


AMERICAN LEGION CELEBRATES ST. PATTY'S DAY

This January marked the start of the second year of Wilson Memorial Church's spacesharing arrangement with St. Augustine & St. Monica Coptic Orthodox Church.

Rev. Peter said, "As difficult as the early stages of a growing parish are, there are certainly an abundance of blessings as well. Among our greatest blessings have been the Christ-like love and hospitality shown to us by Wilson Memorial Church. Wilson's Pastor, Michael Droege, their leadership, and congregants have exemplified the spirit of the Gospel, to love your neighbor as yourself. They not only have followed Christ's command to go the second mile with us, but have gone to the third and fourth mile as well! Wilson Memorial Church's love has been a humbling experience that our Parish will never forget and an example for us to imitate as we grow. Wilson Memorial Church is truly a blessing to the entire city of Watchung and I'm certain whoever walks through their doors will feel the same warmth and love we feel today!"

Someday in the future, the parishioners of St. Augustine and St. Monica Coptic Orthodox Church will have their own church building in which to pray, but for the time being, these two Christian churches, with different customs in worship, continue to enjoy the benefits of what it means to share.


