WHRHS STUDENT CREATES THE BUDDY-UP PROGRAM TO HELP THE ELDERLY

Anmol Bhatia, a Watchung Hills Regional High School junior, created the Buddy-Up Program at Abingdon Care & Rehabilitation Center in Green Brook to help give lonely residents someone to chat with.

Anmol has always been passionate about helping the most needed in healthcare. While volunteering in the activities department last summer at Abington, he realized that most activities were canceled due to Covid, and many residents were very lonely and had few visitors. Bhatia created the Buddy-Up Program to keep lonely residents company by having them chat with community volunteers online.

Anmol's goal of connecting students to residents was a huge success. Community members and students offered to chat with the lonely residents on 30 minuet Zoom calls through iPads provided by the center. "It makes you feel good to help someone else in your community," says Bhatia, who has raised funds to purchase more iPads. "We've had fifty-five volunteers sign up, and nothing but positive reviews from the residents."



HISTORIC PLAQUES PRESENTED TO FIREFIGHTERS

During the May 25, 2022 Long Hill Township Committee meeting, Mayor Matt Dorsi presented a historical marker plaque to each of the two township fire chiefs. The markers will be placed on their respective firehouse.

The plaques show the name of the fire company, the date of their founding, and the date their firehouse was built. Millington's fire chief is Joseph Fronapfel, and Stirling's is John Whitmore.

The plaque program is administered by the Township's Historic Preservation Advisory Committee (HPAC), which is comprised of residents with an interest in historic preservation. HPAC advises the Mayor and Committee on historic preservation matters as well as collects artifacts of historical significance to the township. It provides exhibits of interest in the township office building and in the restored Millington School House that was built in the mid-19th Century, both of which are open to the public on weekdays.

DAR CHAPTER CELEBRATES 125TH ANNIVERSARY

"Celebrating 125 Years of Service" was the theme as members of Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) recently gathered for a belated observance of the chapter's 125th anniversary.

Green Brook Mayor Jim Van Arsdale, DAR State Regent Bonnie Matthews and the State Board of Managers were honored guests at the event held on June 11 at the Dunellen Hotel.

"Today we celebrate our chapter's many accomplishments," said Regent Ashley Salsano. "As we follow in our ancestor's footsteps, we look forward to carrying on their tradition of service."

Continental Chapter was organized on January 23, 1896 in Plainfield and in 2002 merged with Elizabeth Snyder Chapter of Dunellen. Now based in Green Brook, the chapter continues to serve areas of Somerset, Middlesex and Union counties.

At the event, Barbara Navatto of Somerville was honored with a DAR Community Service Award for her years of service to the Somerset County 4-H Program. In addition, a donation of \$300 was presented to the DAR State Regent in support of Semper Fido, an organization that trains service dogs for veterans.

Guests enjoyed a slide show retrospective of chapter history. The chapter is perhaps best known for its leading role in the preservation of Washington Rock in Green Brook. Chapter memorabilia was on display, including gavels made from the wood of the British warship, Augusta, sunk in 1777, and the chapter charters.

A highlight was a musical performance by Patricia Turse, harpist with the Metropolitan Orchestra of New Jersey.

Snyder-Continental Elizabeth Chapter sponsors students in DAR contests that promote the study of American history and good citizenship, collects holiday gifts for hospitalized veterans, and gathers supplies for the Plainfield Area Humane Society. Members support local conservation efforts, patriotic observances, and state and national DAR projects.

Twelve Baskets Food Pantry will be moving to the First Presbyterian Church in Stirling, at 158 Central Ave., for the summer months of July, August, and September. The pantry will be open the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month from 10 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.

Twelve Baskets provides food and various non-perishables to individuals, families, seniors, and Veterans in Long Hill and surrounding areas. A valid driver's license or state ID to verify local address is the only documentation needed. Anyone in need of walk-in hours for emergency appointments can call 908-647-0067 ext. 4 and arrangements will be made. All calls and visits are free and confidential.

Masks are required, and we ask that everyone bring reusable bags for food.

The goal of the pantry is to help supplement families during these difficult times. Donations are accepted and can be placed in our donation barrels located in the side door at All Saints' Church, 15 Basking Ridge Road, Millington. We do ask that food items should not contain high amounts of salt, sugar or highly processed grains. We ask for foods high in protein, healthy fats and whole grains when possible. At this time, avoid pasta and all bulk sizes.

Items such as fresh produce (fruit, veggies), eggs, milk and bread can be accepted after 9:30 a.m. during open Saturdays. In addition, ShopRite card donations are greatly appreciated and will be used to purchase fresh produce, eggs, milk, etc.






