The Gateway Family YMCA was awarded a \$50,000 grant from the J.C. Kellogg Foundation Fund to assist the YMCA in serving homeless and housing insecure residents through Emergency, Transitional and Supportive Housing Programs during this global pandemic.

This grant assists us in helping some of the families and communities feeling the greatest strain under the COVID-19 health emergency," stated Krystal R. Canady, CEO. "In 2020, our Y served 755 unduplicated men, women, seniors and children through YMCA housing programs."

The Gateway Family YMCA has served the local community for over 120 years, providing housing and social services for over 300 individuals, families and veterans each evening. Through residential housing programs in Elizabeth and Plainfield, as well as a supportive housing program throughout Union County, the Y provides emergency, transitional and affordable permanent housing opportunities along with wraparound social services focusing on employment preparation, life skills and case management. On average, 95% of residents make significant progress on their Individualized Service Plans, and 70% transition to permanent housing within 12-48 months.

"The reality of the COVID-19 pandemic meant our residents lost jobs, became food

insecure and struggled to access mainstream resources in a world that turned remote overnight. We have seen an increased need for essential housing and social services during this global health crisis," said Melynda A. Mileski, EVP/COO, The Gateway Family YMCA. "We provide support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for the most vulnerable individuals, families and veterans in our community. Extra precautions and facility improvements have been taken in our housing buildings for the protection of our residents and staff."

The Gateway Family YMCA's housing programs are open to all residents of Union County regardless of age, race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, physical ability, primary language, or veteran status. As one of more than 25 agencies collaborating in Union County's Continuum of Care unit, The Gateway Family YMCA works with other partner agencies to end homelessness and prevent a return to homelessness in Union County, NJ.







#### **AUTISM FOUNDATION DISTRIBUTES GRANTS**

The Drive for Autism Foundation is pleased to announce the distribution of \$42,500 in the form of nine grants to school-based programs providing education and training to individuals with autism spectrum disorders. 2021 was a rebound year for the foundation and they are pleased with the support they received this year. The foundation can't thank their participants, sponsors, and supporters enough! They are a special group of people and the foundation is blessed that they support their mission and foundation.

The Drive for Autism foundation held its 20th annual Golf Event in 2020 with 122 participants, as well as several other smaller fund-raising events throughout the year. The Drive for Autism Golf Outing, which has been held since 2002, has raised and distributed \$819,000 to local school programs. Grant recipients use money to fund a multitude of items including Health and Fitness Programs, Social Skills Programs, assessment tools, educational curriculum and teacher training, a van for community trips and transportation to job training centers, laptop computers, computer touch screens, SMART Boards, iPads, video projectors, as well as educational toys and games. The foundation aims to fund items that are not included in the programs' regular budget so it makes it extra special that they can help provide funding for items on different schools' "wish lists".

#### **GRIEF FACILITATOR VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT**

#### Imagine, A Center For Coping With Loss

Recent studies have found that more than 140,000 children nationwide lost a primary caregiver due to COVID-19, driving a 15% increase in orphaned children. However, these numbers don't include children who lost a parent or primary caregiver due to other causes. The need for grief support programs for children has never been greater.

Imagine offers free peer support groups for children ages 3–18 who have experienced the death of a parent, sibling, or close family member. Groups are also available for young adults ages 18–30, as well as for the parents and guardians of the children in the program. Groups for Spanish speaking bereaved adults are also available. Currently, all groups are being held virtually, though we hope to transition some groups to in-person as soon as it feels safe to do so.



Imagine's support groups are only possible because of our amazing team of volunteers who facilitate the groups. Imagine currently has families waiting to join our support groups. We're unable to offer them support at this time because we don't have enough volunteers to begin another Night of Support. We need your help!

Imagine's volunteer facilitators come from all walks of life and no special background is required other than a willingness to listen, a heart inclined to serve, and the ability to be with children and adults in grief without trying to fix, solve, or give advice. No prior experience is necessary. Volunteers must be 18 years or older.

Bilingual (Spanish speaking) volunteers are needed as well. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving and help create a space where participants can share tears and embrace the joys of life.

