Berkeley Heights Public Schools


In an effort to showcase our students in BHPS who have excelled either in academics, leadership, community, or have shown excellent growth in any of those areas, the district is



STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN PRESTIGIOUS MATH CHALLENGE

Berkeley Heights Public Schools

Two teams of GLHS students recently competed in this year's prestigious MathWorks Math Modeling Challenge (M3 Challenge) where they leveraged math to respond to this year's challenge question. Drawing inspiration from the 2020 global pandemic and the shift in academics and employment to a remote-based model, this year's challenge asked participants to use data to predict the future of remote work. Participants examined data to model remote-readiness, remote work choices, and to make predictions for future remote workers. Over 600 teams competed and the GLHS senior team was in the top 28 of valid papers that were submitted and received 1 of only 22 Honorable Mention Awards and a \$1000 award.

The M3 Challenge is entirely internet based and completed by students remotely within a time limit. "Students used mathematical skills, research and brainstorming to evaluate data and propose answers to the questions about the future of remote work. Teams had to submit their solutions within the strict 14 consecutive hour time limit, akin to the way things often happen in the real world," according to MathWorks. "M3 Challenge spotlights applied mathematics as a powerful problem-solving tool and as a viable and exciting profession. Participating students are encouraged to explore and bolster their mathematical modeling know-how to position themselves for success."

schools in the U.S. (including U.S. territories and DoDEA schools), as well as students in the UK and Wales. This year, GLHS had two teams advised by GLHS math teachers Steven Hess and Steven Ciarrocca. The team of five senior students that won honorable mention included: Brandon Lim, Chris Marinko, Jacob Quisumbing, Charles Santore, and Drew Schiller. This impressive group of students received recognition last year because their paper was in the top 50 out of 535 papers placing them in the top 7% in the US & the 9% internationally.

The second GLHS team consisted of one senior and four juniors and included: David Andrews, Sophia Judicke, Nate Laposky, Daniel Long, and Katherine Zhou. While this team did not earn any scholarships, they made it into the second round of competition and were among the top 18% of teams that competed.

Students from GLHS have participated in the contest for the past 17 years. The Math Modeling Club officially formed six years ago with the specific intent to bring together interested students and help prepare teams for the M3

Challenge. While not a traditional club, in that only those participating in the contest are a part of it (and each school is limited to two teams of 5), the group enjoys a terrific level of camaraderie as they prepare for the challenge.

According to GLHS Math Teacher and team advisor Steven Hess, "This is a particularly impressive group of seniors. They are competing against the top 5 or 10 math students from hundreds of schools across the US and UK, including many specialized STEM schools and prestigious private schools. Some of these schools teach entire year long courses in mathematical modeling. I am thrilled that our GL students won recognition and scholarships two years in a row. In addition, I think the experience of working furiously and creatively with several peers for a time-pressured 14 hour day is the greatest reward of this contest. It is a completely unique experience and they are rightfully proud of the sophisticated 20 page paper that they produced. No one would guess that it was written by 17 and 18 year olds. I am eager to watch their careers unfold in the years ahead."

MIKAYLA SANCHEZ WINS SCHOLARSHIP

Boston College

Mikayla Sanchez--a Boston College Class of 2023 Morrissey College of Arts and Sciences student who hopes to foster her commitment to social justice through a career in the field of law-recently was awarded the University's 2022 Boston College's Saint Oscar A. Romero Scholarship.

After the presentation of her award by BC President William P. Leahy, S.J., Sanchez said to the audience, which included her parents, at the 30th annual award ceremony: "As a secondgeneration American, I feel the need to persevere and utilize the opportunity so selflessly provided and presented to me by my parents."

The scholarship, which covers a significant

portion of senior-year tuition, is given annually Berkeley Heights, New Jersey resident to a BC junior who has demonstrated superior achievement, academic extracurricular leadership, community service, and involvement with the Hispanic/Latinx community and issues both on and off campus.

> Sanchez grew up aware of the poverty and discrimination faced by her mother Rosemary and father Kenny—who emigrated to the United States from the Dominican Republic and Colombia, respectively—and other Latinx immigrants. And she had a powerful experience as an intern in the Boston U.S. Attorney's Office. She gained a wider understanding of racism in the justice system endured by Black and Latino families, which inspired her goal to pursue a career in immigration or defense law.

> "Saint Oscar Romero's legacy serves as inspiration for me to be a person for others and support my fellow Latinos as we overcome barriers," she said. "His commitment to justice and empathy particularly resonate with me, and continue to inspire me to enter the legal profession and further the life that my family sacrificed so much for me to live."

