ROBOWARRIORS RETURN HOME TRIUMPHANT

Team 41-RoboWarriors, representing Watchung Hills Regional High School, arrived home on Sunday, April 24th, bringing home the title of FIRST Robotics World Championship Roebling Division Semi-Finalists.

More than 3,300 teams from across the globe participated in the FIRST Robotics 2021-2022 season. High performers all season long, bringing home 2 silver medals and a caché of awards, the RoboWarriors joined with 453 other teams that earned their qualification to the FIRST Robotics World Championships, this year held in Houston, Texas.

Teams had just under 2 months to scratch build an industrial sized robot capable of playing in the season's themed game. "Under strict rules and limited time and resources, teams of high school students are challenged to build industrial-size robots to play a difficult field game in alliance with other teams, while also fundraising to meet their goals, designing a team "brand," and advancing respect and appreciation for STEM within the local community."

Participating teams tackled the hands-on tasks of designing, programming and building a robot, work to train their drive team to maneuver the field and to pick up and transport cargo across the field under enemy defensive plays, offload cargo by shooting into either of two cargo hubs, climb a series of 4 suspended bars at increasing heights and cooperate with their alliance partners to earn ranking points.

During the early season the team brought home 3 coveted awards: Excellence in Engineering, Innovation in Control, Industrial Design. Team families with the assistance of the WHEAT Foundation raced to organize transportation and accommodations for team members to attend the global event and the team's 54th official event since its inception in 1997. The WHEAT Foundation's GoFundMe, found on gofundme.com: WHRHS Team 41 Robotics to World Championship! seeks to help offset the cost of team participants' families who paid those fees personally, as well as the cost of transporting the robot, pit equipment and tools safely to Houston and back.

WHRHS Team 41 descended on Houston, Texas, during the high-school's spring break, joining their competitors for 4 days of intense competition from Wednesday, April 20 through Saturday, April 23, 2022, at the George R. Brown Convention Center. Team battled it out in the Roebling Division. After collecting ranking points and racing up to 4th rank at one point, team bumped teams up and down the ranks during the 127 matches played. The battle ran fast and furious as bots traversed the field, firing at the target and performing lightning-fast offensive and defensive maneuvers.

With a season full of exhilarating wins and challenging losses, Team 41 drove their bot all the way into the semis, among a mere 96 teams still in contention from the original 3,325 teams who participated in the season.

LOCAL YOUTH CAPTURES GOLD MEDAL FOR US SOCCER

The United States u17 women's soccer team participated in the Concacaf Tournament in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic April 23-May 8, 2022. Warren resident Melina Rebimbas was a member and standout of that team that captured the Gold. After defeating their first 5 opponents by the margin of 43-0, the United States was up to the task in the semifinal round defeating Canada 3-0 behind 2 goals from Melina Rebimbas and she scored the game winner in the championship game versus rival Mexico 2-1. Melina finished the tournament with 8 goals. "I was extremely excited to represent my country. Like every little kid growing up playing soccer their dream is to have the opportunity to wear the US crest and this was my dream too... but to be able to score 3 goals in the last two games was nothing that I could have imagined."

Melina began her soccer journey in town playing recreation soccer and soon thereafter she became a member of the travel team and eventually her desire for greater competition took her to the Player Development Academy (PDA). It was at PDA that she began to blossom into one of the elite players in the country. Rebimbas explained, "I was very fortunate to be given an opportunity early to play at PDA. Everyone at PDA is super motivated to be challenged, and they set the bar high for excellence. That expectation of excellence provided me with a

blueprint on what I had to do to be successful."

She is currently ranked 6th nationally in the 2023 graduation class by Top Drawer Soccer and has already committed to playing soccer at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill. Where she will be mentored by Legendary and 23-time national championship coach Anson Dorrance.



THE SPOTTED LANTERNFLY IS HATCHING

Invasive Insect Is a Danger to Trees, Decorative Plantings, and Agriculture

The Somerset County Department of Health is reminding residents to keep an eye out for the invasive spotted lanternfly that has caused damage to residential and agricultural plants and trees throughout the area. Residents are asked to check trees, fences, and other flat surfaces around their homes and neighborhoods for egg masses, as well as grown lanternflies and Stomp Them Out!

The spotted lanternfly is native to China, India, and Vietnam. It was first sighted in the United States in Pennsylvania, and has since spread to surrounding states, including New Jersey. The spotted lanternfly was first discovered in Somerset County in 2019. While not harmful to



humans or animals, this invasive insect feeds on the sap of many different hardwood trees, scrubs, ornamental plants, and has the potential to impact agricultural crops of economic importance such as grape vines, hops, and apple orchards. Feeding damage caused by the spotted lanternfly significantly stresses the affected plants which can lead to decreased health and potential crop loss.

