# **GL ROBOTICS CLUB COMPETES IN FIRST TECH CHALLENGE**

While the GL Robotics Club saw many senior members graduate last year, and the team felt they were less experienced than other clubs in the area as a result, that was truly not the case as they made it to the semi-finals of the FIRST Tech Challenge, presented by Raytheon Technologies.

This competition challenges teams to design, build, program, and operate robots to compete against each other. Every year the theme of the challenge changes. This year it was Freight Frenzy – a race against time to transport essential goods and explore the future of transportation.

The GL Robotics Club, which has about 15 members, began meeting in September to discuss the theme of the challenge. Each student brings their own set of skills from their academic and technical education classes such as electronics, woodworking, fine metal working, and robotics.

"Working together, they were able to create something

real," said Michael Maresca, Technology Education Department at GL.


It took the club approximately two months to design, build, and program the robot for the competition. Once they tested the robot and felt it was ready, the team then brought it to four qualifying competitions.

"It was at the qualifiers that the team was exposed to many other schools and saw how their robots were programmed. They were always thinking of ways they could improve," said Maresca. "It was truly an evolution from what the robot was at the beginning of the year to what it is today."

Not only did the GL Robotics Club make it to the semifinals, but they also received the Control Award. This award represents the team's ability to program the robot to evaluate and react to its environment which is the foundation for which the robot is built on.





The Levi Cory House officially opened to the public in December of 2018. The circa 1818 Levi Cory House, which was moved to Constitution Plaza in 2013, was originally located at the corner of New Providence Road and Mountain Avenue. The house was the location of the first Children's Country Home during the 1890s before expanding to its current location as the Children's Specialized Hospital. After years of repair, renovation, and restoration, the Levi Cory House now opens as a museum for children's interests and the Village Shop.

The Village Shop serves as a fund raiser for the continued restoration and maintenance of the Levi Cory House and maintenance of the Deacon Andrew Hetfield House. The Shop has been restocked with many new items for the home and

for gift-giving: home décor, jewelry, antique and vintage items, furniture, curiosities, and more. Stop by to browse and you will most likely find something that speaks to you. There is something for everyone. Purchases benefit the Mountainside Restoration Committee.





# **VOLUNTEERS SWORN IN TO ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH**

CASA of Union County

The new class of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster youth have taken their oath before Union County Superior Court Judge Lara K. DiFabrizio and become the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County.

Since 2005, the nonprofit has recruited, trained, supported and supervised nearly 600 community volunteers to advocate for more than 900 such youth, protecting best interests and ensuring needs are met in the courtroom, classroom and community. As caseworkers, foster placements and schools can change frequently, CASA volunteers often are the only consistent, caring adult in a youth's corner, helping ensure already experienced trauma is not exacerbated as youth await permanency in a safe and loving home.

Judge DiFabrizio presided over the Zoom swearing-in ceremony of volunteers Lynda Sun Lee of Berkeley Heights, Katherine (Katie) Rabiecki of Cranford, Dina Gharaibeh of Kearny, Lila Monroe of Roselle, Julia Dranishnikov of Scotch Plains, and Robert Mallard of Union. In commemoration with gratitude, Judge DiFabrizio noted, "Thank you all for your commitment, passion, hard work, and loyalty to these families that desperately need it. It takes a village and now you're a part of it." Each volunteer will now be matched to a foster youth or foster sibling set, and begin putting their 30-hour training into practice, ensuring their needs are met and best interests are protected while they await permanency.

Anyone passionate about making a difference

in a child's life can apply to volunteer; there is no and, through their regular child visits, identify prior experience or background needed to serve as an advocate. Each undergoes a thorough training process and is supported by CASA staff throughout their work. Successful advocates have varied life experiences and this class is no exception, as professional backgrounds include social work, education, judicial clerkship, health management, and business.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth's foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers

and report to the judge any concerns and needs in order to protect the child's best interests.

As the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for Union County judges hearing cases of youth in the child welfare system, the organization regularly recruits community volunteers to serve these local child-victims from birth to age 21. # **GL STUDENTS: MAKING A MARK ON THE COMMUNITY**

Fine Arts and Woodworking students at Governor Livingston (GL) High School are following a vision that teachers Michael Maresca, Technology Education Department, and Michelle Harpster, Fine Arts Department, wanted to bring to life.

"I drive through other towns and see how they incorporate students' works of art in a park or town center, and it's awesome," said Maresca. "It really gives a pulse to the town and is a way to give back to the community and we wanted to do the same."

Harpster and Maresca brainstormed projects that would link to the curriculum so the students could really take control from start to finish. They also needed to find a way to fund the project.

After careful thought and planning, and a generous grant of \$400 from the GL PTO, it was decided that the students would create a total of eight butterflies measuring three to four feet in width and height. Each butterfly will be uniquely painted and will have its own anchoring system so that it gives the illusion that it is floating.

After learning how to plan and execute the project, the GL woodworking students created a digital butterfly template and then used a Computer Numerical Control (CNC) to process the wood, meeting all the design specifications. "It can be really difficult to cut the perfect shape

when working with wood, but these programs make it really easy to produce," added Maresca.

Once all the butterflies are completed the woodworking students will then pass them onto Harpster's art students to apply the final decoration.

Harpster's students are no strangers to creating and painting large scale works of art. Many times, when there is a need within the community for artwork, it is her students that are called on to assist. They have also been discussing in class how they can find more public venues show their work.

"When speaking to my students, I explained that each group could make the butterfly what they wanted it to be. It didn't necessarily have to look like one we would see in the garden. If they wanted, they could give the butterfly a theme and paint the butterfly based on that," Harpster added.

It is taking approximately 80 students to make this project a reality and it is a project that Harpster and Maresca hope to see repeated for years to come.

"This is not something we want to see go up and then fade away. We want it to be sustainable," said Maresca. "We are already looking forward to determining the best way to do that."

One thing is for sure, once the snow thaws and
