
The newspaper's goal is to be a positive influence on the economic development and overall well-being of the town. Florham Park Press exists to share community service news and the good things that are happening in the community.

The Florham Park School District is pleased to announce that the District will again be operating its Integrated Preschool Program for the 2022-2023 school year. We offer both a full day and a half day program. We are conducting lotteries for both programs. We have several openings for the fall and look forward to welcoming new faces to our classrooms.

Since demand for this excellent early childhood program often outweighs the number of available seats, entrance into the program is via a lottery. The application is available at the link below and all applications are due by Friday, March 11, 2022. The eligibility drawing will be held on Monday, March 14, 2022. Families of students selected for seats will be notified within a week of the drawing. Those families who were not selected for open seats will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their application was drawn in the lottery and will be notified on a rolling basis as seats become available. Changes certainly do occur and families on the waitlist will be notified on a rolling basis as seats become available.

SPOTLIGHT ON FLORHAM PARK POLICE LIEUTENANT BRIAN FORD

The New Jersey Veterans Network (NJVN) are a group of veterans and volunteers dedicated to helping our veterans and their families live better lives.

In 2016 the Operation Rebound Racing team (ORRT) was created under the umbrella of NJVN and organized its first charity event. The ORRT is a racing team that uses physical fitness and sporting events to help empower and give a purpose to our disabled veterans and first responders. The team decided to do a 200-mile bicycle ride in 22 hours, in honor of victims from the 9-11 World Trade Center terrorist attack. Team member Brian Ford, a Florham Park Police Lieutenant, helped organize the event and participated in it as well. After this event, Lt Ford began to assist the team with extreme events that

helped bring awareness to both veteran and first responder suicide and PTSD. Lt Ford is extremely active with the team and has competed in numerous ultra and long distance events.

A few years later Lt Ford became a member of the New Jersey Veterans Network, a mobile outreach team that aggressively seeks out veterans and their families in need. Lt Ford became a team board member and has helped with various projects and events.

Recently, Lt Ford and the Florham Park PBA spearheaded a business attire and suit drive. All the clothing will be used to help our veterans with interviews and future employment.

Both the ORRT and NJVN are extremely fortunate to have such a dedicated and committed individual on the team.


The Florham Park Public Library was recently awarded a grant administered by the New Jersey State Library and Institute of Museum and Library Services to establish itself as a node in a statewide network of information centers that provide high-quality, standardized, digital literacy instruction and one-on-one help to anyone who needs it. The program is optimal for job seekers, senior citizens, people re-entering the workforce after a hiatus, those pursuing a GED, and individuals who wish to improve their technology skills or workforce readiness.

As a part of the program, the Florham Park Public Library is offering 1-on-1 technology help by appointment on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. During 1-on-1 help, a trained and qualified Digital Literacy Instructor can help people to troubleshoot a personal device, navigate an online job application, learn how to accomplish specific tasks online or with a device, or connect with relevant online or educational resources, among many other requests. We can also proctor exams.

The Library is also offering weekly technology instruction classes covering a variety of practical topics. Upcoming classes include: Getting Started with LinkedIn, Microsoft Word 101, Google Docs 101, Internet Basics, Building a Resume, and Writing Your Cover Letter. 

VOLUNTEER LISTENING AND SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING

Caring Contact

Have you ever been told you are a good listener? Do you have a yearning to really make a difference? Caring Contact will be offering its 100th volunteer listening training, which will begin March 22nd through June 14th. Training will run once a week on Tuesday nights from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. and will take place virtually as well as in person.

Participants receive 54 of hours comprehensive training by nationally certified instructors in Active Listening and Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training. Volunteers develop the ability to listen actively, assess the needs of someone in crisis, and provide empathy as well as support to keep someone safe.

"This training and volunteering opportunity is

ideal for retirees, empty-nesters, and stay-athome parents," said Mary Claire Givelber, Caring Contact's Executive Director. "Many of our listeners were looking for something meaningful to do after they retired, or their children left home. They find that volunteering at Caring Contact not only gives them something to do with their new-found freedom, but also gives them a sense of reward when they help someone in crisis. Full-time professionals that also participate find flexible volunteer hours that work well with their work obligations."

Following training, new volunteer listeners are supported by seasoned listeners during 24-hours of internship before they take calls on their own. Even once a volunteer is a certified listener, the hotline provides a range of support and training

opportunities to allow them to keep honing their skills.

MATT PLATKIN TO SERVE AS NJ ATTORNEY GENERAL

TRENTON - Governor Phil Murphy nominated Matt Platkin to be the Attorney General of New Jersey on Feb. 3, 2022,. Platkin served as Chief Counsel to the Governor from January 2018 to October 2020. His nomination will now go to the Senate for confirmation. Platkin will assume the role of Acting Attorney General on Monday, February 14, 2022.

"It is my honor and pleasure to nominate Matt Platkin to serve as the 62nd Attorney General of the State of New Jersey," said Governor Murphy. "As I look toward the upcoming four years and the challenges that lay ahead, I know that as Attorney General, Matt will stand up for our New Jersey values and keep the office, and our state, moving forward. Matt will continue the strong record of the Attorney General's Office's during my first term and I look forward to working with him in this new role."

"I am honored and humbled to serve as New Jersey's next Attorney General," said Matt Platkin, incoming Attorney General. "I commit to work tirelessly, alongside the 7,700 outstanding public servants who make up the Department of Law and Public Safety, to protect and defend the rights of all nine million people who call our state home. I thank Governor Murphy for the trust and confidence he has placed in me, and I am excited to get to work."

Platkin was born and raised in New Jersey, growing up in both Florham Park and Morristown, and graduated from Madison High School. He received his Bachelor of Arts from

Stanford University, and his Juris Doctor from Stanford Law School, where he was an editor of the Stanford Law Review. Platkin began his policy career at the Brookings Institution in Washington D.C., advising members of Congress on job growth and economic recovery following the 2008 financial crisis. Following graduation from law school, Platkin practiced law at Debevoise & Plimpton in New York City. From May 2016 to November 2017, Platkin served as Policy Director for Murphy for Governor.

In January 2018, Platkin was named Chief Counsel to the Governor. As Chief Counsel, Platkin oversaw an office of over 20 attorneys that advised the Governor on all legal matters, including legislation, executive orders, and administrative regulations. Platkin also was responsible for coordinating with the Attorney General's Office on civil matters, including affirmative litigations, and oversaw judicial and prosecutorial nominations.

As Chief Counsel, Platkin spearheaded a number of policy initiatives, including gun safety and the expansion of voting rights, and played a critical role in the negotiations of three approximately \$40 billion annual state budgets. Additionally, Platkin played a critical role in guiding New Jersey through the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic, overseeing the drafting of pandemic-related executive orders and workforce policy reforms for state government employees to maintain government services. He

also contributed to the State's successful defense of pandemic-related actions in dozens of litigations in state and federal court.

Platkin served as Special Counsel to U.S. Senator Cory Booker during the first impeachment trial of President Donald J. Trump. He is currently a partner at Lowenstein Sandler in the White Collar Criminal Defense and Business Litigation practice groups. He is admitted to the bar in New Jersey and New York.

Platkin resides in Montclair with his wife Sophia and their son, Robert.




