THREE FAMILIES MADE OFFICIAL ON ADOPTION DAY

Multi-town parade includes superheroes, gift baskets and more

CASA of Union County


The frosty morning of Nov. 19 may have been any other Friday for many, but for three Union County foster youth in Rahway, Roselle and Roselle Park, all under age three, their lives changed forever, as Union County Superior Court Judge Lara DiFabrizio granted each the consistency and stability deserved by all children, finalizing their adoptions and ending their time in the child welfare system. Each family had their own CASA volunteer working the case.

The annual event is held the Saturday before Thanksgiving and courts nationwide often celebrate National Adoption Day the business day before, or even open on Saturday, to hold adoption hearings. Here in Union County, all hearings were performed via Zoom due to Covid-19, and Judge DiFabrizio made official what each child likely already felt: they were finally home.

Despite the virtual component, those involved ensured the excitement was palpable. Upon completion of each adoption, the homes were visited by a caravan of fire trucks, police cars, court staff, law guardians and other case stakeholders, CASA of Union County staff and two of its interns suited up as Captain America and Mr. Incredible, and the bear mascot from Kenilworth's David Brearley Middle and High School. All cheered for the family, where each took their first official photo together, and the children spent time with the superheroes and school mascot.

Families received a hot breakfast donated by Urban Griddle in Elizabeth; a flower bouquet provided by Jane Phillips who, until her recent retirement, headed the Adoption Day Committee for the judiciary; and a gift basket from CASA of Union County made possible by collections of board and card games, puzzles and movie night fixings from the Kenilworth school and Summit's Oak Knoll School of the Holy Child. The latter collection was spearheaded by Desiree Mitchell, daughter of CASA volunteer Hope Mitchell, and included fleece blankets made with classmates. In addition, each child and all siblings received their own superhero dress-up costume and books

hand selected by the Phi Eta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha. Each family received a WalMart gift card funded by the Union County Bar Association. Costumes for CASA's interns were loaned by generous members of the Facebook Buy Nothing Group in Cranford and Garwood.

Today, more than 120,000 youth nationwide need a permanent home, with an average wait in foster care of four years. Each year, 23,000 youth age out of the system without a family or safety net in place. 

For the Westfield Historical Society's First Wednesday Luncheon series in February, guests are welcome to the in-person luncheon at Ferraro's Restaurant on Wednesday, February 2, 2022 at 11:45 a.m. Joel Farkas will present a program on "The Pilgrims and the Mayflower—from Sea to Shining Sea".

An expert on our founding fathers and mothers, Joel Farkas will weave the tale of why and how the Pilgrims set sail on the Mayflower and its legacy. Beginning with the Ancient Greeks through a history of explorers, he will connect the voyage of the Mayflower to the wives of Henry VIII. Farkas' talk proves to be a

WESTFIELD STUDENTS PAY TRIBUTE TO OUR NATION'S VETERANS

Whether writing letters and handmade cards, reading books about patriotism and heroes, holding assemblies, or learning how Veterans Day was established, students in the Westfield Public Schools paid tribute on November 11th to the nation's men and women in uniform, past and present, to thank them for their service and sacrifice.

Seventh graders in Brian Vieth's social studies class at Roosevelt Intermediate School utilized visual literacy skills to conduct a historical analysis of a painting by Childe Hassam entitled, "Allies Day, May 1917", which depicts New York City's 5th Avenue decorated with the flags of the United States, Britain, and France one month after the U.S. had officially entered the First World War. In the classroom next door, eighth graders wrote letters to veterans and current members of the armed forces while teacher, Kira Brady, reviewed the history of Veterans Day, formerly known as Armistice Day, to mark the end of World War I.

"If you know someone in your life who is a veteran, remember to thank them for their service," Brady told her students.

Organized by vocal music instructor, Kenneth Horn, and emceed by fellow vocal music instructor, Stephen Markowski, an assembly at Edison Intermediate School included the Blaustein and Flynn Martin, members of Scout Troops 72/772, patriotic medleys by the eighth grade band and chorus, and a video presentation honoring family members of Edison staff who are veterans and active members of the military.

Keynote speaker and EIS social studies teacher, Robert Maver, who served in the U.S. Army from 1996–1999 and in the New Jersey National Guard from 1999-2004, talked about his military service in Bosnia. He spoke about educating local children there to stay away from landmines as well as a young girl who, when offered a gift as part of a U.S. holiday outreach, asked for chalk and school supplies. He encouraged students gathered for the assembly to never "pass up an opportunity to talk to a family member about his or her service."

Students at Franklin wore t-shirts representing the Six Pillars of Character (Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, and Citizenship) while collecting candy and writing handmade cards for U.S. troops. Many listened to a video recording of "The Impossible Patriotism Project" by Linda Skeers, narrated by several Franklin educators.

There were other educational and heartfelt commemorations across the district, as teachers read books and led discussions on the importance of Veterans Day. Jefferson's first graders created



A fifth-grade science unit on space took on special significance in fall of 2021 as fifth graders at Wilson Elementary School in Westfield, NJ wrote letters to a famous Wilson alumnus as part of the unit.

Billionaire and entrepreneur, Jared Isaacman, orbited the Earth in September 2021 as part of the all-civilian crew of the SpaceX Crew Dragon capsule dubbed Resilience. In a space.com article, Isaacman recalls enjoying picture books of the Space Shuttle as a student at Wilson, telling his kindergarten teacher that he would go into space someday.

"He walked these hallways," Wilson fifth grade teacher, Coral Venturino, told her students as they prepared in November 2021 to write letters to Isaacman. "He lived in an ordinary town but went on to do extraordinary things."

The Wilson fifth grade team of Venturino, Katherine Brown, and Alexander Schmidt included Isaacman's trip into space as part of the traditional science unit, with students writing fictional dispatches from the moon and brainstorming ideas of how Isaacman has inspired them. The fifth graders illustrated cards and wrote letters with questions about space for

Isaacman.

The classes also created a bulletin board titled "Our Future is Limitless"

"The bulletin board title is the idea for the letters. Basically, Jared had big dreams," said Venturino. "We are not only allowed to have 'out of this world' aspirations, but we are also encouraged to have them. We are inspired by those who shoot for the stars and make it happen like Jared Isaacman, who most certainly stood right where we stand in our hall at Wilson School. Our future is truly limitless."


