# **NATIONAL DOG BITE AWARENESS CAMPAIGN**

U.S. Postal Service

More than 5,400 postal employees were attacked by dogs in the United States in 2021. In New Jersey, there were 137 dog bites in 2020 which declined to fewer than 123 in 2021, knocking the state out of the top ten for incidents.

From nips and bites to vicious attacks, aggressive dog behavior poses a serious threat to postal employees and the public. To highlight the enormity of this serious issue, the U.S. Postal Service is providing information on the do's and don'ts of responsible dog ownership as part of its annual National Dog Bite Awareness Week public service campaign.

## BEING A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER

Dog owners with friendly dogs often expect a friendly reaction from other dogs. However, even friendly dogs will bite, depending on the circumstance. Dogs are primarily territorial in nature and protective of their owners and their owners' property. Defending its territory sometimes means attacking — and possibly biting — the letter carrier. Dog owners are responsible for controlling their dogs. The best way to keep everyone safe from dog bites is to recognize and promote responsible pet ownership.

Most people know the approximate time their letter carrier arrives every day. Securing your dog before the carrier approaches your property will minimize any dog-carrier interactions.

When a letter carrier comes to your home, keep dogs:

- Inside the house or behind a fence; Away from the door or in another room; or On a leash.
- Pet owners also should remind their children not to take mail directly from a letter carrier as the dog may view the carrier as a threat.
- Informed Delivery is a useful tool for dogowning customers. It's a free service that gives customers a digital preview of the mail and packages that are scheduled to be delivered so that they can take precautions and secure their dog when parcels are delivered to the door. "The Postal Service takes the safety of our employees as seriously as we take our commitment to delivering America's mail. Each year, nearly 6,000 employees are attacked by dogs while on their routes," said USPS Occupational Safety and Health Senior Director Linda DeCarlo. "Please deliver for us by being responsible pet owners and make sure your dogs are secured when our carrier comes to your mailbox."

Last year, many attacks reported by letter carriers came from dogs whose owners regularly stated, "My dog won't bite." Dog bites are entirely preventable. One bite is one too many.

# CRANFORD'S JAY BOXWELL CLIMBS THE VFW LADDER TO THE TOP

It hasn't happened at the Cranford VFW in 56 years. A local resident and former Commander of Cranford's VFW Post #335 has been elected to the highest position in the New Jersey Department of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. Cranford's own Jay Boxwell is the new State Commander for New Jersey, a position for which he has been striving for years.

"It was a labor of love," said 56-year-old Boxwell. "The many steps you must go through to get to the top, the untold hours of service, ensures that you are indeed worthy and ready. The position is not only a challenging one but carries with it a ton of responsibility, he added. "The 30,000 members of the VFW are counting on our officers to keep important veterans' issues, such as benefits and healthcare, in front of those leaders of our State and Federal government who sometimes tend to overlook us."

The previous Cranford resident who was also Post #335 and State Commander was former Mayor Vincent Brinkerhoff, ever known as "Brink", who was selected to the State position in 1966.

Boxwell was elected by VFW Post delegates at this year's State Convention, held in Wildwood in June. The convention was attended by well over 400 members and culminated with a large celebratory parade which included a military aircraft flyover.

"Jay is the consummate professional" said current Cranford Post Commander Mark Schwartz

"He has worked tirelessly for the last six years since he started this process, advocating for Veterans," he continued. "The Cranford VFW Post is extremely proud, but not at all surprised, that his hard work has led him to become the State Commander of the New Jersey VFW. His knowledge of VFW bylaws and passion for improving the plight of veterans has greatly benefitted the Cranford VFW and I have no doubt that as State Commander he will do great things for all the veterans of NJ."



