The event honored John A. Thoms, a former mayor of New Providence, who is retiring from the Board of Trustees. Thoms served as a member of the Board from 2010-2022 and was Chair from 2014-2022. His leadership, dedication and service are a cornerstone of the school's history. During his time on the Board, Summit Speech School has seen a more than 50% increase in the children we serve, broadening our scope to reach over 70 school districts throughout New Jersey. John's efforts have helped to raise over \$10 million throughout the years by connecting the school with various corporate sponsors and private benefactors, as well as making many generous personal contributions. John's leadership has been instrumental in Summit Speech School's success!

Our Family Speakers were the parents, Christine and Todd Van Beveren of Somerset. Their son Cooper Van Beveren, graduated from the Preschool Program in 2021 and now receives Itinerant Mainstream Support Services in his hometown kindergarten. The Van Beveren Family shared how Summit Speech School has impacted their own lives, especially in giving Cooper the gift of speech.

We help them learn to listen and talk, without the use of sign language, so they can become full participants in the hearing and speaking world. Our school provides services to children from infancy through high school, throughout New Jersey, using the latest hearing technology coupled with intensive training in speech, language, and listening skills. Our team of professionals has been working harder than ever to overcome the education gaps felt by COVID disruptions. Generous funding from sponsors enables our teachers, therapists, and support staff to create equity and inclusion for our deaf and hard of hearing children so they can attend mainstream schools and succeed in their social relationships, college, and careers.



He volunteered to go to Vietnam to support our great country in the fight against communism. At the time the Navy had a waiting list to go to "Nam". Pete was eventually stationed on The USS Austin LPD4 in Norfolk VA after attending Boiler Technician A school. The USS Austin was an amphibious troop transport ship with 400 sailors and up to 800 Marines. After a 4-year career and attaining an E5 BT2 grade Pete moved on to work the next 42 years at PSE&G.

Pedro "Pete" Lopez was born in Havana Cuba Pete has been an American Legion member for 42 years, and now a member of the New Providence Post 433 for the past 32 years.



GENE PANTALONE TO BE INDUCTED INTO NJFHOF

inducted into the 2022 class of the New Jersey Boxing Hall of Fame as a writer/historian on November 10, 2022. Past inductees include Mike Tyson, Donald Trump, James Braddock, Rubin Hurricane Carter, Gerry Cooney, Marvin Hagler, Mike & Leon Spinks, and Jersey Joe Walcott.

He's been researching since 2000 and has accumulated a significant amount of NJ boxing information and photos. The data has been turned into books and articles on sites such as The Weigh-In Podcast, and the Garden State Legacy.

He single-handedly resurrected Madame Bey and her camp that was located on River Road in Chatham Township, which hosted more than 80 International Boxing Hall of Fame inductees and 14 heavyweight champions from 1923-1968; a rich NJ boxing history that would have been lost. Some of the more famous attendees were Joe Lous, Rocky Marciano, Jack Johnson, Jack

Gene Pantalone of New Providence will be Dempsey, Max Schmeling, Floyd Patterson, and James Braddock. It even garnered international attention and spread the word to Turkey, where Madame Bey was born. The Turkish embassy donated \$10,000 to resurrect a monument in Chatham in her honor.

> His books are available on Amazon and have been reviewed in many prominent boxing publications both in the US and UK. Positive reviews and commentaries on the books have been given by prominent boxing personalities such as Thomas Hauser, Randy Roberts, Frank Stallone, Al Bernstein, Nigel Collins, Ken Hissner, Gordon Marino, and more.

> He was nominated for the 2021 Richard J. Hughes Award, which recognizes outstanding lifetime achievement in the field of New Jersey history. It is given annually to an individual in recognition of a series of contributions in the areas of scholarship, public history, conservation and preservation, and teaching.


