

CHECK TREES FOR Spotted Lanternfly EGG Masses

NJ Department of Agriculture

The weather is warming up, check your trees for Spotted Lanternfly (SLF) egg masses. When you find them crush them. Use an old bank card, small rolling pin or putty knife.

Citizens are advised to destroy the Spotted Lanternfly in all its forms.

WHY YOU SHOULD CARE

SLF is a serious invasive pest with a healthy appetite for our plants and it can be a significant nuisance, affecting the quality of life and enjoyment of the outdoors. The spotted lanternfly uses its piercing-sucking mouthpart to feed on sap from over 70 different plant species. It has a strong preference for economically important plants and the feeding damage significantly stresses the plants which can lead to decreased health and potentially death.

As SLF feeds, the insect excretes honeydew (a sugary substance) which can attract bees, wasps, and other insects. The honeydew also builds up and promotes the growth for sooty mold (fungi), which can cover the plant, forest understories, patio furniture, cars, and anything else found below SLF feeding.

If you see a Spotted Lanternfly, help us Stomp it Out!





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

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ELEVEN+ IS LOOKING FOR NEW NONPROFIT PARTNERS

Eleven+ is ramping up its programming significantly for the summer of 2022 after its first successful year of operation. During the summer of 2021, it piloted its diversity internship program with ten students working in seven different organizations. Scaling by a factor of ten, it plans to facilitate and fund 100 paid internships for underserved students from low-income backgrounds in 2022. To succeed, it is looking for many more nonprofit partners to host interns.

During the pilot, Eleven+ interns worked for SAGE Eldercare, the Summit Area YMCA, Charity Navigator, and several others to gain valuable skills, experiences, and professional contacts that will serve them well when they enter the full-time workforce. Partnering with Summits STAR, PEP Program, and Summit High School, as well as KIPP Newark to source talented, motivated students, it must now develop additional internship opportunities.

The Eleven+ internships are a true win-win endeavor, with the students getting meaningful paid work while the nonprofits get access to high caliber students without having to establish and fund internship programs on their own. Last July

projects and helped their hosts further their strategic agendas in a variety of roles including Communications, Development, Public Relations, Financial Analysis, Technology, Marketing, and External Affairs.

According to Shari Competiello, Chief of Staff at Family Promise, the national organization that addresses homelessness issues, the students gave both Eleven+ and its internship hosting partners a lot to be proud of. "Not only were we impressed by the caliber of the two Eleven+ interns who worked here this summer, they made meaningful contributions that will endure long past their summers with us," Competiellio said. While one of the interns, Ernange Alfonse, returned to her studies at Lycoming College, the other, Cvan Perdue, was hired on as an employee by the organization while also attending Rutgers University as a graduate student pursuing her master's degree.

"In our experience so far, the hosting organizations get as much out of the summer as the students," says Eleven+ Founder and President Andrew Walker. "It's been a really

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and August, students completed meaningful rewarding experience for all of us. And we aim to make it as easy as possible for our nonprofit partners." He explained that the expectations of each hosting organization are a low hurdle. Hosts are expected to provide a meaningful role for the student to give them a feeling of accomplishment by the end of the summer, and they are to assign a mentor to coach the students through what is likely to be their first professional work experience.

Eleven+ surveyed the intern hosts at the end of the summer and all agreed they'd like to take interns again next year. Additionally, all said they'd recommend Eleven+ to other organizations and strongly agreed that Eleven+ was easy to partner with in support of the students. Eleven+ has recently hired a part-time Program Manager, Carolyn Parelli, as an additional resource for the nonprofits and students.

Building on last summer's success, Eleven+ is now developing a Job Readiness training program for its incoming interns to better prepare them for their first day of work. "With valuable input from last year's hosts, we're pulling some guidance on effective together communication, organization, and selfrepresentation that will help our interns hit the ground running even faster", said Walker.

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

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

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
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