# LARGE CROWDS WELCOME BACK CRANFORD'S MEMORIAL DAY PARADE AND CEREMONY AS IT RETURNS TO ITS HISTORIC FORMAT

For 101 years our town has held a Memorial Day Parade and Ceremony to honor our fallen military. In 1946, following WWII, when Cranford lost 57 young men within a four year span, 5000 townspeople came out to pay their respects. Throughout the years that followed, crowd sizes have varied. Two years of Covid-19 restrictions cancelled 2020's parade and gave us a parade and ceremony in abbreviated format in 2021. In 2022, Cranford's traditional parade and ceremony was back, and our townspeople answered our call of "Follow the Parade to the Ceremony" with the largest assembled Memorial Day Ceremony crowd in years.


For many years VFW member and WWII veteran, Bob Greco, would read the names of the 57 of his friends, classmates and teammates who died during WWII. He would always say, "To most of you, they will just be names, but for me, I will see each of their faces. I knew them all". As the years have gone by, many of Cranford's residents who knew these fallen men have either passed on or moved away. With Bob Greco's words echoing in our heads, we realized that it was time to reintroduce all of the men, whose names are engraved on the bronze plaques that stand in Memorial Park, to the new generations of Cranford residents. Six years ago, our parade committee, coined the name "Cranford 86" to represent the total number of Cranford's fallen military, and our mission to reintroduce them


began. Each year, we have instituted a different allows a t-shirt to be custom printed with the means of establishing the identity of each of these 86 men to our community. The scouts have carried Gold Star Flags in our parade since the early 1900's. In our first year, we individualized these flags, each with a streamer bearing the name of one of our 86. Year two was when we began writing a profile for each serviceman, complete with their photo, putting a face to the name. The profiles were bound into an everexpanding spiral booklet and offered at Memorial Park for the first time to the attending public. In year three, vertical street banners were unveiled at Memorial Park and later hung on light posts throughout town, where the faces could now be seen throughout the year. In our fourth year, Covid-19 limited the public expression of our tribute to the Cranford 86 at Memorial Park, so we took to the studio to present an abbreviated version of our Cranford 86 profiles via TV35. This has now become a yearly tradition. Year five was the 100th anniversary of our parade and ceremony, and we created our first T-shirt. Its front design featured the digits 100 creatively filled with the 42 faces that we had unveiled since the inception of the Cranford 86 project. The parade anniversary was covered on CBS News by John Elliott, who graciously brought attention to Cranford's 86 via his thousands of tri-state viewers. And finally, this year, we launched the "My Hero" T-shirts. High-tech digital printing

image of any Cranford 86 street banner. Now a family member or any person that was touched by the story of one of our Cranford heroes, can wear the image of that hero. The wearer would have the ability to share their hero's story, to anyone that may question the image on their shirt.

Of all of the many American towns that have Hometown Hero campaigns on the lamp posts of their streets, only a very few feature the photos and stories of the fallen. We are very proud that in our town of Cranford, in a short period of time, we are approaching the halfway mark of a task that seemed impossible at its inception. The incredible stories that have been uncovered have totally taken all of us, and sometimes even the families of our heroes, by surprise. This year, the ever-growing yearly tribute book volume 1-5 is now 158 color pages and available for a donation, as well as the new "My Hero" T-shirts. We welcome your contribution to our project, via donation for merchandise, banner sponsorship or your knowledge of one of Cranford's 86. We would love to have a Cranford 86 tribute book on every coffee table in our town! We hope that someday, just as Bob Greco did, when our ceremony attendees hear a name, they will see the face as well.



PLAST USA has been assembling IFAK's and shipping the kits to PLAST L'viv, Ukraine, along with additional "Support for Ukraine" projects. Once in Ukraine, the IFAKs are distributed by PLAST groups to Ukrainian Army and Territorial Defense Units, manned and equipped by volunteers, as needed. As Russia's war in Ukraine began, PLAST had established its own Military Support Headquarters to assist Ukraine's fighting forces and to provide

On May 22, 2022, Scouts and parents from humanitarian aid to affected populations. The distribution of medical kits is a key part of that assistance.