We are hoping to fill our upcoming training with lots of wonderful new volunteers! We're planning to offer a virtual facilitator training that will meet Friday, February 25th from 6 p.m. – 9 p.m., Saturday and Sunday, February 26-27 from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. each day and Monday, February 28th from 6 p.m. – 9 p.m. Participants are required to attend the entire training from Friday to Monday. All UCPAC patrons 12 and over must show proof of either full vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours of entry. Negative test results are not required for patrons under 12 years of age. All patrons are required to wear masks at all times while in the theatre, except while actively eating or drinking. Masks are not required for patrons under 2 years of age.

#### **BLOOD DONATIONS ARE CRITICALLY NEEDED**

The American Red Cross is facing a national blood crisis – its worst blood shortage in more than a decade. Dangerously low blood supply levels are posing a concerning risk to patient care and forcing doctors to make difficult decisions about who receives blood transfusions and who will need to wait until more products become available.

Blood and platelet donations are critically needed to help prevent further delays in vital medical treatments, and donors of all blood types – especially type O – are urged to donate.

In recent weeks, the Red Cross had less than a one-day supply of critical blood types and has had to limit blood product distributions to hospitals. At times, as much as one-quarter of hospital blood needs are not being met.

The Red Cross continues to confront relentless challenges due to COVID-19, including about a 10% overall decline in the number of people donating blood as well as ongoing blood drive cancellations and staffing limitations. Additionally, the pandemic has contributed to a 62% drop in blood drives at schools and colleges.

"Winter weather across the country and the recent surge of COVID-19 cases are compounding the already-dire situation facing the blood supply," said Dr. Baia Lasky, medical director for the Red Cross. "Please, if you are eligible, make an appointment to give blood or platelets in the days and weeks ahead to ensure no patient is forced to wait for critical care."

The Red Cross urges donors to support patient care by making an appointment to give blood or platelets now for the weeks ahead. To schedule an appointment, use the Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org or call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767).

Each Red Cross blood drive and donation center follows the highest standards of safety and infection control, and additional precautions – including face masks for donors and staff, regardless of vaccination status – have been implemented to help protect the health of all those in attendance. Donors are asked to schedule




To donate blood, individuals need to bring a blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification that are required at checkin. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also must meet certain height and weight requirements.


#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

## TEACHER TAKES PART IN HOLOCAUST EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Jewish Foundation for the Righteous (JFR) has selected 23 middle and high school teachers and Holocaust center staff from six states to participate in its 2022 Advanced Seminar, an intensive two-day academic program that explores a number topics addressing the history of the Holocaust. The seminar, made possible through a grant from the Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany (Claims Conference), took place virtually January 15 and 16, 2022.

Deborah Maller from Rahway High School took part in the seminar.

Other participants hailed from Alabama, Florida, New Jersey, Georgia, South Carolina and Texas

The Advanced Seminar is an intensive graduate-level program in which a select group of educators who are already well versed in Holocaust history are given the opportunity to study more focused topics relating to the Holocaust from world renowned lecturers. Speakers included Professor Lawrence R Douglas from Amherst College; Professor Avinoam J. Patt from the University of Connecticut; Professor Edward B. Westermann from Texas A&M University; and United States Holocaust Memorial Museum Deputy Director for International Affairs Robert Williams.

The program is open to JFR Alfred Lerner Fellows, middle and high school educators who have already attended the JFR Summer Institute for Teachers which is typically held at Columbia University. Due to the pandemic, recent seminars have been held virtually. Both programs are meant for educators who teach the Holocaust either in classrooms or through Holocaust Centers and have taught at least five years and are at least five years from retirement.

"Each of these educators have already distinguished themselves through their tremendous commitment to teaching the Holocaust in their schools and towards furthering their own education in the environment of antisemitism which led to the Holocaust," said JFR Executive Vice President Stanlee Stahl. "By attending this intensive, graduate level program, they will gain an even greater understanding of the history of the Holocaust, which will increase their effectiveness in the classroom and enable them to mentor other colleagues who teach the subject."

