After a 2-year hiatus due to COVID-19, we are excited to have a return of the Annual Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 30th - led by the members of VFW Post #6259. 

LOCAL CLERGY ISSUE STATEMENT ON UKRAINE

and Berkeley Heights has issued a statement on the war in Ukraine. The statement follows:

"We believe that God is grieved by the events unfolding in Ukraine. Human division wounds the heart of God, and no division is greater than war. Furthermore, the senseless acts of suffering, violence, and killing are an assault on the dignity of the people of Ukraine as the created children of God.

"We do not condemn the people of Russia, but we do condemn the actions of their political and military leaders. And whereas, we do not wish to become political, we support the efforts of the United States to fortify Ukrainian defenses and alleviate the suffering of their people.

"In the face of the evil we are witnessing, we are tempted to despair believing that we can do nothing. But people of faith have two weapons of peace we can wield: Prayer and Justice.

"We believe that fervent prayer changes the world. We call upon all people of goodwill to pray for peace. Pray for the people of Ukraine that they might endure this time of tribulation. Pray for the people of Russia that they will have fortitude to stand for truth and right. Pray that God will turn the hearts of the Russian leadership.

"We are also people of justice, and justice does not happen alone. God calls us to work for justice, and justice begets peace. To that

The Berkeley Heights and New Providence communities came together to support their win as the Highlanders concluded their historic season with a record of 18-6-1.



CREATING THINKING CLASSROOMS

Berkeley Heights Public Schools

It is no surprise that math can be an extremely difficult subject for any student. It is not because students can't learn the concepts, but rather, students have a difficult time being told how to do it, memorizing how to do it, and then having to implement it.

For many years it has been all about memorizing rather than thinking, believes Dr. Peter Liljedahl, professor of mathematics education. Having spent 15 years researching how to get students to "think" rather than memorize to help create the ideal setting for deep mathematics learning to occur, Dr. Liljedahl created the concept of "Thinking Classrooms."

After observing a local school district who had implemented "Thinking Classrooms," Nicole Manganelli, mathematics teacher at GLHS, was so inspired with what she saw that she brought the concept back to her GL students.

"The next day my supervisor, Drew Ziobro, had my room covered in white boards so I could begin the process with my students," Manganelli said. "It was so interesting to watch the transformation. Students were really engaged. There is something about vertical learning that just makes it easier."

Unfortunately, just as quickly as Manganelli began transitioning to a "Thinking Classroom," the district was closed due to Covid-19. However, that did not deter her from researching as much

as she could about this learning strategy and fully implementing it once students returned to school.

"This is the first year we have really been able to use this method consistently," Manganelli said.

When students walk into class, they pick a card and are randomly placed into groups of three. The groups change daily and are not based on ability. Students are then presented with questions that they need to solve at the white board.

Manganelli is constantly walking the classroom and observing what the students are doing. If she sees they are stuck on something she provides them with "thinking questions" rather than telling them what their mistake was or how they should solve the problem. This method allows them to become more independent and to work together to problem solve.

"Before 'Thinking Classrooms,' students would learn a concept and, in a day, or week it was gone. So many students when they got to high school had no recollection of the concepts they had learned. Not because they didn't learn it, but because they didn't remember it," said Manganelli. "By working in small groups and discovering the concepts on the white boards, they are learning them and thinking through them, rather than just mimicking what they are being told."

Following the time at the white boards, the class comes back together to discuss what they learned and identify what is important for them

individually to remember.

"It's amazing to walk around the classroom and listen to them talking and 'thinking' about math. It's something I have never heard before. And the students and I agree that we much prefer this way of learning rather than sitting at a desk," added Manganelli."

Most of these end up in our already Faith Lutheran Church, 524 South Street in New Providence, will again be collecting secondhand bikes for use by adults and children in third world countries. The collection is being conducted on behalf of Pedals for Progress, an organization which annually recycles 6,000 bicycles for persons in developing countries. Anyone with a bicycle in repairable condition is urged to donate to this worthy cause. Bikes may be dropped off at the parking lot next to the church. On that day, members of Faith will repair and process the bikes for shipment by P4P.

Since 2002, Faith Lutheran has been collecting bikes for P4P. In 2021, five hundred sixty-four bikes were collected from persons and organizations in New Providence, Berkeley Heights, Mountainside, Westfield, Chatham, Warren, Scotch Plains and Fanwood. collection by Faith occurs throughout the year. The range of towns was aided by articles published in Renna Media publications.

Every year affluent Americans buy 22 million new bicycles and discard millions of old ones, abandoning many more in basements, sheds and

overburdened landfills.

P4P ships its reconditioned bikes to persons in need of countries in Latin America, Africa and Asia. The bikes provide reliable transportation to commute to work, transport produce to market, access health care and other services. Steady employment for adults is vital to the development and success of these economies.

P4P reports that the cost of shipping bikes has increased significantly in recent years and now presents a substantial financial burden to P4P. Last year, Faith contributed \$3,000 toward the shipment of the bikes. Persons donating bikes gave \$1,273 toward shipment. P4P is asking persons to donate \$15 toward the shipping costs. if they are financially comfortable doing so. Donation or not, Faith welcomes all bikes in repairable condition.

Since 2016, the chairperson of Faith's Pedal for Progress ministry has been Casey Walsh of Bridgewater, a long-time member of the church.