> At BC, she is a double major in history and sociology, with a minor in Managing for Social Impact and the Public Good. Her undergraduate activities include involvement in the Jenks Leadership Program, Student Admission Program, and Organization of Latin American Affairs. She is in the top four to five percent of her class and a member of the Pi Alpha Theta History Honor Society. Sanchez is living in Madrid, Spain this semester, studying at Carlos III University.



Each semester, students in the Columbia Middle School Outreach Elective work in groups and look for new ways to give back to the community by identifying and then meeting a need. VOLUNTEERS SWORN IN AS ADVOCATES FOR LOCAL FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

The latest classes of community members to step up and train as advocates for Union County foster youth have officially taken their oath before Union County Superior Court Judge Lara DiFabrizio and become the newest volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County.

Since 2005, the nonprofit has recruited, trained, supported and supervised nearly 600 community volunteers to advocate for more than 950 such youth, protecting best interests and ensuring needs are met in the courtroom, classroom and community. As caseworkers, foster placements and schools can change frequently, CASA volunteers often are the only consistent, caring adult in a youth's corner, helping ensure already experienced trauma is not exacerbated as youth await permanency in a safe and loving home.

Judge DiFabrizio presided over two swearingin ceremonies via Zoom and, prior to asking each to repeat their oath "to protect, respect, and report," she shared appreciation and gratitude for the new advocates' desire to make a lasting positive impact on youth in the community. "I like to thank CASA volunteers who take on this very important role. You do this because you want to make a difference in a child's life and make the world a better place. The court is grateful and thankful. You have a special opportunity to seriously help a child and family live and succeed. You're part of the village now."

The 14 new CASA volunteers are Jackie Parker and Lynda Sun Lee of Berkeley Heights; Loretta Masterson and Katherine (Katie) Rabiecki of Cranford; Dina Ghazi of Kearny; Ana Gutierrez of Basking Ridge; Janae Bunn of Linden; Julia Dranishnikov and Tamiah Chester of Scotch Plains; Philip Ross of Summit; Lila Monroe and Mark Papa of Roselle; and Robert Mallard and Roya Enayati Basu of Union. Next, each advocate will be matched to a youth or sibling set, and begin putting their 30-hour training into practice.

Anyone passionate about making a difference

in a child's life can apply to volunteer; there is no prior experience or special background needed to serve as an advocate. Each undergoes a thorough training process and is supported by CASA staff throughout their work. Successful advocates have varied life experiences and these classes are no exception, as professional backgrounds include education, business, social work, law, and health management.

Upon being court-ordered to a case, CASA volunteers have access to the youth's foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists, and teachers and, through regular child visits, identify and report to the judge any concerns and needs. CASA of Union County is the only nonprofit serving as extra eyes and ears for local judges hearing cases of youth from birth to age 21 in the child welfare system.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN TO "BUILD DIGNITY FOR ALL"

St. Joseph Social Service Center

St. Joseph Social Service Center, one of the largest social service agencies in Union County, has launched a \$1,200,000 capital campaign. The purpose of the campaign is to improve and expand services for families and children in need in Elizabeth and to fulfill its vision to serve the homeless and poor with compassion and dignity.

Even before the pandemic, St. Joseph's witnessed a rise in demand for services. This trend stretched the capacity of the agency's facilities and created challenges for staff and volunteers. Spaces intended for one purpose needed to be used for multiple programs. Temporary storage units for food and clothing were placed on site. The increase in clients led to lines extending into the neighborhood, a particular concern during inclement weather. The parking lot and access streets became congested and overwhelmed with vehicles arriving to drop off and pick up food, clothing and supplies. And then the pandemic hit, leading to a spike in client demand, exacerbating all these problems.

"Dignity has been a core value of the agency since our founding in 1983," noted Bernadette Murphy, Executive Director. "Our goal is to help people acquire the material items they need to live with dignity. We believe that it is vital for our clients to receive food, clothing, supplies and support services in an environment that fosters dignity, where the homeless and poor are truly welcomed as brothers and sisters. In order to achieve this goal and expand and improve the services we offer, we have developed a vision for a remodeled campus. Our vision is to construct a new building on our property where it will be possible to create a client choice food pantry with hours by appointment; to construct a second new building for the donation and distribution of clothing and home goods; to reconfigure and pave our lot to make it easier to pick up and drop off items and to reduce traffic on the surrounding streets; and to renovate space in our former church building, parish hall and house on site to improve the ability of St. Joseph's and The Elizabeth Coalition House the Homeless, our sister agency, to provide support services."