The JFR continues its work of providing monthly financial assistance to more than 150 aged and needy Righteous Gentiles, living in 14 countries. Since its founding, the JFR has provided more than \$42 million to aged and needy rescuers – helping to repay a debt of gratitude on behalf of the Jewish people to these noble men and women. Its Holocaust teacher education program has become a standard for teaching the history of the Holocaust and educating teachers and students about the significance of the Righteous as moral and ethical exemplars. #### **CARING FOR FRESH CUT ROSES**

"A rose by any other name would smell as sweet"

William Shakespeare (Romeo and Juliet)

In literature and poetry for centuries, Roses are perhaps the most beloved flower in the world. Roses have been a symbol of love and passion since Roman times.

Roses are among the oldest of cultivated flowers, with the first known to have grown in Asian gardens 5,000 years ago.

On Valentine's Day roses are in incredible demand. Of course, this increases the cost at this time of year. To get the most out of your investment you can follow a few basic steps.

The more water that reaches the flower, the longer it will last. To ensure this process proper cutting is essential. Roses need a clean cut on an angle to open the stem and absorb water. A blade or sharp knife is a good tool for this. Scissors or pruning shears unfortunately close the stem and are therefore not a good choice, blocking the water from entering the rose.

Keep your fresh roses out of the sun. Direct sunlight will dehydrate the flower and lessen its life span.

After a few days or when your flowers begin to droop it is time to freshen them up. Remove the flowers and clean the vase, then refill with fresh water. Give your roses a fresh 'clean' cut as described above and put them in the vase. This will give your roses a few more days of beauty.

Flower crystals do work so I add them to all flower arrangements. Flower shops and even super markets supply crystals free of charge, so remember to ask for it. If you don't have flower crystals a regular lemon lime soda (not diet) will also do the trick. (P. Allen Smith)

#### **DRYING YOUR ROSES**

You can easily dry roses and enjoy them all winter long. Do this while the roses are still fresh, before the flowers droop or the petals drop off. Using a hanger and twist ties, simply hang the roses up-side-down, leaving space between them for good air circulation. Hang them in a dry room out of direct sunlight, which will help preserve color. Leave them undisturbed until they are fully dried, approximately two or three weeks. When dried they are ready for display.

#### **MEANING OF ROSES BY COLOR**

A red rose is an unmistakable expression of love. Red roses convey deep emotions - be it love, longing or desire. Red Roses can also be used to convey respect, admiration or devotion. A deep red rose can be used to convey heartfelt regret and sorrow. The number of red roses has special romantic meanings associated with them. Two red roses are the most popular of all which conveys "Be mine" and "I love you".

White Roses: White is the color of purity, chastity and innocence. White flowers are generally associated with new beginnings and make an ideal accompaniment to a first-time bride walking down the aisle. White flowers can

be used to convey sympathy or humility. They also are indicative of spirituality. Hence, white roses also follow suit.

**Yellow Roses**: Yellow roses are an expression of exuberance. Yellow roses evoke sunny feelings of joy, warmth and welcome. They are symbols of friendship and caring. The yellow rose, like the other roses, does not carry an undertone of romance. It indicates purely platonic emotions.

**Pink Roses**: There are a lot of variations of the pink rose. Over all, pink roses are used to convey gentle emotions such as admiration, joy and gratitude. Light pink rose blooms are indicative of sweetness and innocence. Deep pink rose blooms convey deep gratitude and appreciation. Pink roses also connote elegance and grace.

Lavender Roses: A Lavender rose like its color conveys enchantment. It also expresses "love at first sight". Darker shades of lavender roses (close to purple) convey a sense of regal majesty and splendor. These roses are used to express fascination and adoration.

**Mixed Roses**: By mixing rose blooms of different colors purposefully, you can create a bouquet of emotions. For example, a bouquet of red and white roses would mean I love you intensely and my intentions are honorable. A random mix of roses would convey mixed feelings or send a message: "I don't know what my feelings are yet but I sure do like you enough to send you roses."

A dozen red roses symbolizes love, passion and desire. A single red rose is an elegant way to say "I Love You."

#### 171 YEAR HISTORY OF RAHWAY SAVINGS (RSI) NEARS AN END

When the news broke this past December that RSI Bank had signed a merger agreement with Columbia Bank, a collective gasp of surprise and dismay could be felt throughout the city. For many Rahway residents and for patrons from surrounding communities, RSI/Rahway Savings was the only bank they ever knew. It was the bank where they opened their first savings account, where they kept a Christmas Club, where they got a mortgage for their home. The downtown area would change many times over the decades, yet the bank remained a constant and steady institution that served generations. The prospect of losing RSI was akin to losing a long-time, trusted friend.

