

FORMER MAYOR MAUREEN OGDEN PASSES

MILLBURN TOWNSHIP

Former Mayor Maureen Ogden, who served as Millburn Township's first female Mayor from 1979 to 1981 and dedicated decades of her life to public service, passed away in August at age 93.

"Mayor Ogden was a tireless and passionate public servant for Millburn Township residents", said current Mayor Maggee Miggins. "She was a pioneering advocate for environmental causes and wetlands preservation. The Township has lowered our flags to half-staff to honor her memory."

Ogden went on to serve seven terms in the New Jersey General Assembly between 1982 and 1996. She chaired the Assembly Committee on Conservation, Energy and Natural Resources as well as the Assembly Arts, Tourism and Cultural Arts Committee and the Assembly Environment Committee.

Ogden was a staunch champion for the environment during the 14 years she served on the State Assembly. During her tenure she authored major legislation to protect watersheds and wetlands. In 1994, Ogden created a \$350 million fund for the purposes of preserving open space, farmland, and historic preservation.

"Assemblywoman Ogden was a passionate supporter of the arts and steadfast champion of the environment," said Governor Phil Murphy. "As we honor her legacy as a leader and trailblazer, we commemorate her many

achievements in State politics and conservationism."

Ogden's husband, Bob, passed away in 2010. She is survived by her three sons, including former Summit Councilperson Henry Ogden, and her grandchildren.

The Township of Millburn offers its sincere condolences to her family and loved ones.



pilot oxygen masks, nausea-inducing spinning machines and other intriguing high-tech equipment. The program, held this July at Columbus Air Force Base in Mississippi, is called Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training Familiarization Course and gives cadets a one-week taste of what Air Force pilot candidates learn over the course of a year. Thirty-one cadets came to participate from as far away as Alaska and Puerto Rico; Bikales was one of just two participants from the Northeast.

In Civil Air Patrol, Bikales is referred to as Cadet Second Lieutenant Elias Bikales, as he has moved up in rank and become a commissioned cadet officer during his more than three years of membership. His squadron, Curtiss-Wright Composite Squadron, is based at the American Red Cross Building in Fairfield.

Separately, Bikales is working toward a glider pilot license, and hopes to begin learning to fly powered aircraft next year. He may use this

summer's training toward a career in aerospace engineering, civilian or military piloting or other fields with an aviation focus.

Bikales' other passion is classical music; he is a violist with the Ravina Orchestra based in Columbia High School in Maplewood, as well as with the Millburn High School orchestral program. By sheer coincidence, he was privately tutored by Flora Yousefi for years before she was named head of MHS orchestral education program.

Interested in Civil Air Patrol? The Cadet Program for 12- to 18-year-olds meets every Tuesday from 7-9 p.m. at The American Red Cross Building in Fairfield. Adults can also join CAP to serve the public in Emergency Services and to support the cadet program.

SEPTEMBER IS FALL PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH

Stats about falling:

- About 36 million falls are reported **Assess the Environment** among older adults each year—resulting in more than 32,000 deaths.
- Each year approximately 3 million older adults are treated in emergency departments for a fall injury.
- One out of every five falls causes an injury, such as a broken bones or a head injury.
- are hospitalized for hip fractures.

While older adults are at highest risk for • Ask individuals to avoid walking in sustaining a serious injury due falls, everyone is at risk. The good news is, proper understanding and a plan can often prevent falls from occurring.

As people age they experience natural aging. It is common for older adults to experience stiff joints, poor eyesight, and decreased muscle strength along with poor balance. Natural aging along with some chronic conditions can increase their risk of falling. Fall prevention begins with accessing the environment as well as the older adult's health condition.

Tips for assisting in preventing fall:

- Remove clutter from pathways.
- Arrange furniture to make rooms easy to navigate.
- Remove or secure throw rugs.
- Use assistive devices to retrieve items Medications. from high shelves.
- Use a cane when walking on uneven surfaces.
- Each year at least 300,000 older people Encourage individuals to wear shoes with non-slip soles.
 - stocking feet on wood floors.
 - Replace shoelaces that tie with elastic ones that will not come untied and present a tripping hazard.
 - Organize the house so items used most frequently are at waist level, minimizing the need to bend or climb.
 - Apply high-contrast colored tape to top and bottom of stairs and thresholds.
 - Make sure the home and stairway lighting is adequate.
 - Use a night light and/or leave a light on in the bathroom to reduce the risk of falls in the dark.

• Encourage individual to use walking aids (canes, walkers).

Health issues linked to falls:

- Dehydration.
- Poor vision.
- Chronic conditions such as cataracts, arthritis, and Parkinson's disease.
- Alzheimer's and dementia.
- Poor nutrition.
- Insomnia.

It is important to understand a person's history with falls and changes in condition such as mobility, weight loss, nutrition and mental ability. Although it is impossible to prevent all falls, encouraging daily exercise to increase or maintain physical strength can help lessen the possibility.




