Fanwood Fire Department firefighters Kris Piccola, Brian Piccola, Ken Gorman, Dante Clausen, Nick Tripodi and Bruce Padulsky for their work at a motor vehicle accident in which a civilian was freed after being

trapped between two cars that collided. All are volunteers.

Scotch Plains Police Lt. David Smith, presented by Chief Ted Conley, who cited Smith's good humor, excellent management skills and humility as he goes about the important administrative work that allows the SPPD to function smoothly, have a robust social media presence and have good relationships with with other Township departments.

Scotch Plains Rescue Squad EMT Thomas "TJ" Walsh, presented by Chief Dan Sullivan who cited his enthusiasm and his many call responses. Walsh is a volunteer as are all members of SPRS.

Scotch Plains Fire Capt. Tyler Bowman, presented by Battalion Chief Dennis Hercel who said Bowman surpassed all expectations, is a great leader and role model to fellow firefighters. SP firefighters are also volunteers.

Mayor Colleen Mahr was in attendance and called the first responders "the backbone of both of our communities. As the granddaughter of a fire chief and a first cousin of a police officer, I understand the sacrifices made when you choose to serve your community in this way."

BOY SCOUT MICHAEL MAHAFFEY HONORS LOST MARINE

Borough of Fanwood

Marine Corporal Robert Wood, a casualty of the Vietnam War, was memorialized on May 28, 2022, with a sign naming a portion of Paterson Road in his honor. Wood was born in Fanwood, a fact that was lost following the war until just recently, thanks to a local Boy Scout.

Michael Mahaffey, a junior at Union Catholic High School, researched Corporal Wood's background for his Eagle Scout project. It turned out that Wood was never acknowledged as a Fanwood native because his place of birth was mistakenly listed as Georgia where he moved to live with his brother many years ago. Mahaffey followed the trail of historic



information until confirming that Wood was born in Fanwood and spent his childhood here. The project culminated with the unveiling of a street sign honoring Cpl. Wood at the intersection of Paterson Road and Martine Avenue.

Mahaffey was joined at the ceremony by Mr. Wood's brother Richard, 91, who drove up from Virginia, fellow scouts from Troop 203, a U.S. Air Force honor guard and the entire Fanwood-Scotch Plains Memorial Day Committee. Mayor Colleen Mahr made remarks.

Fanwood Councilwoman Kathy Mitchell and Scotch Plains Councilman Matt Adams attended, along with many local residents.







The Fanwood-Scotch Plains Service League, operators of The Thrift Shop at 1741 East Second Street in Scotch Plains, donated \$50,000 to local community organizations and student scholarship winners as part of their ongoing commitment to give back to our local community.

Of the total money disbursed for 2022, \$18,000 was allocated for college scholarships to six Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School seniors and one current college student. Recipients include Jazlyn Navarro-Jimenez Riefler (Harvard), Gianna (Stockton University), Victoria Solsky (Carnegie Mellon), Molly Sullivan (LaSalle), Kaitlyn Mohabir (Rutgers University), Isaiah Nathaniel (MIT), and Evelyn Liang (a sophomore at Rutgers University).

Grants were distributed to 19 worthy organizations who applied for consideration, with a full listing of those who benefited from these grants available for viewing in The Thrift Shop. Including these 2022 donations, the Fanwood-

Scotch Plains Service League has donated nearly \$1.5 million to organizations in Fanwood, Scotch Plains and other Union County communities and to scholarships for local students—since the organization's inception in July 1973.

This monetary support is due entirely to members of the community who have consistently donated goods that they no longer need or want to be re-sold at the Thrift Shop, and to a tireless group of volunteers who run the shop and keep it one of the cleanest, best-stocked and reasonably priced resale stores in the area. The Thrift Shop helps the environment and the community by recycling merchandise that still has a useful life, plowing all monetary proceeds outside of operating expenses back in support of our community.

In its auxiliary role, CAP operates a fleet of 555 single-engine aircraft and 2,250 small Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) and performs about 90% of all search and rescue operations within the contiguous United States as tasked by the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center. CAP's 56,000 members also perform homeland security, disaster relief, and other missions at the request of federal, state, and

CAP also has a "Cadet Program" designed for youth who want to serve the community. The cadet program challenges the youth to excel in leadership, character, physical training, and discipline. Also, the cadet program provides education in: aerospace, STEM education, military traditions, emergency service, educational camps, orientation flights, and many more activities.

Students 12 to 18 years old can join CAP with the understanding to follow Air Forcestyle traditions and discipline and provide community service. The Cadet Program meets after school hours. In addition, adults can join CAP to serve the public and mentor the cadets. Adults could take training and duties to support the Air Force-Auxiliary.
