

FOOD IS LOVE...TWO YEARS, 22,245 MEALS DELIVERED TO SENIORS BY VOLUNTÉERS IN MOUNTAINSIDE

The Mountainside Senior Buddy/Meal Borough Hall Community Room. program began on March 23, 2020 due to Covid and has continued to support the Mountainside seniors and local restaurants ever since.

Kim Moriak works closely with the participating restaurants to determine the menu for each day and shares them weekly with the seniors via email and text messages. Phone calls are made to those who are not technology savvy by a select group volunteers, led by Ellie Annis. The volunteers that call with the menu are from the Mountainside Active Retirees that meet the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month at the

The meals are on average \$12-\$14 each and are offered 3 times a week. All meals are high quality and a large portion. The seniors have the option to have them delivered or pick them up from the library. Over 30 residents have volunteered to deliver over the past 2 years. Each day averages 70 -100 meals per day.

Each restaurant has expressed how very grateful they are for the support from the local residents. This program has helped the local economy by putting over \$266,000 back in the economy. Moriak and Annis compile a

spreadsheet with each of the deliveries and locations and have a route slip that is given to each of the volunteer drivers. Moriak is reachable by the drivers with any issues and questions they may experience.


There are many benefits to this program. Seniors are in touch with other seniors checking in on them weekly, Moriak taking the opportunity to keep the lines of communication open with the seniors, and of course, the seniors receiving a warm meal. She has 75 emails that she sends out with the menu as well as the activities and events happening. It truly is a blessing on all parts.

FLINTLOCKS CELEBRATE 100TH BIRTHDAY OF MEMBER

Not many centenarians get to celebrate their 100th birthday surrounded by friends. On Thursday, February 17, the Flintlocks celebrated Fanwood resident Joe Schott's 100th birthday. Joe has been active in this volunteer group for 33 years since retiring from Bells Labs. He recruited many of his friends to join, and even a few relatives. Joe has a wry sense of humor, so they presented him with a parking plaque which reads: "Reserved Parking Only for Flintlocks Over 100 Years Old."

The Flintlocks are a group of retired scouters who devote every Thursday all year round to helping the Scout Camps. They build cabins,

make picnic tables, paint the dining hall, do sales tax, and they provide skilled labor for maintenance and build craft kits for the Scout shops. The Flintlocks represent a wide range of skills, including: two electricians, a millwright, carpenters, plumbers, diesel mechanics, police officers, heavy equipment operators, but also many professionals such as a dentist, two college professors, computer experts, financial advisors, salesmen, etc.

The most popular craft kits sold at the Cedar Knolls and Mountainside Scout Shops are the bird houses, bird feeders, benches and handy boxes. The men also volunteer at many of the Patriot Path Council activities for the scouts. Since they are a 501c3, they do not need to pay


free. The Council has 3 camps and the volunteers are important to keep things running smoothly. Many of the scouters had children or have grandchildren in the scouts. More than half of the volunteers have been awarded the Silver Beaver Award, which is the highest National Honor offered by the Boy Scouts of America. They are an outstanding group of volunteers.



JAMES WHELAN ERECTS BLUEBIRD HOUSES IN COUNTY PARKS

Eastern Bluebirds were once common in New Jersey, thriving in areas that were open and had sparse ground cover. Not to be confused with the common Blue Jay, Eastern Bluebirds have a brilliant blue plumage and a flash of brick red on their breast.

Due to the negative effects of pesticide use and habitat loss, the number of bluebirds declined dramatically from the 1930s to the 1970s. Aggression from non-native birds like House Sparrows and starlings also took a toll.

However, a survey of breeding birds for 2005-2015 showed the number of bluebirds in New Jersey to now be increasing by about 7% annually. This is due in part to the efforts of environmentalists and bird enthusiasts who have provided better habitat and nesting sites.

James Whelan, a resident of Mountainside, recently joined that effort. As a member of Boy Scout Troop 23 in Elizabeth, Jimmy is working toward earning the Eagle Scout rank. His interest in birds led him to work with the Union County Parks Department on his Eagle Scout service project requirement by constructing and installing twenty-five birdhouses in three county parks: Lenape Park in Cranford and Snyder Avenue Park and Passaic River Park in Berkeley Heights.

The birdhouses erected in Lenape Park and Passaic River Park were built to specific dimensions that favor bluebirds and discourage or prevent use by non-native birds. All of the poles on which the houses were mounted now

have metal baffles to discourage predation or entry by squirrels or raccoons. The new birdhouse in Snyder Avenue Park will be welcoming to several species of native songbirds.

Jimmy searched online for plans for a birdhouse that would be sturdy, long-lasting, attractive to songbirds, and be easy to clean out and maintain annually. He developed a list of the lumber and fasteners that he needed for the County to purchase. And he recruited other scouts, Scout leaders, family and friends to cut the wood, assemble and seal the birdhouses, erect poles, and install the birdhouses and baffles. Working with a master carpenter, Jimmy learned a lot about woodworking and project management.