Incorporated on February 19, 1851, Rahway Savings was the town's second bank preceded only by the Farmers and Mechanics Bank which opened in 1828. The original home of Rahway Savings was a tiny, narrow, two-story structure squeezed between two retail establishments on Main Street opposite Cherry Street. The bank's first president was William C. Squier who held the position for over 50 years, a testament to the stability of the Institution. The business thrived over the next sixteen years and in 1867 the bank moved into a new three-story building on Main Street at the corner of Monroe. The bank occupied the entire first floor with city hall offices and courtroom chambers on the second and third floors. There was so much activity in the building that the location became known as "Savings Bank Corner." By the turn of the century Rahway Savings had earned the reputation as the "Bank of Strength" and was regarded as one of the strongest and most successfully managed savings banks in the state. Rahway's downtown was changing, however, and by the 1920s Irving Street, with three banks located between the railroad elevation and Milton Avenue, had replaced Main Street as the financial district of the city. To keep up with the changing times and to expand their services, Rahway Savings bought property on Irving Street and built a new home next to St. Paul's Church. The handsome neo- classical styled bank, which was designed by Rahway architect Seymour Williams, opened on Saturday, December 28, 1928.

Business at the new location continued to prosper and over the next several decades the bank would become known as the "Friendly and Progressive Bank." By the 1950s more changes in the banking business were occurring and bank officials were again faced with the need to find larger quarters to accommodate expanding operations and offerings. In 1959 a building committee was appointed to recommend improvements to the facility and the advisability of purchasing additional property. Many suggestions were proposed, but no major changes in the building would take place until August 14, 1971 when ground was broken for an addition that would be almost three times as large as the original structure. The addition would include nine teller windows, more office space, and a three car, covered drive-thru area.

When designing the addition, architects were faced with the challenge of creating a façade that would combine the old and the new as it was imperative to bank officials that the large, modern addition would blend in with the smaller original building. Through the use of brown bricks, enhanced by white Danby marble


imported from quarries in Vermont, and the replication of vertical columns and window treatment, the challenge was beautifully and skillfully met.

In 1988 a second major addition was made which enlarged the lobby space, improved the design of the teller area, added more offices and a conference room on the second floor, and enlarged the drive-thru area. The final piece of the RSI building was added in 2011 when the Mortgage Department was constructed on the corner of Irving and Broad Street. The handsome beauty of the entire complex was maintained by using the same materials on each addition, thus keeping the unified appearance.


In the long history of the bank there have only been eight presidents, each with the same philosophy of looking to the future in order to share in the growth of the city and to afford better services to their depositors. Even as RSI was preparing its transition, it was done with the best interests of the community and its customers in mind. To this end, the bank will be establishing and funding a new charitable foundation in the amount of five million dollars to continue to support the many charitable and civic organizations that serve the communities. David R. Taylor, President and Chief Executive Officer of RSI, recently commented in part, "The merger will provide an opportunity for our customers to join a larger banking network with expanded products and services." Although all things must come to an end, it will feel strange transacting business in a new bank, and it will take a long time before the 'Friendly, Progressive Bank," the "Bank of Strength," is forgotten. It will be like losing a friend.





The NAMI Family-to-Family Education Course will be offered by the Union County Chapter of NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness). The course will be starting on Thursday evening, March 3, 2022 and meet each Thursday over a consecutive 8-week period. It is free-ofcharge, with all necessary materials furnished at no cost.

The course is offered specifically to the parents, siblings, spouses, teen-age and adult children, and significant others of individuals with severe and persistent mental illness. The program is not appropriate for individuals who, themselves, suffer from one of the major mental disorders. The course is taught by NAMI members who have completed intensive training.

Curriculum topics include schizophrenia, bipolar disorder (manic depression), clinical depression, panic disorder, obsessive-compulsive disorder etc., the clinical treatment of these illnesses and how caregivers can learn to cope more effectively.
