



A WRITING PROGRAM FOR YOUNG AUTHORS

Warren Township Schools

Recently, a group of 14 grade five students from Angelo L. Tomaso (ALT) School in Warren Township, set a goal with their teacher, Mrs. Cheryl Plager, to write a novel. To accomplish this, the students were introduced to a program for young writers called NaNoWriMo. NaNoWriMo is designed to help students find value in their stories, become confident and proficient storytellers, and realize their creative potential to build new worlds on and off the page.

Since the onset of this program, the writing group has doubled in size. Mrs. Plager meets with her young novelists during their WIN (What I Need) period.

"Some of my fifth-grade authors are now writing their second novel and some have just started working on their first one. In November, they had one month to write a novel from start to finish. After the winter break, they were eager to keep writing," says Mrs. Plager.

"They have learned to quiet their inner editors and put on their creator crowns while working towards goals they set for themselves. They are developing main characters, supporting characters, and even villains. They are creating interesting storylines and imagining detailed and precise settings. They work independently at their own pace and complete all of the writing outside of class time. I offer support during WIN and they often support one another as well."

Mrs. Plager anticipates that by spring most of her NaNoWriMo authors will begin drafting their novels on the NaNoWriMo website, having mapped out their ideas and stories ahead of time. The students' stories are stored on the program's website and are available for download by either the author or Mrs. Plager to be shared with their classmates, friends, and families.


Mrs. Plager plans to continue to offer this program and help students achieve their creative goals with NaNoWriMo: "They are growing as authors in ways I never could have predicted and rediscovering their love of writing."



Every week throughout Black History Month, Mt. Horeb students in Mr. PJ Jones's class participated in Joyful Fridays through an interactive program from the National Museum of African American History & Culture (NMAAHC).

"The Joyful Fridays program is intended to introduce students to the concepts related to Black History and the African American experience through interactive dialogue and art projects," said Mr. Jones.

On one Friday, students tuned into a webinar led by NMAAHC educators celebrating the life of Dr. Maya Angelou and kindness. Students listened to and learned about Angelou's poetry. The lesson ended with a rainbow craft inspired by a famous Angelou quote: "Try to be a rainbow in somebody else's cloud."

Other Joyful Fridays included an introduction to Granville T. Woods, the inventor of the roller coaster, and an exploration of African-American artists Alma Thomas and McArthur Binion and their unique, creative styles.

Jones enjoys each Joyful Friday experience with his students and appreciates the educational program. "I discovered Joyful Fridays last year while our school was closed and students had to learn from home. It began as a way to engage students remotely, but we had so much fun creating self-portraits in the style of Amy Sherald, that I knew I had to revisit the program this year. Black History Month to me is an opportunity to start conversations about race in our country, something that can be uncomfortable, but is an absolute necessity."



BE AWARE AND CAUTIOUS OF RABID ANIMALS

reported in February that a raccoon recently found in Warren Township tested positive for rabies. While Health Department personnel have identified individuals and animals potentially exposed to this animal, we encourage anyone who has had direct contact with a raccoon to contact the Health Department immediately.

This incident should serve as a reminder of the importance of making sure your pets are up-todate on their vaccinations, especially rabies. In addition, we encourage pet owners to be aware of their pets' location and activities at all times in order to try to avoid preventable exposure. If your pet is exposed to a wild animal, it is very important to notify the Health Department, have the pet seen by a veterinarian, test the wild animal if it is available, and to avoid human contact with any saliva, wounds, etc., in order to prevent human exposure.

In addition, we want to remind everyone-

The Warren Township Health Department especially those with children—that while wild animals may appear cute and cuddly, they are wild and can be very dangerous. Please stay away from wild animals and keep children and pets away, too.

> The Warren Township Health Department urges residents to be aware and cautious of potential rabid animals and avoid contact with any unknown animal. Rabies, a neurological disease, is almost 100% preventable. However, rabies is nearly always fatal once symptoms have developed, so prompt action is necessary to prevent rabies.




