ALL-GIRL BSA TROOP CONQUERS 96-MILE ADVENTURE

BSA Troop 280 Scout of Chatham, NJ
In August, Troop 280, Chatham's all-girls BSA
Troop, sent its very first crew to the Philmont
National Scout Reservation in New Mexico to
complete a 96-mile, high altitude 9-day adventure
trek. The crew leader was Azniv Basralian and
the expedition included Lucine Basralian,
Isabelle Demakos, Sabrina Wang, Sasha
Crabtree, Maria DiPasquale, and Sofia
Maciejewski. Adult advisors were Scoutmaster
Daniele Basralian and Assistant Scoutmasters

The trip began with a 2-day stay in Colorado Springs, during which time the crew acclimated to high altitudes while visiting Red Rocks Amphitheater and Park, The Garden of the Gods, and Pikes Peak. After going white-water rafting on the Arkansas River, the crew headed to the Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, New Mexico.

Philmont Scout Reservation is 140,000 acres (about 20-times the size of the Great Swamp) and is celebrated for its Old-West-themed adventure backpacking treks and programs, which include black powder rifle shooting, spar pole climbing, blacksmithing, forestry service, backcountry campfires, and dozens of others. After an arduous hike each date, Scouts locate a suitable campsite and take advantage of the program there.

Throughout the trek, their backpacks weigh approximately 50 pounds each, including personal gear, Troop gear, food and water. Every night the Scouts sanitized water, cooked, cleaned, strung up bear bags to keep animals out of their campsite, and planned their hiking route for the next day. Everybody had a role to fulfill. Through this experience, this crew of girls has grew closer together, just as they grew as individuals. Prior to the trip, they trained multiple times a month by going on shakedown hikes, but nothing would compare to the mountains they climbed in New Mexico.

The crew woke up by 5:00 a.m. to get on the trail early. On the day they hiked to Baldy Mountain peak at 12,441 feet altitude, Scouts woke up as at 4:30 a.m. Temperatures ranged from the low 40s to over 80 degrees, and rain was



unpredictable. Going up was rough, but definitely worth it due to the scenery and the accomplishment.

The Scouts said the Philmont expedition helped build their patience and understanding. While on trail everyone had to work together as a team, and not as individuals. Lucine Basralian, our Scout filling the Chaplain's Aid role, helped keep morale high. Nightly the Scouts would discuss "roses, buds, and thorns" from the day, which allowed them to reflect and plan ahead. The crew also sang the Philmont Hymn each day, which helped keep everyone in a positive mindset.

Inside many groups, there's a sometimes "storming stage," but the scouts encouraged each other to avoid it. "We only had a brief stage of 'storming,' and it lasted only a day," said Lucine Basralian. "Then we moved quickly to 'norming' and 'performing' faster than ever. We just told each other to talk to the rocks" in moments when that would be helpful.

Also in the Summer of 2022, BSA Troop 280 sent a crew of eight girls to a six-day whitewater rafting adventure that covered more than 50 miles in the New River Gorge. Base Camp was the Summit-Bechtel National Scouting Reservation in West Virginia. The first few days of whitewater rapids were spent on ducky boats, which are inflatable individual kayaks. The last day was spent on a Class 4 whitewater in a larger raft. Also this summer, Troop 280 sent 18 Scouts to Onteora Scout Reservation in New York State, where the girls earned more than 75 BSA Merit Badges and achieved many high honors.

Troop 280 is an all-girls BSA Troop in Chatham. They meet on Thursday nights and have at least one adventure weekend per month. FLINTLOCKS READY FOR ACTION

The Flintlocks, BSA, Inc. are a group of retired scouters who dedicate their time and talents to helping the Boy Scout Camps in northern New Jersey. They annually donate approximately 5,000 hours of skilled labor to the scouts. The group includes many tradesmen, but also volunteers of every background. Most are retired, but some still work full time, and occasionally people volunteer to help for a day here and there. It is a very friendly group with a good sense of humor. When one member reached age 100, they designated a parking spot reserved for all Flintlocks over 100 years old.

The Flintlocks meet every Thursday at Camp Winnebago, Rockaway, NJ, all year round. They are organized as a 501c3 non profit corporation. All of the members are registered with the BSA. They provide a variety of skilled services to the Council. They have built cabins, picnic tables, painted the dining hall, built the archery range, built all the structures at the waterfront, financed, built and equipped the STEM Lab at Allamuchy Scout Reservation, repaired damage to camp structures, etc. In addition to building structures and doing repairs and maintenance, they also volunteer at many Council activities throughout the year. More than half of the Flintlocks have been awarded the Silver Beaver or have received other Council and National Awards. They typically provide approximately 5,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor every year. Previous years

were interrupted by COVID shutdowns, and the camps were not operational some summers, but now the Flintlocks are all vaccinated and have been back to work. The Council most recently opened the summer Scout camps again, and the Flintlocks have brought them up to code to receive campers.



DOCUMENTING VETERANS OF THE "FORGOTTEN WARS"

County of Morris

The signing of the Korean Armistice Agreement 69 years ago on July 27, 1953, officially ended the brutally destructive, large scale military actions that defined the Korean War, which left more than 5 million dead after three years.

But no peace treaty was ever signed, and hostilities continued over the decades, particularly from October 5, 1966 to December 3. 1969, when North Korea launched dozens of violent, armed incursions into South Korea. United States military personnel were on the ground to repel the attacks each time, and they have remained there with nearly a hundred Americans making the ultimate sacrifice in what are called America's "Forgotten Wars."

Morris County's Office of Planning and Preservation is documenting its "Veterans of the Z," those who served in the formal Korean War and those who have served since 1953 along the volatile and dangerous Korean Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) – a 2.5-mile wide, heavily militarized dividing line between North Korea and South Korea by the 1953 armistice.

"The Korea veteran listing is anticipated to be a unique one, encompassing not only the Korean conflict from 1950 to 1953, but the considerable tensions in the ensuing decades," said Jan Williams, Cultural and Historic Resources Specialist for the planning and preservation office.

"Along with the original soldiers that served during the 1950's, many veterans in the 1960's were sent to Korea instead of 'Nam. The expectation is that the public will be submitting names of Korean veterans from 1950 all the way up to soldiers that served in 'The Z' quite literally through yesterday," she added.

In 2012, the Office of Planning and Preservation began the task of listing Morris County veterans from several conflicts. The undertaking was inspired by a WWII veteran from Rockaway, Mr. Peter Chipko, who said

that history would forget the military service and sacrifice that the men and women of Morris County rendered to the country.

The list, known as the Morris County Veterans Compendium, is releasing this latest effort to capture veterans' histories regarding

The criteria for listing in the Morris County Veterans Compendium remains the same as what has been established for listings of Morris County Veterans who served in Vietnam, WWI, WWII and other conflicts. They must have been born in Morris County or lived in the county for ten years. If a veteran meets the criteria, but has retired out of state or passed away, they remain eligible for listing.

The basic information required for listing is the veteran's name, Morris County municipality of birth or residence and the military branch in which they served.




