GARDEN HONORS BELOVED LONG-TERM PATIENT

Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital time. Rahway now has a garden honoring Everett Duchin of Colonia, a beloved hospital patient.

"When we first discussed it, it was going to be a bench and tree," joked Everett's brother Eric of South Plainfield. Everett's immediate family, together with friends and extended family, started a GoFundMe page to raise money. The Everett Howard Duchin Memorial Garden now includes several ornamental trees, flowering plants, and benches circling the hospital's familiar gazebo.

"We thank the Duchin Family and their many friends for providing a beautiful place for family, friends and staff," said Hospital President Kirk Tice.

Everett Duchin was 41 when he passed away at home in 2021. An infection during infancy had left him severely brain damaged requiring 24/7 care. As an adult, he sometimes needed a ventilator to help him breathe.

His family was devoted to his care. He was often hospitalized for weeks and months at a

"My mom spent many a night in a chair by his bedside at the hospital," Eric recalled. "He was hospitalized so often, we said he should have a wing."

Everett, called Evi, was beloved by hospital staff, who would comb his hair, play with him or just come in to visit, recalled Everett's mother, Arleen Duchin. "He had a great smile," recalled Nurse Theresa Dobbin. "And he really loved Teddy Ruxpin," an animatronic toy bear that talked.

In a touching ceremony in front of the hospital's signature gazebo, Arleen Duchin thanked the hospital staff, hospital administration and Hospital President Kirk Tice, her family and all the family's many friends for contributing to the garden.

"This gift from the Duchin family created a beautiful space for people to take a moment in their day," said Vice President of Development Heather Hays.

RAHWAY'S SPECIAL CONNECTION TO THE 4TH OF JULY

Americans across the United States celebrate July 4th as the moment in history when our country declared its independence from Great Britain in 1776. We mark the day with parades, picnics, and fireworks and it's easy to forget the fifty-six brave gentlemen who signed their names on a piece of parchment bearing the title, The Unanimous Declaration of The Thirteen United States of America. For each of the signers, it was a momentous expression in which they committed their lives, their fortunes and their sacred honor to the noble cause of liberty. One of these courageous patriots was Abraham Clark.

Clark was born and raised in Roselle and as a young man worked as a surveyor. This field led him to the study of law, a profession he could employ to settle land disputes and property titles. A good deal of his business was transacted in the larger village of Rahway where he became known as the "Poor Man's Counselor." His family also traveled to Rahway on Sundays to worship in the small Presbyterian Church which stood on St. Georges Avenue.

As the fiery talk of separation from Great Britain began, Clark found that he closely identified with the patriotic cause, and by 1774 had become a bold advocate of independence. Aware of the great dangers in which the colonies were placing themselves, he wrote, "We can die but once . . . We are now embarked in a most tempestuous sea . . . It is gone so far that we must now be a free independent state or a conquered country."

Provincial Congress of New Jersey and in June of the next year he was appointed to the Second Continental Congress which was meeting in Philadelphia.

Clark was well aware of the penalty for treason. Had the British won the war, all signers of the Declaration would have been executed. Fear of this possible fate, however, did not sway him from his obsession to sever relations with the mother country.


During the war years Clark did suffer severe hardships. The Redcoats destroyed all of his property, and two of his soldier sons were captured and held on the notorious prison ship, "The Jersey," a vile, floating jail where thousands of American prisoners perished. The conditions aboard the ship were horrible and the Clark boys suffered special hardships because of their father's connection with the rebels. Clark was

In 1775 his neighbors elected him to the even promised the release of his sons if he abandoned the American cause, but he refused to betray his country.

Clark was unique in that he was the only member of Congress to serve throughout the entire war. He was re-elected three times and was chosen to represent New Jersey at the Philadelphia Convention in 1787. Due to ill health, however, he was unable to attend this famous convention where our Constitution was being framed.

Clark died at the age of sixty-eight and is buried in the Rahway Cemetery. Residents of Rahway and all of Union County should be proud that of the five signers from the New Jersey Colony, only Clark is buried in this part of the state. Abraham Clark is a name out of the rich pages of Rahway history and a name we should remember as we prepare to celebrate the birthday of our country's independence.





TAKING NOTE OF RAHWAY'S BRIDGES

A visitor to Rahway in 1900 made the observation that he had never seen a town the size of this one that had so many bridges. Considering the comment, many might be surprised to learn that in a city of only four square miles there are at least 33 bridges that span the river.

Prior to the time when this area was first being settled by Europeans, around 1680, the landscape

was covered by fields and woodlands. The river followed a meandering course and split into three branches. Due to the way the branches cut through the terrain, four villages, Leesville, Bridgetown, Upper Rahway, and Milton would develop.


It is believed the first bridge, built on what is today East Hazelwood Avenue, was constructed in 1686 to connect Woodbridge to Elizabethtown. It is likely bridges on the King George Highway (St. Georges Avenue) were also built at a very early date. As more roads were eventually laid out, more bridges made of wood and stone were built. An early map indicates that at least 11 bridges had been constructed by 1856 and by 1900 one could count 22 bridges, the newer ones made of concrete and steel.

Most of the bridges that stand today have been reconstructed and/or redesigned several times over the years. Sixteen of the bridges were destroyed or badly damaged during the great flood of September, 1882, the worst in Rahway's history. After destroying the Milton Avenue Bridge, raging waters, travelling at 15-25 miles per hour and carrying lumber, canal boats, and

heavy debris, slammed into the Monroe Street Bridge sweeping one person to his death. Each bridge from Monroe all the way to St. Georges, on both the main branch and the Robinson's Branch, was totally lost or severely damaged. The western half of the St. Georges Avenue Bridge near River Road collapsed. The St. Georges Avenue Bridge that spans the Robinson's Branch, however, was spared any damage. Although the roadbed of this bridge has been reconstructed over the years, its sturdy fourarch concrete foundation and cut-stone guard rails date back to 1873.

