GIRL SCOUTS SERVE THE COMMUNITY

Green Brook Brownie Troop 65539

The third-grade girl scouts from Green Brook Brownie Troop 65539 recently completed their annual community service. The girls decided to help two local charities—Moms Helping Moms, and Bridges Outreach, Inc. The Moms Helping Moms Foundation, located in Warren, NJ, focuses on fighting childhood poverty through health, literacy, and advocacy programs and essential item collections. Bridges Outreach in Summit, hopes to end homelessness through outreach focusing on health, housing, and independence.

The scouts used a percentage of their fall product and Girl Scout cookie sales to pay for supplies to complete each community service project. Since they are still too young to work in the Moms Helping Moms warehouse, they sorted baby clothes from one of the collection drives at their meeting space. These clothes will be distributed to low-income and vulnerable children aged 0-5 who live in New Jersey.

To aide in the Bridges Outreach mission, the girls created hygiene kits. Each kit contains soap, shampoo, deodorant, body lotion, shaving cream, a razor, a toothbrush, toothpaste, and dental floss. These hygiene kits will be distributed during one of the many "runs" that Bridges organizes to those living on the streets in both New Jersey and New York City.

The girls are very proud of their accomplishments this year. In addition to their community service, they have earned numerous badges. They've learned valuable first-aid skills, how to create their own pottery, and the art of dance. They've visited many local businesses such as Color Me Mine in Bridgewater and Sugar Plum Parties in Green Brook. Their next adventure will be earning their computer badges at Code Ninjas.



WOMEN'S GUILD INVITES WOMEN TO GATHER WITH THEM

The Women of Wilson Memorial Church in Watchung made HERstory on the morning of February 19th, 2022, by holding a meeting of the Women's Guild to widen the welcome to working women who have otherwise missed the opportunity to meet for service and fellowship during the traditional meeting time of 11:30 a.m., the first Thursday of each month.

As the Women's Guild morphs into its newest iteration, it is clear that there is a desire to uphold traditional practices established decades ago by the original guild, while keeping an eye out for new ways to bring care through the love of Jesus to those in Wilson's congregation and the community beyond. In addition, the goal of both groups is to provide a source of support to women of all ages that will empower them to leading a deeper spiritual life, for themselves and their families. Becoming inclusive to women from all backgrounds and giftings only enhances the resources the Guild will be able to offer as a collective.

In this Lenten season, the Guild has initiated the return of the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on March 1st, and provided soup for one of the four Soup Suppers taking place on the Sunday nights of Lent at Wilson from the 13th of March to April 3rd. They also facilitated the weekly post-worship Coffee Hour on March 6th. There has been discussion of forming different interest groups that will act as resources and emotional support to women, and their families, facing grief and other family care issues, including food insecurity.

There are two opportunities to gather each month. The Women's Guild meets each first Thursday of the month, at 11:30 a.m. and the Collective on the second Saturday, at 10:30 a.m. Women of all ages are welcome at both meetings as their schedule allows.

HISTORICAL DOCUMENT DISCOVERED

James Koch, Green Brook Historical Society

One of Green Brook Historical Society's dedicated workers recently discovered a noteworthy document-the June 19, 1935 Green Brook School Eighth Grade Graduation Program.

June 19, 1935 was a triumphant day for all seven graduates and their families.

In attendance were the three teachers, including Miss Irene Feldkirchner who was designated as principal and Miss Feldkirchner who had started her tenure there in the 1920s. giving her seniority.

Members of the Board of Education distributed diplomas. Rev. Hill gave the Invocation, the Address, and the Benediction. Julia Kasar, who had just turned 13, did a solo rendition of the song "Trees," based on the poem by Joyce Kilmer. Other students participated in the program as well.

Among the graduates, was Irving Mundy who

lived in the J. Vermeule house—now a 200-yearold site being readied for public view by the Green Brook Historical Society.

Graduate Julia Kasar married Joseph DiQuollo in her early 20s. He was several years older, but they had known each other from their school days. Later they moved to Scotch Plains to raise a daughter. After Julia's death in 2004, her daughter moved back to Green Brook, adding credence to the old saying: There's no place like home!
