## EMERGENCY SQUAD REPORTS HIGHEST CALL VOLUME IN 86-YEAR HISTORY

Squad Seeks New Members to Join in the Success

In 2021, the Chatham Emergency Squad (CES) answered the call a total of 1266 times - up by nearly 50 calls over 2020. CES responded to 911 calls in the Chathams as well as mutual aid to Madison, Florham Park and Summit. CES also provided coverage to many public events like Chatham High School varsity football games, Fishawack and both Chatham Thanksgiving trots. Of those 1266 calls, 130 came in when the duty crew was already out on a call, so a scramble crew of off-duty EMT members had to be mobilized. Even more impressively, 13 of those calls were second scramble calls, putting all three of CES's ambulances in service simultaneously.

CES is an all-volunteer squad funded almost entirely by donations from the community. In reviewing the 2021 call volume, Captain Mike Lemons said, "There was certainly a rebound from the early months of Covid as the sick and injured became less reluctant to go to the hospital. Just as our members were there during the height of COVID and the challenges of 2020, they were ready for the volume challenges of 2021."

Recruiting reliable volunteers is always a challenge and many emergency response

agencies are facing alarming declines. CES remains strong but the need for new members is always an urgent priority. Training a new EMT is a serious process and CES members are expected to achieve the highest level of professionalism. New volunteers are put to meaningful work from their first day and are well supported by their crew partners as they complete initial EMT training and progress toward full membership. All training, uniform and equipment expenses are paid by CES.

CES members come in all life stages from students to working professionals to retired community members and everyone in between! Previous medical training is not required to join CES, only the desire to serve the community in this special way.

Finnegan (Smith), 54, of Stirling, NJ, gathered together to form the "Linda's Lovees" 5K team to honor her memory and show their support for NJ Sharing Network's life-saving mission. Linda, who passed away in 2016, was an organ and tissue donor who saved and enhanced the lives of many others. Linda taught Physical Education at St. Vincent de Paul School in Stirling and was proud to be ACE Gold Certified for Group Aerobic Instruction. She founded Linda's Just Stay Fit and developed the program "Girl Power" for the YMCA.

Members of "Linda's Lovees" offered the following message during the 5K Celebration of Life:

Linda, on her late mother's birthday, donated

both her lungs, both kidneys, her liver, and her other organs through NJ Sharing Network. She also donated her corneas through Eversight. Her gift of life changed the lives of at least 75 people.

During her life, Linda was full of passion, love, and joy. She lived her life for others while maintaining a love and respect for her body and soul. She dedicated her life to helping others recognize their unique potential.

It is an honor and joy to remember Linda's legacy and commemorate her gift by participating in the NJ Sharing Network 5K. Our success and impact is a true testament to Linda and her generosity in life and the impact that she has made on those who knew her.



#### The County of Morris

"Morris County's Miners" is an archival digital collection that delves into Morris County's mining history—and it is a work in progress. Although history has recorded the names of the mining barons, the names, faces, and stories of the miners have been largely forgotten. Therefore, historians under the auspices of Morris County's Office of Planning & Preservation (MCOPP) are seeking to uncover vintage photos, facts, and stories to add to this collection.

"Our invitations to the public to assist us in compiling historical information for other projects has worked well, and we would love more information on the miners. The prize for us would be photographs," said Jan Williams, a Cultural and Historic Resources Specialist for the MCOPP.


Morris County has a deep history of mining still visible today, from the names of locations such as Mine Hill Township and Richard Mine Road, to the pits and sinkholes marking the landscape to the remnants of historic mills that processed the bounty, including the Boonton Ironworks.

Morris County historians have gathered many names from census data in Morris County, and in some cases, for example, the 1880 Census for Teabo Mine in Rockaway Township even made a distinction between an individual who works in mine and a miner. Morris County has included them all in "Morris County's Miners."

"Also included are those who made their living in service to miners: shopkeepers, physicians and contractors," Williams added.



Many have never worked with their hands and over the years, they've taught each other caning, rushing and a myriad of other techniques needed to fix the aging furniture brought to them for restoration.

Prim La Capra of Short Hills recently patronized the workshop. She had a table restored that had suffered from years of use and weathering. "I am so grateful to the volunteers who refinished my little table to its original beauty. My late husband bought this well-crafted table from Bloomingdales' NYC store decades ago and it became a special place to store important documents, memorabilia, pictures, and other things we wanted to keep in our library." Said Prim. "It got water damage on top and sun damage on the sides over the years. The volunteers at Sage Elder Care completely restored it at a reasonable cost. I love how the piece turned out and plan to keep it for many more years. Thank you to the volunteers who contributed their skills, time, and talent to this project. 


There was more action outside where food trucks served coffee and breakfast between performances.


