dark due to blackout restrictions during World War II.

CHRISTMAS TREE FARMS

Many citizens of New Jersey would be surprised to learn that we are the home of the first Christmas Tree Farm in the United Sates.

In 1901, W.V. McGalliard planted twenty-five thousand Norway Spruces on his property in Mercer County near Trenton. Seven years later those Christmas trees were sold for one dollar each.

Today there are 83 Christmas tree farms in New Jersey. Their locations are posted on the internet.

During the 1940s, 90 percent of all natural Christmas trees sold in the United State were harvested from forests. The most popular species during that era, Balsam Fir, Douglas-fir, Black Spruce and White Spruce, were all readily available growing wild in forests.

Luckily following World War II more trees began to be planted on plantations.

Today 30 million Christmas trees are harvested every year on tree farms. 25% of these trees are grown in Oregon and shipped throughout the country. Christmas trees are grown in all 50 states including Hawaii and Alaska. Today 98 percent of all Christmas trees are grown on farms.

Evergreen trees generally take 6 to 10 years to reach maturity. All of these trees are trimmed once a year to give them a pleasing appearance in the home. The best-selling trees are Scotch Pine, Douglas Fir, Fraser Fir, Balsam Fir and White Pine.

The tallest living Christmas tree is believed to be the 122-foot, 91-year-old Douglas fir in the town of Woodinville, Washington.

In the first week, a tree in your home will consume as much as a quart of water per day.
