

LOCAL MASTERS SWIMMERS CELEBRATE 18TH ANNIVERSARY

Madison Area Masters Swimmers

A group of New Jersey Masters Swimmers from Madison and surrounding towns have had the privilege of swimming together for many years at Drew University, the Madison YMCA, Madison Community Pool, and the Summit YMCA.

The COVID-19 pandemic limited the group's ability to swim together. Recently, however, upon the group's 18thanniversary, the Masters Yardstick Swimmers held its awards breakfast online—with a strong turnout. To celebrate the group's history, strong personal relationships, and commitment to swimming, members Bob Nissen, Joe Donohue, and Richard Clew (with help from historian Barbara Rushman) created a slide show of major milestones.

An entertaining review of swimmers' monthly comments from the comment box on their website followed the slide show. Swimmers highlighted the recent opening of the new Walker D. Kirby Aquatics Center in the Madison YMCA.

The online event culminated with their Annual Awards.

Red Stars went to swimmers Deborah Fennelly of Morristown, Lynda Przedpelski of Summit, Jennifer Bauman of Parsippany, and Bob Franks of Chatham—all having achieved at least one 100,000-yard month during the year. Jim Sullivan of Morristown was named Bold Performer of the Year for improved performance, exceptional effort, and a special commitment to the swimming program. The top swimmer for the last half of the year was Lynda Przedpelski, achieving 577,983 yards, or 328 miles during the six-month period. Lynda was awarded the Doug Clark Championship Yardstick, named in memory of a former Yardstick Swimmer.

All attendees enjoyed the event and were happy to connect online with swimming friends once again.



Friends of the Madison Public Library

Have gray and gloomy skies set you thinking about how to better spend time indoors? Consider enrolling in the three virtual minicourses organized by the Friends of the Madison Public Library. These non-credit courses are for the general public with no prerequisites or examinations.

Romanesque Art and Architecture

2 hours, 5 Thursday afternoons, 1:30-3:30 p.m. on March 3, (skip 10), 17, 24, 31; April 7, 2022

With Dr. Rita Keane, Professor of Art History, Drew University. The term Romanesque describes art and architecture produced in medieval western Europe from the tenth to the twelfth centuries. In this 5-week course we will consider the major monuments of Romanesque art in western Europe, such as the art and architecture of pilgrimage, monastic art including portal and cloister sculpture, the enamels of Limoges, and the innovations of Cistercian architecture. The course concludes with the study of the monuments produced for William the Conqueror.

Dr. Rita Keane is Professor of Art History at Drew University. She earned an M.A. in art history from Williams College, and a Ph.D. in art history from the University of California, Santa Barbara. At Drew she teaches medieval, Islamic, and classical art. A specialist in medieval art, her research is on the material culture of the fourteenth century in France, with particular focus on manuscript painting, ideology, and gender studies. She recently wrote a book on the testament of the medieval queen, Blanche of Navarre.

Environmental Psychology

2 hours, 5 Tuesday afternoons 1:30-3:30 p.m. on March 22, 29; April 5, 12, 19, 2022

With Dr. Graham Cousens, Associate Professor of Psychology, Drew University

This course examines the interdependence of human behavior and the environments in which we live, work, and play. We will consider our emotional connections to the places we know and focus on the relationship between built environments and physical and mental health, discussing physical activity, environmental stress, and habitual behavior. We will examine our relationship to the natural world by considering the restorative benefits of nature, green space, and wilderness, by documenting some ecological consequences of human behavior, and by evaluating ways to promote environmentally sustainable behavior.

Dr. Graham Cousens is an Associate Professor of Psychology at Drew University. He earned a Ph.D., M.A., and B.A. in Psychology from

Rutgers University, and he conducted research in neuroscience as a post-doctoral fellow at Yale School of Medicine and at University of California, San Francisco.

War and Peace: Music of the '40s

1 ½ hours, 5 Wednesday afternoons 1:30-3:00 pm on April 6, 13, 20, 27; May 4, 2022.

With Dr. Robert Butts, Conductor, Composer, Educator, Montclair State University, Drew University and Saint Elizabeth University Of all decades of the 20th century, the 1940s seems to be the least studied. Yet, the decade that contained World War II and its aftermath, produced extraordinary musical works that are now considered standards of the concert and popular music worlds. Explore the major

transformations in music during this pivotal decade. From bebop, to star vocalists, to the meteoric rise of Leonard Bernstein, to the American sound of Aaron Copland, to Rodgers and Hammerstein and the Golden Age of Broadway—this course is bursting with great music as well as the who, what, when, where, and why behind the tunes.

Dr. Robert Butts has won acclaim as conductor, composer, and educator. He is the director of the Baroque Orchestra of NJ, now in its 26th season. He teaches at Montclair State University, the Caspersen School of Graduate Studies at Drew University, NJ Council for the Humanities, and Saint Elizabeth University. He has conducted major orchestra and opera performances throughout the US and abroad. Dr. Butts received his M.A. in Musicology from the University of Iowa with a specialty in 17th and 18th century music and a D.M.A. in conducting from the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago. He also studied conducting at Julliard with Maestro La Selva.

The tuition for one course is \$95.00. Each additional course is \$65.00. Couples in the same household pay only one tuition to use one screen. All proceeds support the Madison Public Library. 