"St. Joe's has been open six days a week throughout the pandemic" stated Harold Kessler, President of the Board of Trustees. "We have never missed a day. Our staff and volunteers have placed the needs of the community in Elizabeth ahead of their own health and wellbeing. It's been extraordinary." Six days a week a dedicated team of volunteers, numbering in the thousands, makes sandwiches for the hungry in

their kitchens in Westfield, Cranford, Basking Ridge and dozens of other communities, bring food, clothing and home goods, serve meals at the soup kitchen and help with the operations of the agency. St. Joseph's provides over 250,000 meals per year. In addition, the organization provides area residents with clothing, household items, prescription assistance, health screenings, mental health counseling, job training and case management.




HONORING THE MEMORY OF A FATHER

Father's Day is a special time of year for Rajesh Karnani of Paramus, NJ. It is a time when he joins his family members to remember his father, Sham C. Karnani, who unexpectedly passed due to heart complications on March 17, 2010. Rajesh recalls how his father always spoke to family members and friends about his support for organ and tissue donation. His father's selfless decision to be an organ and tissue donor ultimately restored sight for two other people with his donated corneas.

More than a decade later, Rajesh has made it his personal mission to inspire others to register as organ and tissue donors. He actively supports NJ Sharing Network's community events, activities and fundraisers to help raise awareness for NJ Sharing Network's life-saving mission.

According to NJ Sharing Network, there are nearly 4,000 New Jersey residents currently waiting for a life-saving transplant, and one



person in New Jersey dies every three days of his corneas to two recipients in need. waiting for a transplant. The following was written by Rajesh to pay tribute to his father and help raise awareness about organ and tissue donation transplantation in our local communities:

My father, Sham C. Karnani, was born in India and migrated to New York in the 1970s. He came to America to help ensure that his family has a better life, and he worked as an importer of garments shipped from India and sold to prospective buyers in the U.S.

I can talk about my father for hours - about the great businessman he was, how he supported and loved his family so much, or how he would put other people's happiness over his own. His passion in life was service to his fellow man/woman. What motivated him in life was to make sure that those around him were happy. He was always determined to pay it forward in some way.

He was (and still is) not only my role model, but an inspiration, to me and to everyone who had the pleasure of knowing him. He taught me so much - how we are fortunate enough to live a good life, and so it is our responsibility to do our best to help others less fortunate do so too.

My father's major passion for the last two decades of his life was to spread the awareness of organ and tissue donation. His message to others was simple: Organ and tissue donation saves and enhances lives.

My father would often say, "When it comes down to it, we can't take our organs on our journey to heaven. We don't need them, so why not give others the opportunity to complete the rest of their journey in the present."

On March 17th, 2010, my father unexpectedly passed away while in a temple on a holy day (our Indian new year). He was dancing with the love of his life, my mother. I am proud to say that, upon his death, my father was able to donate both

My father kept a journal of his thoughts that we found after he passed away. His writings confirmed how much faith he had and how passionate he was about donation and transplantation. In the journal, he called it "recycling of organs for the benefit of mankind."

He noted that he believed that most people would want to make the selfless decision to donate their organs and tissue upon death. However, he believed that the biggest barrier is that most people do not let their family members know about their choice to donate. He noted that if only person just lets their family knows, about their wishes, countless number of lives can be saved.

My father was also a very spiritual person. He once was able to ask one a spiritual leader his thoughts on the subject of organ and tissue donation. We all remember the spark and happiness in my Dad's eyes, when this spiritual leader, declared that organ and tissue donation is "the best gift anyone can give to their fellow man or woman."

It has been difficult for us to move on without my father here. Each day, I still expect him to walk through the door. However, I feel comfort in knowing that the gift of sight my father gave helps justify the passion he had all those years on how organ and tissue donation really is the best service we can provide to others. That passion has now been passed down to me.



52 MARATHONS IN 52 DAYS TO RAISE AWARENESS OF CLEAN WATER

Scotch Plains native, James Leitner, on June helped 1st will begin running a marathon a day for 52 days to bring attention to clean water issues in the United States. His goal is to raise \$100,000 for his nonprofit, MissionCleanWater which will complete three clean water projects in New Jersey and two in Uganda. Each day he will complete a marathon in iconic towns that has helped him grow his nonprofit organization.

"Running long distance is the best way to symbolize what people face without clean water. If a five-year-old has to walk 3-5 every day to get water for their family as a normal chore, I can symbolize their journey for just 52 days."

James founded MissionCleanWater in the summer of 2018 and to date has assisted 6 communities and 5 schools in Uganda to gain access to clean water, which approximately

15,000 people. Since 2021, MissionCleanWater has been developing a plan to assist New Jersey communities dealing with lead and chemical contamination in their drinking water. Some communities are less than a 15-minute drive to Scotch Plains!

"I have had clean water my entire life, as I am sure everyone reading this has as well. Imagine having no water in your home or your ability to buy bottled water wasn't possible. Or if your house had water but drinking it meant consuming carcinogenic chemicals that can lead to neurological issues. We can change the world and the communities we live next to together."
