

STRANGERS HELPING STRANGERS

The New Jersey Veterans Network

The New Jersey Veterans Network (NJVN) works with many different organizations to bring food, groceries, and clothes to veteran families in need. One organization they've worked with is Strangers Helping Strangers (SHS). They've provided over 100 meals for veterans and their families while pairing up with the NJVN over multiple projects. SHS itself distributes 20,000 pounds of food in Elmwood Park, NJ.

On Friday, August 12, 2022, Doc Schupp, Director of Veterans Outreach for NJVN, and Dennis Duddie, American Legion Department Vice Commander, presented the Strangers Helping Strangers team with four awards, including a Hero Award for team President Chris Braitsch, a Certificate of Commendation, as well as the Community Service Award, recognizing their continuous support for Veterans and their families. Strangers Helping Strangers was also presented with the Certificate of Appreciation from The Department of NJ State VFW and an NJVN Community Service award.

When asked about the assistance that SHS has provided for the Veteran Community, Doc Schupp said, "This team (SHS) has provided for our State's heroes time and time again, we are blessed to have them as partners."

Strangers Helping Strangers was created during the COVID-19 crisis, and has continued to work with the New Jersey Veterans Network to provide for our veterans. They work closely to provide not only goods for those in need, but they

also give hope in times of crisis. While SHS provides the food and groceries, the NJVN distributes them directly to the veterans homes. It's a wonderful system that has helped improve the lives of so many veterans and their families.

the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will hold their first meeting of the new DAR year on Monday, September 12, 7 to 9 p.m.



Funding is competitive and organizations must demonstrate managerial competency, fiscal stability, excellence in arts programming, and the organizational capacity to execute a proposed program or project. Grant funding may be requested for art programs or series, creative placemaking projects that are accessible to the general public, or general operating support if the mission is solely arts-dedicated. Funding for this grant is contingent on funds made available to the Somerset County Cultural & Heritage Commission by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts in 2023. Match requirements have been waived for 2023.


"We started this podcast as a way to further our community outreach with individuals of all backgrounds about the trends and issues surrounding foster care," said Tracey Heisler, Executive Director of CASA SHaW. "The multifaceted issues and discussions we are having through the CASA Connection reach far beyond just our region and state. We hope that folks throughout the United States, and even the world, find the information we are sharing valuable," said Heisler.

Individuals can subscribe to the CASA Connection podcast on Apple Podcasts, Podbean, Amazon Music, and iHeartRadio. Three episodes have been published to date: CASA 101: What is CASA?, Poverty in Foster Care, and Mental Health in Foster Care. The podcast is hosted by Heisler and CASA SHaW's Director of Community Outreach, Jeff Warren.

Heisler said while smiling, "it's called the CASA Connection for a reason. We want to connect more folks with the many issues that face foster children and families who have challenges." Heisler also said, "The more connection, education, and resources we have, the more we are able to combat the many challenges abused and neglected children face."

CASA of Somerset, Hunterdon, and Warren Counties is part of a statewide network of community-based, non-profit programs that recruit, screen, train and supervise volunteers to "Speak Up for a Child" removed from home due to abuse or neglect. CASA is the only program in New Jersey that uses trained volunteers to work one-on-one with children, ensuring that each one gets the services needed and achieves permanency in a safe, nurturing home.

DEMOCRACY CONVERSATION PROJECT

New Jersey Council for the Humanities

Through November 8, 2022, the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) will be participating in a statewide initiative in partnership with the New Jersey Council for the Humanities (NJCH) called the Democracy Conversation Project.

The goal of the program is to discover what New Jerseyans have to say about the state of our democracy. The tool that SCLSNJ and NJCH are using to collect this information is called Storybox. These Storyboxes provide a place for New Jerseyans to add their voices to the national story with personal reflections on preprinted response cards.

EXPLORING STEAM AT THE LIBRARY

Patrons at the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey's (SCLSNJ) Watchung branch recently explored basic chemistry concepts during a STEAM program by making play dough using general kitchen baking ingredients.

"STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics," said Katie Salerno, youth services librarian. "The Watchung branch hosts monthly STEAM programs intended for children in or entering grades Kindergarten through 5th grade. STEAM programs include hands-on experiments where we discuss expected outcomes and inquire what will happen next as we learn the science behind a topic."

Continued Salerno, "What we learned during this experiment was what to do if the play dough was too wet or too dry. We learned to add more flour if it's too wet and add more water if it's too dry. It was very messy but very fun and informative!"

5TH ANNUAL "CLUBS FOR CABINS" GOLF OUTING

The Arc Foundation of Somerset County

The Arc Foundation of Somerset County will be hosting their 5th Annual "Clubs for Cabins" Golf Outing fundraiser on Monday, September 12, at Raritan Valley Country Club in Bridgewater Twp.

Camp Jotoni, a 15-acre summer camp program for special needs children and adults of all ages, is located at 51 Old Stirling Rd. in Warren Township and owned and operated by The Arc of Somerset County.

Fundraising for Phase 1 & 2 (4 ADA accessible sleeping cabins) began in late 2015, with construction completed in early June 2022 after The Arc Foundation, Board of Trustees and long-term donors and supporters of camp helped raise over 3 million dollars over the course of 6 years.

The four new cabins were put to good use this summer as we returned to near normal operations post COVID-19, welcoming both long-time and first-time campers.
