

CHECK TREES FOR SPOTTED LANTERNFLY EGG MASSES

NJ Department of Agriculture The weather is warming up, check your trees for Spotted Lanternfly (SLF) egg masses. When you find them crush them. Use an old bank card, small rolling pin or putty knife.

Citizens are advised to destroy the Spotted Lanternfly in all its forms.

WHY YOU SHOULD CARE

SLF is a serious invasive pest with a healthy appetite for our plants and it can be a significant nuisance, affecting the quality of life and enjoyment of the outdoors. The spotted lanternfly uses its piercing-sucking mouthpart to feed on sap from over 70 different plant species. It has a strong preference for economically important plants and the feeding damage significantly stresses the plants which can lead to decreased health and potentially death.

As SLF feeds, the insect excretes honeydew (a sugary substance) which can attract bees, wasps, and other insects. The honeydew also builds up and promotes the growth for sooty mold (fungi), which can cover the plant, forest understories, patio furniture, cars, and anything else found below SLF feeding.

If you see a Spotted Lanternfly, help us Stomp it Out!

Recently the three shined at the 2022 Eastern Zone Short Course Age Group Championships in Webster, NY, held March 30th through April 2nd. 

On Saturday, May 7, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, Faith Lutheran Church, 524 South Street in New Providence, will again be collecting second-hand bikes for use by adults and children in third world countries. The collection is being conducted on behalf of Pedals for Progress, an organization which annually recycles 6,000 bicycles for persons in developing countries. Anyone with a bicycle in repairable condition is urged to donate to this worthy cause. Bikes may be dropped off at the parking lot next to the church. On that day, members of Faith will repair and process the bikes for shipment by P4P.

Since 2002, Faith Lutheran has been collecting bikes for P4P. In 2021, five hundred sixty-four bikes were collected from persons and organizations in New Providence, Berkeley Heights, Mountainside, Westfield, Chatham, Warren, Scotch Plains and Fanwood. The collection by Faith occurs throughout the year. The range of towns was aided by articles published in Renna Media publications.

Every year affluent Americans buy 22 million new bicycles and discard millions of old ones, abandoning many more in basements, sheds and garages. Most of these end up in our already overburdened landfills.

P4P ships its reconditioned bikes to persons in need of countries in Latin America, Africa and Asia. The bikes provide reliable transportation to commute to work, transport produce to market, access health care and other services. Steady employment for adults is vital to the development and success of these economies.

P4P reports that the cost of shipping bikes has

increased significantly in recent years and now presents a substantial financial burden to P4P. Last year, Faith contributed \$3,000 toward the shipment of the bikes. Persons donating bikes gave \$1,273 toward shipment. P4P is asking persons to donate \$15 toward the shipping costs, if they are financially comfortable doing so. Donation or not, Faith welcomes all bikes in

repairable condition.

Since 2016, the chairperson of Faith's Pedal for Progress ministry has been Casey Walsh of Bridgewater, a long-time member of the church.

Ms. Monti Balich, a graduate of St. Joseph's College in NY, earned a degree in Education and Communications with a concentration in Speech and Language. Ms. Monti Balich started her

career as a Teacher of the Speech and Hearing Handicapped, at St. Francis de Sales School, where she provided articulation and language therapy for students at their primary and secondary levels. It was at St. Francis de Sales School where Ms. Monti Balich became proficient in American Sign Language (ASL).



DISSOLUTION OF SEWERAGE AUTHORITY

Warren Township

At the meeting of March 24, 2022, the Township Committee introduced ordinances to commence the process for the Dissolution of the Warren Township Sewerage Authority (WTSA). The WTSA was created by the Township Committee in September 1972 with the responsibility to operate and develop the sewerage treatment system within the Township of Warren.

At that time, Warren was a rural community and the Sewer Authority guided the construction of 3 sewer plants, 20 pump stations, and nearly 130 miles of sewer line throughout the Township. As Warren Township is a now developed community, the Township Committee has determined that it is in the best interest of the residents and sewer customers for the management of the Sewer Authority to be the responsibility of the Township Committee as the elected representatives and not through the management of an appointed board.

The Township Committee will be creating by ordinance a Sewer Department. The finances of the Authority will be managed by the Township's Finance and Purchasing Departments, as are all other municipal funds.

Currently, the Sewerage Authority is staffed by an Executive Director, an Administrative Assistant, a part-time Bookkeeper, Auditor, legal, and engineers. As a Township Department, the sewer function will be managed by a Sewer Department Director, but the other responsibilities for record keeping, auditing, and governance will be performed by existing Township Departments and professionals

retained by the Township.

The finances of the authority will be managed through a separate utility fund and will not be incorporated with other Township expenses. This is important, as not all residents are sewer customers as many maintain their own septic systems.

The Township will maintain the use of the outside service company to manage the sewer plants and pump stations and does not intend to expand Township employment to accomplish this mission.

The Township Tax Collector's office has been collecting sewer fees since July of 2017 and will continue to do so in the new structure.

The Township will be filing its application with the New Jersey Local Finance Board for consideration at the May 11, 2022 meeting. Upon approval by the Local Finance Board, the Township Committee can consider the adoption of the ordinances. It is the goal to implement a new management structure on July 1, 2022.

The current Fee structure will remain unchanged in 2022. The Township Committee will conduct a review of the existing fee structure prior to establishing the 2023 structure.

The Township Committee believes that this approach will improve accountability, decrease costs, and eliminate duplication of services by professionals and employees by utilizing existing Township professionals and departments.

The Township Committee expresses its appreciation to the current and former commissioners for their dedication and stewardship of the Warren sewer systems over these 50 years.
