WILSON SCHOOL RECEIVES VISIT FROM FAMOUS ALUMNUS

Westfield Public Schools

The excitement was palpable as Wilson 5th graders awaited the arrival of a famous alumnus on March 16. It was a visit for which the students had painstakingly prepared and, when billionaire and commercial space explorer Jared Isaacman walked into the gymnasium, awe-inspired smiles broke out.

"Today Jared Issacman is our honored guest here at Wilson School," said Abigail Dewey, one of three 5th graders who, with principal Crystal Marsh, introduced Isaacman. "Our fifth grade classes refer to him as 'Commander Isaacman' because that is how we came to know of him when learning about the SpaceX Inspiration 4 mission, the first crewed orbital mission with no professional astronauts on board."

Isaacman, a civilian pilot who orbited the Earth last September as commander of the all-civilian crew of the SpaceX Crew Dragon capsule dubbed Resilience, spoke about that mission and shared his plans for future space exploration which includes three more space missions with a new four-member crew as part of a SpaceX program called Polaris.

"We're going to go farther into space than humans have gone since we last walked on the Moon," said Isaacman about the Polaris program which he says is "designed to test technology required for future space missions to the Moon, Mars, and beyond."

During the first Polaris mission -- Polaris Dawn, scheduled to launch in November -- Isaacman said the crew will spend up to five days in space, conducting scientific experiments and testing a new spacesuit while on a spacewalk 310 miles above the Earth. to raise awareness of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, the crew also plans to use SpaceX's constellation of low Earth orbit communication satellites to conduct "telemedicine," connecting pediatric patients in countries who may not have direct access to resources such as St. Jude. Isaacman and the Inspiration 4 crew raised \$240 million for St. Jude during their trip into space last fall.

The Polaris crew will continue scientific and in-space communications research on Mission 2. And, as part of Polaris Mission 3, Isaacman plans to command "the first human spaceflight on Starship, the world's first fully reusable transportation system designed to carry both crew and cargo to Earth orbit, the Moon, Mars and beyond."

Last November, the Wilson 5th grade team of Coral Venturino, Katherine Brown, and Alexander Schmidt included Isaacman's trip into space as part of the traditional science unit, with students writing fictional dispatches from the Moon and brainstorming ideas of how Isaacman has inspired them. The 5th graders illustrated cards and wrote letters with questions about commander for taking the time to visit and share space for Isaacman.

Isaacman attended the Westfield Public Schools from Kindergarten through 6th grade and has said that his dreams of traveling to space began while looking at pictures of the space shuttle as a kindergartner at Wilson. During his visit to his elementary alma mater, Isaacman

answered questions from the students and was presented with a "key" to Wilson School, with Venturino expressing the hope that Isaacman will take the gift with him on his next mission into space.

In welcoming Isaacman at the beginning of the program, 5th grader Emilie Ancri noted that "Mr. Isaacman is a former Wilson School student who has more fans than just us fifth graders." The 5th graders thanked the SpaceX his experiences.

"We also want to thank him for all the good deeds he has done and the ways he makes an effort to give back in all areas of his life," added 5th grader Eli Diamant. "Thank you for being an amazing role model and inspiring us to be the best we can be now and in the future."





UTILITY SCAM AWARENESS: LEARN THE TELLTALE SIGNS

Think twice if someone threatens to immediately shut off your power. Utilities United Against Scams (UUAS) recently launched an advocacy and awareness campaign focused on educating customers and exposing the tactics used by scammers.

"The pandemic has created financial hardship and escalated stress levels for many of our customers, and that is a perfect environment for scammers to thrive," said Deb Affonsa, PSE&G's vice president Customer Care and chief customer officer. "Bad actors create the impression of an urgent problem in the hopes that our customers will panic, preventing our customers from seeing all the clues that they are indeed being scammed. I would like to reinforce, PSE&G is not currently shutting off residential customers for nonpayment. PSE&G wants to help all our customers who are behind on their energy bills with affordable payment agreements to help our customers get back on track. together."

WHAT TO LOOK OUT FOR:

You receive a call from what looks like PSE&G on your caller ID. The caller threatens to shut off your service and demands an immediate payment by cash, pre-paid card, or digital money transfer apps. The caller informs you that you require a new meter and demands a deposit before the installation can occur (PSE&G does not require a deposit for a new meter Installation). You're given a phone number to call back that, when called, may sound similar to PSE&G's automated call system. The caller alerts you that, because of your good bill-paying history, you're eligible for a bill reduction or discount but you must provide information first. PSE&G never requires payment with a prepaid card and does not offer bill discounts. As another reminder, PSE&G does not accept payment via prepaid gift cards, digital money transfer apps or cryptocurrency such as Bitcoin.





will focus on areas upstream and downstream of till noon, but any amount of time or effort that the dam at Winfield Park, New Jersey throughout Rahway River Park. Please plan to stop by the parking area adjacent to the waterfall of the Rahway River by the dam at Winfield Park at 8:45 a.m. to register, pick up bags, gloves, bottled water and snacks, and receive safety information.

Teams will be encouraged to travel to any part of the river within the park where they would like to perform cleanup activities but we specifically will ask folks to always work in small groups for safety purposes with folks socially distanced.

Cleaning up a river and park area is a great way to celebrate Earth Day and if you haven't participated in an event like this before, you will find it invigorating, and you will feel good about what you have accomplished. It is also fun and educational, especially for scouts and young adults as they always find something interesting. Over the 20+ years this cleanup has occurred thousands of folks have participated, including girl scouts, cub scouts, boy scouts, fishermen, local activists and citizens, and we pulled some amazing things from the river.

The clean-up will generally be between 9a.m.

folks can volunteer is appreciated. There is always a large volume of floatable debris to pick up, and this year there remains substantial debris in the floodplain from Hurricane Ida last fall. The team working registration will provide suggestions on areas with large volumes of floatable debris.

All participants should wear jeans, longsleeved shirts, gloves and boots, waders are welcome for folks who like to get a little wet. Each participant should bring a standard 5-gallon carry bucket with a handle (put your name on the bottom), this makes for easy carrying of "stuff" for transfer to the large garbage bags. A mulching rake is also a great asset to have to enable reaching out and pulling debris into shore from the river bank. When we complete the event we do a basic inventory of the "big stuff" that we removed, and within approximately 24 hours Union County Parks removes and disposes of all the trash. 
