## **FAMILY ACHIEVES DREAM ON NATIONAL ADOPTION DAY**

Ten-year-old Christian Jesse Perez-Ortiz was adopted on November 19th as part of Somerset County's National Adoption Day celebration, allowing enthusiastic parents Jose and Anthony Perez-Ortiz along with their new son to enjoy their first Thanksgiving holiday as a family. The adoption process was completed with the assistance of the New Jersey Department of Children and Families as well as Somerset County Surrogate Bernice "Tina" Jalloh's Office.

"How wonderful that Christian's adoption is taking place for National Adoption Day and in time for Thanksgiving dinner with his new parents," said Surrogate Jalloh. "Thanks to the efficiency and dedication of the New Jersey Department of Children and Families and my Surrogate's staff there is one less child that needs a forever home for the holidays."

The excited new parents of Christian acknowledge that fostering and adoption is a long process with many bumps, twists, and turns. However, given their experiences, they encourage others to consider both fostering and adoption.

"We are so excited to grow our family through the foster care system and adoption process with more than 120,000 U.S. children waiting for their forever home," said Jose and Anthony Perez-Ortiz. "Being foster dads can be emotionally draining, but it has also been one of the biggest blessings of our lives. It has taught us that a family isn't made from blood, but made from love. We encourage any family who can foster or adopt to do so."

In the adoption process, the Somerset County Surrogate serves as Deputy Clerk of the Superior Court, Chancery Division, and is responsible for reviewing and processing the adoption paperwork to ensure that it meets state requirements. The Surrogate's Office also maintains records of all the required adoption paperwork.

#### **NATIONAL ADOPTION DAY**

To raise awareness about the 120,000 children in the U.S. living in foster care, the Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption, Congressional Coalition on Adoption Institute, Alliance for Children's Rights, and the Children's Action Network founded National Adoption Day. Currently, there are more than 75,000 foster children adopted due to National Adoption Day events.

The first National Adoption Day was inspired by the innovative efforts of Michael Nash, a former presiding judge of Los Angeles County's Juvenile Court. Nash, in addition to the volunteer efforts of court personnel, opened the court on Saturdays in order to finalize adoptions, which reduced the backlog of one of the busiest courts in the nation.

Jenna earlier this season committed to playing at Clemson University. One of the top 25







## **SCOUT EXECUTIVE SPEAKS TO ROTARY CLUB**

Marc Andreo, the Scout Executive and CEO of the Patriot's Path Council, Boy Scouts of America spoke to the Rotary Club of Westfield on Tuesday, September 21, 2021. His topic was to update the club on the state of the local Scouting. The pandemic has decreased the scouting program somewhat, but it is still going strong, and they are planning to rebuild it to where it was before the shutdown.

Paul Harris, the man who started Rotary scout units across the US. International in 1905, was great friends with James E. West who started the Boy Scouts of America in 1910. Paul gave advice on how to spread the program throughout the US, mirroring the way Rotary clubs were spreading. Both organizations have a lot of similarities, including an ethical code, teaching leadership skills, being community based and service oriented. Rotary clubs currently charter 1,000

The Patriot's Path Council, BSA consists of 5 counties in northern New Jersey with more than 10,000 scouts and 4,000 adult volunteers. They are in the counties of Sussex, Morris, Somerset, and northern Middlesex. Union headquarters in Cedar Knolls has only 25 fulltime staff. There are two scout shops one in Cedar Knolls, and one in Mountainside.

The Council offers three Day Camps: at Watchung Reservation; Johnson Park, New Brunswick; and Camp Wheeler at Mt. Allamuchy Scout Reservation. The Council offers four overnight camping opportunities: Winnebago Scout Reservation in Rockaway, NJ; Mt. Allamuchy in Byram Township; Sabattis Adventure Camp in Long Lake NY, and the four national high adventure bases: The Summit in West Virginia; Northern Tier in Minnesota, Sea Base in the Florida Keys, and Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico.

