GIRL SCOUT PROJECT FOCUSED ON FOLAS Cranford Girl Scout Troop 40023

Cranford Girl Scouts Junior Troop 40023 has recently completed the prestigious Girl Scouts Bronze Award through a year-long project focusing on the welfare of animals.

The troop's mission was to help make animals adoptable and to assist with the sheltering and fostering of pets. In so doing, the girl scouts set out by assisting one local shelter, the Friends of Linden Animal Shelter (FOLAS).

First, the girls designed a troop logo, using original artwork. The girl scouts created a pamphlet explaining the benefits of fostering an animal, and important considerations when becoming a foster pet parent.

The girl scouts quickly realized that bringing their ideas to fruition would come with some costs, such as printing their pamphlets, as well as providing a weatherproof mailbox/information center at FOLAS so that the public could easily access the pamphlet. After several discussions on fundraising, the girl scouts decided on holding a garage sale.

Troop 40023 Bronze Award Garage Sale was held at the Cranford Community Center on the day of the Cranford Town Wide Garage Sale, with 100% of the proceeds going toward their Bronze Award Project. The girls were able to raise \$324.

The girls used a portion of the funds to make up 12 adoption kits to donate to the shelter. Each adoption kit included a litter box, scoop, collar, handmade pet toys, bowl, nail clipper, and a personalized thank you note to the adoptive parent. With the remaining funds the girl scouts designed and ordered weatherproof signs to be placed outside the grounds of the shelter.

The group of six girl scouts from Troop 40023 came together in late July, 2022 to present their donations to

FOLAS, and they spent 2 hours weeding and cleaning out the shelter's outdoor dog pen to make the space safer for dogs to run and play.

Collectively, the girl scouts of Troop 40023 contributed approximately 140 hours toward their Bronze Award Project.

Nancy Valdivia, Troop 40023 Girl Scout Leader, is most impressed by the girl scouts' ingenuity and commitment to seeing this project through. "The girls were motivated and invested from the beginning through the very end, never losing sight of their ultimate goal. They created, designed, painted, assembled, organized, crafted, cleaned and carried the project through with such a sense of pride. They rose at every challenge of the project, and they worked beautifully as a team," proudly beams their Troop Leader.

The efforts put forth by Amelia Cippoletti, Sara McCombs, Alana Pugliese, Eliza Rivera, Aurelia Samson, and Macy Valdivia under the mentorship of Mr. James McCombs, Girl Scout Troop parent volunteer, have not gone unnoticed. In the two weeks following the troop donations, seven cats have been placed in adoptive homes, and they were lovingly provided with the adoption kits that the scouts donated. Tina, a FOLAS staff member, is most appreciative of how Troop 40023 helped to make the shelter easier to find, more inviting, and a happier place for all to visit.

GARDEN HONORS BELOVED LONG-TERM PATIENT

Rahway now has a garden honoring Everett Duchin of Colonia, a beloved hospital patient.

"When we first discussed it, it was going to be a bench and tree," joked Everett's brother Eric of South Plainfield. Everett's immediate family, together with friends and extended family, started a GoFundMe page to raise money. The Everett Howard Duchin Memorial Garden now includes several ornamental trees, flowering plants, and benches circling the hospital's familiar gazebo.

"We thank the Duchin Family and their many friends for providing a beautiful place for family, friends and staff," said Hospital President Kirk Tice.

Everett Duchin was 41 when he passed away at home in 2021. An infection during infancy had left him severely brain damaged requiring 24/7 care. As an adult, he sometimes needed a ventilator to help him breathe.

His family was devoted to his care. He was often hospitalized for weeks and months at a time.

"My mom spent many a night in a chair by his bedside at the hospital," Eric recalled. "He was hospitalized so often, we said he should have a wing."

Everett, called Evi, was beloved by hospital staff, who would comb his hair, play with him or just come in to visit, recalled Everett's mother, Nurse Theresa Dobbin. "And he really loved Teddy Ruxpin," an animatronic toy bear that talked.

Doug Harris is receiving the Boy Scouts of America 2022 National Outstanding Eagle Scout Award at the event.

The event recognizes outstanding citizens for their community service, as evidenced by their leadership and interests within the Union County community, and for their embodiment of the values of the century old Scout Oath and Law in their personal and professional lives. The event co-chairs are Nancy DiLiegro and Gene Jannotti, past Lifetime Achievement Award recipients and active volunteers in the Union County community.

The Union County Historical Society is pleased to host Dr. Walter E. Boright for a program entitled "Union County's Reign of Terror" on Sunday, October 2 at the Cranford Community Center, 220 Walnut Avenue, Cranford. As seating is limited, an advance reservation for this free event is suggested by emailing the society with the number attending at uncohissoc1@gmail.com.

The presentation centers on a Union County man who earned infamy as one of the most notorious killers in the state of New Jersey. His rampage in the 1950s into the 1970s began with grave desecration and arson, and escalated to rape, murder, and cop killing. He was not linked to some of his crimes until decades after they were committed. This serial killer eventually was convicted of murder and imprisoned for life where he later died of natural causes.

Union County Historical Society President

Joanne Rajoppi said, "We are excited to have Dr. Boright, a noted author and historian, review the history of these crimes for the Society's program. Dr. Boright is a respected, well-known author of six local history books and nearly 200 published articles about local, county, and New Jersey State history," she added.

Dr. Boright earned a bachelor's degree as a history major from Kean University in Union where he also taught New Jersey history. He taught history in Clark schools and became a New Jersey superintendent of schools. He earned master's and doctoral degrees at Seton Hall University. He served as a Kenilworth councilman and was elected five times to the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders (now the Board of Commissioners). Dr. Boright has presented many programs to schools and organizations about local, regional, and New Jersey history.
