

Please note that all communication between the social worker and pantry manager, Annette Romano, as well as its volunteers is strictly confidential. Food drop-offs can be made at the resident's home or arranged for a more discreet



The pantry accepts monetary donations which are exchanged for gift cards to local supermarkets, then distributed to food pantry recipients. 

GIRLS' CHESS TOURNEY POWERED BY U.N. GRANT

On Sunday May 29, 2022, the 2022 JL All-Girls Chess Tournament took place at the Westfield YMCA, under the auspices of the Westfield Chess Club, considered one of New Jersey's most celebrated chess clubs. The goal of this event was to further chess for girls in the local region. This event was the brainchild of Jessica Lee, a high school student from Mountain Lakes, who won a grant to run this tournament through the United Nations Foundation. Lee has been playing chess since age 5 ½ and wanted to introduce the game she loves to girls, since they tend to be underrepresented in chess.

Lee recounts that the vast majority of players she has encountered in tournaments have been male players. "Usually at a tournament there are only a handful of girls... I would love to see this change." At her high school, she is the only girl in her chess club. She feels this is a shame because she has derived so many benefits from chess. "Chess teaches you so many things: patience, resilience, analytics, and goal-setting." She and her twin brother, Justin, who also plays chess, have had years of chess lessons, chess camps, and have attended nearly 300 tournaments. At many events, where there were prizes for "mixed doubles," meaning a team of a male and a female, she would get many offers to be on a team, because there were so few girls relative to boys.

On Sunday, Lee gave a chess introduction lecture to about 15 girls, many of them very young, with the youngest age 6 years, reviewing the basic tenets of chess. Following that, there were practice games, a tournament with rated and unrated sections, with pizza, cookies, and chips offered. Finally, each girl went home with their own portable chess set.

MAIN STREET PEDESTRIAN MALL - RECOGNIZED

Explore Millburn-Short Hills is the 2022 Winner of Excellence in Placemaking

Courtesy photo Each year Downtown New Jersey recognizes New Jersey's best downtown projects and programs completed within the last two years, as well as individuals dedicated to downtown revitalization. Downtown Excellence awardees are considered exemplary models worthy of emulation. Explore Millburn-Short Hills received the award for Excellence in Placemaking for the Main Street Pedestrian Mall on Tuesday evening, May 24th at an awards ceremony at the Lions Roar Brewing Company in Westfield. Explore shared the stage with award winners from Montclair, Hackensack, West Orange, Dunellen, Somerville, Hoboken and Perth Amboy.

As the Covid-19 pandemic continued to rage into the Spring of 2021, the Township of Millburn and its Special Improvement District -Explore Millburn-Short Hills - created a pedestrian mall along Main Street in the heart of Downtown. With Main Street closed to vehicles each weekend, Explore managed an immensely popular music and entertainment program. The pilot was such a success that a 24/7 closure was approved between early July and Labor Day. An additional weekend closure was put in place between Labor Day and Halloween that featured acoustic music during Sunday brunch.


Explore encouraged restaurants and stores to embrace outdoor dining and install seating, flowers and even potted trees and firepits. Explore developed a "Games on Main" concept, which included cornhole boards, a giant Connect Four board, and other games for children and adults. 2022 will see an expansion of the program with plans for outdoor yoga and exercise classes, art demonstrations and other community events during "non-peak" hours.

Committeeman Richard Wasserman, a founding board member of Explore, noted that "we created the SID during the pandemic to drive economic development in our community. Supporting an exciting pedestrian experience on Main Street has demonstrated our commitment to business recovery." An effective SID needs to play many roles and Wasserman added, "the excitement on Main Street has undoubtedly increased the positive perception of Millburn and played a part in reducing our commercial vacancy rate by 53% in 18 months and recruiting nearly 50 new businesses to our town in that timeframe"

"Explore" is an independent 501c3 non-profit organization that serves as the Special Improvement District (SID) for the town. Established by the Township Committee in August 2020, the SID encompasses five distinct commercial areas and serves nearly 500 businesses.

TROOP 17 WELCOMES NEWEST EAGLE SCOUTS

recently gathered at St. Rose of Lima Church in Short Hills to honor the Troop's four newest Eagle Scouts: Ander Berman, a 15-year-old freshman at Millburn High School; Patrick Ragno and Taylor Brentjens, 18-year-old seniors at St. Peter's Prep, and Matthew Faughnan, an 18-year-old senior at Oratory Prep.

Guests of honor who addressed the audience and presented the awards included Millburn Mayor Maggee Miggins and Deputy Mayor DianneThall-Eglow, Trustee of the Knights of Columbus, Council 6386, Fred Hrinuk, and Troop 17 Committee Chairperson GraceAnn Bisig. Monsignor Harahan of St. Rose of Lima Church gave the invocation.

Attaining the rank of Eagle Scout is an extraordinary achievement that bears testament to years of hard work, dedication and service. Less than 5 percent of all Scouts achieve the rank of Eagle Scout. Ander Berman represents the fourth generation of Eagle Scouts in his family, and Matthew Faughnan is the second generation and seventh Eagle Scout in his family.

Each Eagle Scout candidate is required to Scout BSA Troop 17 and their families earn a minimum of 21 merit badges and complete an Eagle Scout project before his or her 18th birthday. Scouts who earn an additional five merit badges earn a Palm pin in addition to the Eagle medal. This year Matthew Faughnan earned a Palm with his Eagle.

> The service projects completed by the scouts benefit the community at large.

> Ander Berman's Eagle project involved the painting and refurbishing the St. Joseph's Food Pantry building in Maplewood, as well as organizing a food collection and distribution.

> Patrick Ragno's Eagle project consisted of assisting in the rehabilitation and outfitting of a dormitory for girls in a school run by the Sisters of the Holy Family in Liberia, West Africa.

> Taylor Brentjens made winter shelters for community cats for St. Hubert's Animal Welfare Center.

> Matthew Faughnan built 21 bog bridges in the Wildflower and Forest Preserve in the South Mountain Reservation.

> With this year's four Eagle recipients, Troop 17 has now produced an impressive total of 148 Eagle Scouts since its founding in 1945.
