SCOTCH PLAINS' OWN COMEDIAN MIKE MARINO

I recently had the honor and pleasure of meeting "New Jersey's Bad Boy of Comedy" Mike Marino. Mike grew up in Scotch Plains, and resides there now in his childhood home.

He is a comic who has performed all over the world and head-lined at some of the biggest stages, clubs, and theaters in the country. This talented comedian has been on the stage with some of the biggest names in the business. Mike has appeared in over 200 national television commercials, received many endorsements, and a Best Actor Clio Award Nomination. He has acted in many prime-time soaps and television shows including: As the World Turns, One Life to Live, Becker, Nikki, Frasier and Party of Five. His film credits include Crooks, Pizza with Bullets, hangin' in Hedo, Steven King's Lucky Quarter and Criticized.

Adding to his great success in film, theatre, commercials and soaps, Mike Marino began touring the world performing and selling out at countless clubs, theatres and casinos. His stand-up material ranges from cutting edge observations of everyday life to his Italian family roots, which recently spun into a television pilot called "Re-Constructing Jersey". His comedic style has landed him guest appearances on "The Tonight Show" as a regular sketch player, "The Martin Short Show", "Canada's Comedy TV", "The Boomer Show", "Wild Pitch", and "Hand Held Comedy Radio". A clip of Mike's appearance on Byran Allen's "Comics Unleashed" earned him over 7 million views (and counting). This led to his current web series "Marino 2016" - an original comedy based on Mike's Road to the White House and wise guy attempt to become the first Italian American President of the United States.

Recently, Untied Brewing Company hosted a comedy show for the New Jersey Veterans Network in New Providence. Both Assemblyman Jon Bramnick, known as New Jersey's funniest lawyer, and Mike Marino performed at the show and it sold out immediately. After the show, I was able to meet Mike and he explained to me how he always supported our uniformed heroes and wanted to really get involved with our team.

A few days later, I met with Mike in his 'Mother's Basement' studio, in Scotch Plains, where he hosts his nationwide podcast show, and we began working on ideas to help the charity. Mike has always supported our uniformed heroes; he was a member of the USO comedy team and entertained the troops in places like Bosnia and Afghanistan. After his comedy tour, Mike was awarded the prestigious "Bob Hope" award. This award is only presented to performers who go beyond the call of duty. Mike has hosted and performed countless times for our brothers and sisters in blue. After the 9-11 tragedy, Mike felt he was obligated to do something for the first responders' families affected by that horrendous and devastating day. He joined up with both the Los Angeles Sheriffs and Police Department, and they do a comedy show every year that raises money for the 9-11 fallen families.





FANWOOD CELEBRATES ARBOR DAY

The Fanwood Shade Tree Commission will host the annual Arbor Day celebration at Carriage House Park on Friday, April 29, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. The public is invited to attend. This is the 150th anniversary of the first Arbor Day, and the 50th anniversary of the Arbor Day Foundation.

A brief history of Arbor Day: As pioneers began moving into the Nebraska Territory, the lack of trees was felt deeply. Not only did the new residents miss the trees they left behind, they were also left without the trees they needed as windbreaks to keep soil in place, for fuel and building materials and for shade from the hot sun. Nebraska newspaper editor and tree enthusiast J. Sterling Morton advocated strongly for individuals and civic groups to plant trees. Once he became secretary of the Nebraska Territory,

Morton proposed a tree planting holiday to be called "Arbor Day". The celebration was held on April 10, 1872. Prizes were offered for the largest number of properly planted trees on that day. Today Arbor Day is celebrated in all 50 states. While Nebraska City, NE is the birthplace of the Arbor Day holiday, communities around the globe gather every year to celebrate trees and plant for a greener tomorrow.

Fanwood is a recipient of the national Tree City, USA award given by the Arbor Day Foundation in recognition of its ongoing dedication to shade tree health and environmental change. Come and hear what the commission is doing to beautify Fanwood. The event will conclude with a tree seedling give away.



FSP ROTARY SUPPORTS UKRAINE - YOU CAN HELP

In response to the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine, the Fanwood-Scotch Plains Rotary Club set up a collection to support Ukrainian refugees who have fled to surrounding countries as well as those who remain in the country. According to the United Nations, the senseless war has forced



over 2 million people to flee to surrounding countries, while over a million have been displaced within Ukraine.

The club kicked off a humanitarian relief effort on March 8th. The primary area of focus is sending donations to Shelterbox, a disaster response organization who will provide temporary transitional housing and other essential supplies. They will also send funds to organizations within Ukraine and Poland to help the people remaining within Ukraine and those who have left the country. The list of organizations who will receive money include: Rotary Clubs in Ukraine, the Rotary Club of Warsaw in Poland and Rotary International Disaster Fund.

The FSP Rotary Club sent a \$1,000 donation to Shelterbox, \$1,000 to the Disaster Fund and \$1000 to Rotary Clubs. As of March 16th, Rotarians and members of the community have already donated an additional \$2,500.

The club is also sending supplies to Ukraine and are working with the Greater Westfield

Chapter of Unico National. They are collecting aspirin, bandages, band-aids, tourniquet gauze, gauze pads, medical tape and medical gloves. These can be dropped off at Apple Blossom in Scotch Plains through April 15th.

JULIA DRANISHNIKOV SWORN IN AS ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

The new class of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster youth have taken their oath before Union County Superior Court Judge Lara K. DiFabrizio and become the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County.

Since 2005, the nonprofit has recruited, trained, supported and supervised nearly 600 community volunteers to advocate for more than 900 such youth, protecting best interests and ensuring needs are met in the courtroom, classroom, and community. As caseworkers, foster placements, and schools can change frequently, CASA volunteers often are the only consistent, caring adult in a youth's corner, helping ensure already experienced trauma is not exacerbated as youth await permanency in a safe and loving home.

Scotch Plains' Julia Dranishnikov has worked in education and volunteered for AmeriCorp. Her

journey in advocacy continues now as a CASA volunteer to positively impact kids in the community.

Judge DiFabrizio presided over the Zoom swearing-in ceremony of Dranishnikov and her classmates Lynda Sun Lee of Berkeley Heights, Katherine (Katie) Rabiecki of Cranford, Dina Gharaibeh of Kearny, Lila Monroe of Roselle, and Robert Mallard of Union. In commemoration with gratitude, Judge DiFabrizio noted, "Thank you all for your commitment, passion, hard work, and loyalty to these families that desperately need it. It takes a village and now you're a part of it." Each volunteer will now be matched to a foster youth or foster sibling set, and begin putting their 30-hour training into practice, ensuring their needs are met and best interests are protected while they await permanency.

Anyone passionate about making a difference in a child's life can apply to volunteer; there is no prior experience or background needed to serve as an advocate. Each undergoes a thorough training process and is supported by CASA staff throughout their work. Successful advocates have varied life experiences and this class is no exception, as professional backgrounds include social work, education, judicial clerkship, health management, and business.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth's foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers and, through their regular child visits, identify and report to the judge any concerns and needs in order to protect the child's best interests.

As the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for Union County judges hearing cases of youth in the child welfare system, the organization regularly recruits community volunteers to serve these local child-victims from birth to age 21.