Recent changes to the Scouts include welcoming girls to the Cub Scout and the legacy Boy Scout programs three years ago. The purpose was to include entire families in the activities. To accommodate this change, the "Boy Scout" program for ages 5th grade through age 18 was renamed the "Scouts BSA". The name of the parent organization remains the Boy Scouts of America. The Cub Scout program is for children from K through 5th grade; Scouts BSA is for children 5th grade through age 18. Other programs have been coed for many decades, including Explorers - who explore career opportunities, Venture Crews - who go on high adventure trips, Sea Scouts who learn mariner skills, and a relatively new program -STEM- in which students explore science related careers. These last four programs welcome boys and girls from ages 14 to 21.

Cub Scout Dens may be all boy and all girl, or coed. Scouts BSA Troops are either all girl or all boy. This year there are 250,000 young women in the scouts, and 1,000 girls were the first graduating class of female Eagle Scouts. Only 4% of all scouts ever achieve the rank of Eagle, making it a mark of distinction.


The residents of Westfield are enthusiastic supporters of Scouting. There are 12 units: 7 Cub Scout Packs and 5 Scout Troops, with nearly 500 youth, which is double the national average. Last year the Patriots' Path Council recognized 315 Eagle Scouts and Scouts collectively earned more than 6,200 merit badges. The Rotary Club of Westfield has been a long time supporter of the Scouts. Several members are Eagle Scouts, and many of the children of Rotarians are in the Scouting program, and a number have earned the rank of Eagle. The club likes to support Eagle Service projects financially.

Scout Executive Marc Andreo asked the Rotarians to help spread the word about local Scouting. With units and camps open again, they are seeking more youth to join the local programs. Please visit beascout.org to locate a unit near you!

## DIGITAL OFFERINGS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES AT YOUR LIBRARY

March is National Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month, during which the country aims "to help raise awareness about the inclusion of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, in all areas of community life." In order to reach this community, the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) continues to enhance their services and programs to better serve persons with disabilities.

"SCLSNJ strives to foster a sense of safety, connection, and belonging in our libraries," said Nanette Peterson, branch manager. "We hope to remove barriers to our materials and services that impact utilization while offering people with impairments more independence, and control."

According to the New Jersey Department of Human Services, Division of Developmental Disabilities, over 1,200 adults in Somerset County are eligible for their services.

"In response to the state's continued initiative to move individuals from its developmental centers into the community, more adults with developmental disabilities are living in the community every day," said Jennifer Sulligan, civic services supervisor. "At SCLSNJ, we are committed to addressing the needs of this shifting demographic by striving to improve the accessibility of our spaces, resources, and services."

Throughout the month of March and beyond, the Library System will offer a series of virtual programs that foster the needs of adults and children with disabilities. The programs include a disability awareness panel discussion that will help attendees learn about local resources and support service available; an information session that helps navigate college and career resources; and an engaging, all ages and abilities music, bubble, and comedy show.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has certainly presented many challenges in reaching individuals with developmental disabilities, and our staff is aware of just how isolating

quarantine has been for this population," said Lynn Mazur, youth services supervisor. "We are so delighted to be able to offer programs through a virtual platform, and we are excited about connecting with our patrons online."

She continued, "While all of SCLSNJ's programs are open to the public, programs such as the upcoming music, bubble, and comedy show with Matt Mazur (no relation to Library employee) are specifically designed to create library experiences that are especially welcoming to individuals on the autism spectrum or with other intellectual or developmental disabilities."

The music, bubble, and comedy show was designed by Matt Mazur, who created Turtle Dance Music and AutismFriendlyShows.com, to "help kids come out of their shells."

"Over the last decade I have had the pleasure of working with 10s of 1000s of children, teens, and adults with autism, including my brother-in-law and co-author, Tim Shaw (whose book Scrak's Big Adventure we published, illustrated and co-wrote together)," said Mazur. "[At Turtle Dance Music] we have been working hard to translate our live/in-person sensory-friendly music experience to the virtual world. Live streaming is connecting more parents and new parents who might not have used the Library System before to how incredible the Library System is."