Residents and visitors are advised to keep an eye out for spotted lanternflies and their egg masses and kill them on sight. Destroying spotted lanternfly egg masses before they hatch is the best way to limit their spread. Eggs can be laid on any flat hard surface including metal, wood, and plastic. Egg masses are commonly found on fence posts, telephone poles, lawn furniture, and the underside of tree branches. Egg laying begins in September and continues through November or until the first freeze.

While adult spotted lanternflies do not survive the cold winters, their egg masses do. Beginning in May through June, the eggs will start to hatch and mature through their life stages into adulthood. Join the battle to beat the bug and help us Stomp Them Out!

IF YOU FIND SPOTTED LANTERNFLY EGG MASSES:

Scrape egg masses using scraper cards, or anything else that is hard, tapered and/or flat

Kill eggs by putting them into doubled bags, using alcohol/hand sanitizer, or by smashing

On Monday April 25, 2022, the Gates Avenue Knitters celebrated their 22-year anniversary. The group has been meeting at the Long Hill Township Library, located at 917 Valley Road, Gillette, every Monday from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Everyone is welcome from beginners to experts.

Along with their own projects, the group knits for causes. They knit approximately 500 hats per year and distribute them to soup kitchens. Beginning in November they have a display at the library and the hats are sold as a fundraiser thru March. The group recently presented the library with \$1,300 from the proceeds of the last hat sale, which is the most ever.

The group welcomes donations of yarn and knitting and crocheting supplies. Donations can be dropped off at the Long Hill Township Library any day during business hours.




HONORING THE MEMORY OF A FATHER

Father's Day is a special time of year for Rajesh Karnani of Paramus, NJ. It is a time when he joins his family members to remember his father, Sham C. Karnani, who unexpectedly passed due to heart complications on March 17, 2010. Rajesh recalls how his father always spoke to family members and friends about his support for organ and tissue donation. His father's selfless decision to be an organ and tissue donor ultimately restored sight for two other people with his donated corneas.

More than a decade later, Rajesh has made it his personal mission to inspire others to register as organ and tissue donors. He actively supports NJ Sharing Network's community events, activities and fundraisers to help raise awareness for NJ Sharing Network's life-saving mission.

According to NJ Sharing Network, there are nearly 4,000 New Jersey residents currently waiting for a life-saving transplant, and one person in New Jersey dies every three days waiting for a transplant. The following was written by Rajesh to pay tribute to his father and help raise awareness about organ and tissue donation and transplantation in our local communities:

My father, Sham C. Karnani, was born in India and migrated to New York in the 1970s. He came to America to help ensure that his family has a better life, and he worked as an importer of garments shipped from India and sold to prospective buyers in the U.S.

I can talk about my father for hours - about the great businessman he was, how he supported and loved his family so much, or how he would put other people's happiness over his own. His passion in life was service to his fellow man/woman. What motivated him in life was to make sure that those around him were happy. He was always determined to pay it forward in some way.

He was (and still is) not only my role model, but an inspiration, to me and to everyone who had the pleasure of knowing him. He taught me so much - how we are fortunate enough to live a good life, and so it is our responsibility to do our best to help others less fortunate do so too.

My father's major passion for the last two decades of his life was to spread the awareness of organ and tissue donation. His message to others was simple: Organ and tissue donation saves and enhances lives.

My father would often say, "When it comes down to it, we can't take our organs on our journey to heaven. We don't need them, so why not give others the opportunity to complete the rest of their journey in the present."

On March 17th, 2010, my father unexpectedly passed away while in a temple on a holy day (our Indian new year). He was dancing with the love of his life, my mother. I am proud to say that, upon his death, my father was able to donate both of his corneas to two recipients in need.

My father kept a journal of his thoughts that we found after he passed away. His writings confirmed how much faith he had and how passionate he was about donation and transplantation. In the journal, he called it "recycling of organs for the benefit of mankind."


He noted that he believed that most people would want to make the selfless decision to donate their organs and tissue upon death. However, he believed that the biggest barrier is that most people do not let their family members know about their choice to donate. He noted that if only person just lets their family knows, about their wishes, countless number of lives can be saved

My father was also a very spiritual person. He once was able to ask one a spiritual leader his thoughts on the subject of organ and tissue donation. We all remember the spark and happiness in my Dad's eyes, when this spiritual leader, declared that organ and tissue donation is "the best gift anyone can give to their fellow man or woman."

It has been difficult for us to move on without my father here. Each day, I still expect him to walk through the door. However, I feel comfort in knowing that the gift of sight my father gave helps justify the passion he had all those years on how organ and tissue donation really is the best service we can provide to others. That passion has now been passed down to me.