During the 1920s, with the speculation that housing would be needed after World War I, streets were laid out in the undeveloped areas in the western parts of the city. Although housing would not be built until the late 1940s, bridges were built on Orchard, Plainfield, Albermarle, Bramhall, Milton Boulevard, and two on Madison Avenue in preparation for development.

Next time you go for a walk or a drive, take notice of the bridges you cross. The number and types might surprise you as they did the visitor to Rahway over 100 years ago.



(above) A railroad bridge was constructed over the river in the 1830s when tracks were first laid in Rahway. In 1875 an iron bridge was built. It was reported to be the first four track iron bridge built in the United States. When the tracks were elevated (1911-1914) this new 3arch concrete bridge was constructed.





The bridge is presently under reconstruction after being damaged by flood waters this past fall. Perhaps, when redesigned, it will be brought back to its original charm.

CARING CONTACT RECEIVES GRANT



GIRLS' CHESS TOURNEY POWERED BY U.N. GRANT

On Sunday May 29, 2022, the 2022 JL All-Girls Chess Tournament took place at the Westfield YMCA, under the auspices of the Westfield Chess Club, considered one of New Jersey's most celebrated chess clubs. The goal of this event was to further chess for girls in the local region. This event was the brainchild of Jessica Lee, a high school student from Mountain Lakes, who won a grant to run this tournament through the United Nations Foundation. Lee has been playing chess since age 5 1/2 and wanted to introduce the game she loves to girls, since they tend to be underrepresented in chess.

Lee recounts that the vast majority of players she has encountered in tournaments have been male players. "Usually at a tournament there are only a handful of girls... I would love to see this change." At her high school, she is the only girl in her chess club. She feels this is a shame because she has derived so many benefits from chess. "Chess teaches you so many things: patience, resilience, analytics, and goal-setting." She and her twin brother, Justin, who also plays chess, have had years of chess lessons, chess camps, and have attended nearly 300 tournaments. At many events, where there were prizes for "mixed doubles," meaning a team of a male and a female, she would get many offers to be on a team, because there were so few girls relative to boys.

On Sunday, Lee gave a chess introduction lecture to about 15 girls, many of them very young, with the youngest age 6 years, reviewing the basic tenets of chess. Following that, there were practice games, a tournament with rated and

unrated sections, with pizza, cookies, and chips offered. Finally, each girl went home with their own portable chess set.

QUEEN ANN'S LACE (WILD CARROT)

Today we are so use to the term 'invasive' relating to plants that arrived in America by that accident we have forgotten that many of our modern weeds were brought here on purpose by colonists who thought they were beautiful.

One great example is 'Daucus carota', also known as wild carrot and Queens Ann's Lace.

Queen Anne's lace, Daucus carota (Family Apiaceae), is a common sight in dry fields, roadside ditches and open areas. There are many explanations for the origin of this common name, including the flower's resemblance to the lace that was fashionable around the time of the British monarch, wife of King James I; because people thought it resembled Queen Anne's lace headdress; 18th-century English courtiers used the flowers as "living lace;" and supposedly because Queen Anne challenged her ladies-inwaiting to a contest to see who could produce a piece of lace as beautiful as the flower, but none could rival her own efforts.

It is also called wild carrot because this is the European plant that cultivated carrots were developed from. It was brought to North America with the colonists as a medicinal plant and is now naturalized throughout the continent.

Seeds germinate throughout the growing season, producing a small rosette of ferny green leaves. The finely divided alternate leaves are tripinnate (the feather-like leaflets are again divided) and the lower leaves are considerably larger than the upper ones. The plant also produces a firm, yellowish, spindly taproot. Although the root is edible when young (but not tasty like its cultivated relatives), the leaves can cause skin irritation in some people, especially those sensitive to celery or chrysanthemums. There are similar looking plants such as poison hemlock or fool's parsley (Conium maculatum) and water hemlock (Cicuta maculata) that are poisonous, so roots. This biennial flowers in its second season, then dies. Hollow branched flower stems grow two to four feet tall, and both the stems and leaves are covered with short, coarse hairs. The attractive, airy two to four inch "flower" is actually a compound flower. Up to a thousand tiny white flowers are produced in lacy, flat-topped clusters (umbels) with a dark, purplish center. As the seeds ripen, the inflorescence curls inward to form a "bird's nest" shape and turns a brownish color. A small bristly seed is produced at the end of each flower stalk, and once dry they readily latch onto fur or feathers to be disseminated beyond where the seeds would otherwise fall.

Queen Anne's Lace is so adaptable that in some habitats it crowds out native species that can't compete with its vigorous growth. Many people consider Queen Anne's lace an invasive weed (it is listed as a noxious weed in at least 35 states), but it is used by some native animals for food. It is a host plant for eastern black swallowtail caterpillars and many butterflies and adult bees and beneficial insects utilize the flower nectar. To reduce the spread of this plant, remove the seedheads before they mature.

The Garden Helpline volunteers are well trained to identify tick* species including 'deer ticks' which transmit Lymes disease to humans and pets.

This is an extremely valuable service as the deer and tick populations continue to grow in New Jersey.

The Asian Lantern-fly invaded Union County last spring and has already damaged many fruit trees and vines. The Helpline will keep you updated on the latest information how to control this colorful but destructive leaf hopper.

In addition to garden critters the Helpline will identify house infesting insects such as carpenter ants, termites and food infesting pest.


FREE STATE PARK ADMISSION
