#### FATHER JOSEPH CODA - WORLD WAR II **VETERAN AND ST. THERESA'S CHURCH PRIEST**

Kenilworth has had many priests come and go. One priest that many parishioners will remember is Father Joseph Coda who passed away on March 27, 2022, at the age of one-hundred and three. Joseph was born in Lodi, New Jersey on November 3, 1918. As a young man he attended St. Peter's Prep in Jersey City and later St. Peter and Paul in Hoboken.


During World War II, he served in the 26th Division of Patton's Third Army. He saw combat in France, the Battle of the Bulge, Luxembourg, Czechoslovakia, Austria, and Germany. During his time in the service, he received the Bronze Star. In 2018, The Catholic Advocate ran an article detailing his life. To author Melissa McNally he stated, "Someone once said that there are no atheists in fox-holes," Father Coda said. "You see so many people wounded or killed. The fact that you survived makes you feel like you have a guardian angel. You realize God has something in mind for you and it is important to find out what that is."

After receiving his honorable discharge, he attended the Manhattan School of Music and Juilliard. He then attended Seton Hall and Immaculate Conception Seminary in Mahwah, New Jersey. He was ordained on May 25, 1963, at the age of forty-four. Following his ordination he spent his priesthood at St. Joseph, Oradell,

Over the years St. Theresa's Church in New Jersey, and later St. Theresa's in Kenilworth. On November 3, 1988, he retired from St. Theresa's on his seventieth birthday. In his later years he took up residence at St. John Vianney Residence in Rutherford, New Jersey. At the age of ninety-nine Father Coda was the oldest priest in the Archdiocese of Newark.

#### **CHECK TREES FOR SPOTTED LANTERNFLY EGG MASSES**

#### NJ Department of Agriculture

The weather is warming up, check your trees for Spotted Lanternfly (SLF) egg masses. When you find them crush them. Use an old bank card, small rolling pin or putty knife.

Citizens are advised to destroy the Spotted Lanternfly in all its forms.

#### WHY YOU SHOULD CARE

SLF is a serious invasive pest with a healthy appetite for our plants and it can be a significant nuisance, affecting the quality of life and enjoyment of the outdoors. The spotted lanternfly uses its piercing-sucking mouthpart to feed on sap from over 70 different plant species. It has a strong preference for economically important plants and the feeding damage significantly stresses the plants which can lead to decreased health and potentially death.

As SLF feeds, the insect excretes honeydew (a sugary substance) which can attract bees, wasps, and other insects. The honeydew also builds up and promotes the growth for sooty mold (fungi), which can cover the plant, forest understories, patio furniture, cars, and anything else found below SLF feeding.

#### **BREARLEY'S ALTERNATE EDUCATION PROGRAM**

#### Kenilworth Public Schools

David Brearley Middle and High School's Alternate Education Program was established in Dec. 2019 to further develop strategic, individualized support for students who may have difficulties in a traditional classroom setting.

Spearheaded by the district's Student Personnel Services Department, the program includes flexible scheduling and pacing as well as a less structured mindset that offers students a "flow-through" system of academic and social/emotional support.

Part of this support also includes a brand new dedicated space, located on the right-side of the school's campus.

"Even with the pandemic and damage to the original facility, the program has continued to grow, and the students are really looking forward to finally moving into their new space," said Director of Student Personnel Services Dawn Cuccolo.

After a severe windstorm put renovations of the original annex building on hold, the program was temporarily housed out of Brearley's conference room. It was later determined that the

30-year-old structure needed to be completely replaced, and between insurance reimbursements and district savings, plans for a new building were quickly underway.

"We were fortunate with the cost and timeframe for the rebuilding process," said School Business Administrator Vince Gonnella. "This building offers more space, including bathrooms, and has up-to-date technology and security features in place."

The new annex will be home to three classrooms where students and staff will work from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., independent of the main schedule's structure. With comfort as a priority, the annex also provides open floor plans with plenty of flexibility, and students will be encouraged to decorate and make the space their own

"The program is entirely need-based, and with guidance from their parents or guardians, students can choose to be a part of it," said Cuccolo. "We're always looking at graduation requirements while assessing how we can get them there outside of traditional practices. We're finding students reach remarkable success when given an opportunity to experience an education that meets them where they are."

In addition to social and emotional support, the program offers recreational opportunities, a foundations curriculum, passion projects, and independent study.

Kenilworth Superintendent Kyle Arlington hopes the program will serve as a model for the future of general education. "The way we've set it up, the Alternate Education Program has the students as our focus rather than the curriculum. It's personalized for their needs and interests, and I think that's exciting for how we develop general education moving forward."

"We're excited to see the program expand," concluded Cuccolo. "The students have been able to watch this building be constructed over the course of several months expressly for their needs, and they couldn't be more excited."



#### **VOLUNTEERS SWORN IN TO ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH**

CASA of Union County

The new class of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster youth have taken their oath before Union County Superior Court Judge Lara K. DiFabrizio and become the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County.

Since 2005, the nonprofit has recruited, trained, supported and supervised nearly 600 community volunteers to advocate for more than 900 such youth, protecting best interests and ensuring needs are met in the courtroom. classroom and community. As caseworkers, foster placements and schools can change frequently, CASA volunteers often are the only consistent, caring adult in a youth's corner, helping ensure already experienced trauma is not exacerbated as youth await permanency in a safe and loving home.

Judge DiFabrizio presided over the Zoom swearing-in ceremony of volunteers Lynda Sun Lee of Berkeley Heights, Katherine (Katie) Rabiecki of Cranford, Dina Gharaibeh of Kearny, Lila Monroe of Roselle, Julia Dranishnikov of Scotch Plains, and Robert Mallard of Union. In commemoration with gratitude, Judge DiFabrizio noted, "Thank you all for your commitment, passion, hard work, and loyalty to these families that desperately need it. It takes a village and now you're a part of it." Each volunteer will now be matched to a foster youth or foster sibling set, and begin putting their 30-hour training into practice, ensuring their needs are met and best interests are protected while they await permanency.

Anyone passionate about making a difference in a child's life can apply to volunteer; there is no prior experience or background needed to serve as an advocate. Each undergoes a thorough training process and is supported by CASA staff

throughout their work. Successful advocates have varied life experiences and this class is no exception, as professional backgrounds include social work, education, judicial clerkship, health management, and business.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth's foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers and, through their regular child visits, identify and report to the judge any concerns and needs in order to protect the child's best interests.

As the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for Union County judges hearing cases of youth in the child welfare system, the organization regularly recruits community volunteers to serve these local child-victims from birth to age 21. 