In March, 2022, Troop 75 had contacted PLAST leadership in the Whippany district to discuss different ideas for support. PLAST Whippany started a local initiative to assemble, ship and distribute IFAK's to Ukrainian casualties, and has shipped at least 4,000 IFAK's to date (PLAST Whippany continues the support to this day).

PLAST Ukrainian Scouting Organization, was formed in 1911, in L'viv, Ukraine. PLAST follows the guidelines of General Baden-Powell's 1908 original Scout Handbook, "Scouting for Boys".

PLAST has many members all over the world, and as an example, I have been a member since 1966.





# **CAPITAL CAMPAIGN TO "BUILD DIGNITY FOR ALL"**

#### St. Joseph Social Service Center

St. Joseph Social Service Center, one of the largest social service agencies in Union County, has launched a \$1,200,000 capital campaign. The purpose of the campaign is to improve and expand services for families and children in need in Elizabeth and to fulfill its vision to serve the homeless and poor with compassion and dignity.

Even before the pandemic, St. Joseph's witnessed a rise in demand for services. This trend stretched the capacity of the agency's facilities and created challenges for staff and volunteers. We believe that it is vital for our clients to receive food, clothing, supplies and support services in an environment that fosters dignity, where the homeless and poor are truly welcomed as brothers and sisters. In order to

achieve this goal and expand and improve the health counseling, job training and case services we offer, we have developed a vision for a remodeled campus. Our vision is to construct a new building on our property where it will be possible to create a client choice food pantry with hours by appointment; to construct a second new building for the donation and distribution of clothing and home goods; to reconfigure and pave our lot to make it easier to pick up and drop off items and to reduce traffic on the surrounding streets; and to renovate space in our former church building, parish hall and house on site to improve the ability of St. Joseph's and The Elizabeth Coalition House the Homeless, our sister agency, to provide support services."

"St. Joe's has been open six days a week throughout the pandemic" stated Harold Kessler, President of the Board of Trustees. "We have never missed a day. Our staff and volunteers have placed the needs of the community in Elizabeth ahead of their own health and well-being. It's been extraordinary." Six days a week a dedicated team of volunteers, numbering in the thousands, makes sandwiches for the hungry in their kitchens in Westfield, Cranford, Basking Ridge and dozens of other communities, bring food, clothing and home goods, serve meals at the soup kitchen and help with the operations of the agency. St. Joseph's provides over 250,000 meals per year. In addition, the organization provides area residents with clothing, household items, prescription assistance, health screenings, mental

management.

To make a reservation, download the free Cranford PD app and click on "NJMVC Mobile Unit". If anyone has accessibility issues with our online sign ups, they can contact us directly at 908-272-8989 or 908-709-4313.

The Mobile Unit can serve up to 40 customers, with an additional 10 customers to be placed on a standby list.

Here are some services that may be provided by the Mobile Unit:

- Driver License renewals can be processed within six (6) months of expiration and upgrading to the REAL ID driver license.
- Registration renewals, Veteran Handicap and Purple Heart recipients' placards.
- Permits and Non-Driver ID.
- License plate drop-offs are also allowed and do not count against the number of customers we can serve during the event.
- REQUIRED: Six (6) points of ID is required and a social security card. Those who do not possess a social security card or an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) may submit an affidavit form which can be found on the MVC website www.njmvc.gov. In place of a social security card, a customer can present a W2 from the past tax year (2020), a current pay stub (number cannot be redacted), or a 1099 form. Only listed can be used as replacements for a social security card.

The Garden Helpline volunteers are well trained to identify tick\* species including 'deer ticks' which transmit Lymes disease to humans and pets.


This is an extremely valuable service as the deer and tick populations continue to grow in New Jersey.

The Asian Lantern-fly invaded Union County last spring and has already damaged many fruit trees and vines. The Helpline will keep you updated on the latest information how to control this colorful but destructive leaf hopper.

In addition to garden critters the Helpline will identify house infesting insects such as carpenter ants, termites and food infesting pest.
