ST. VINCENT DE PAUL YOUTH RETURN TO APPALACHIA

Submitted by Teri Kesselmeyer On Sunday July 31, 2022 - after a two year pandemic-induced hiatus - twenty-four teens and adult volunteers departed from St. Vincent de Paul Church for a one-week service project in Appalachia. Their destination: Terra Alta, West Virginia. Their mission: to serve those in need.

Over the next week this intrepid group replaced and repaired roofs, rebuilt stairs, power-washed and painted houses, built a portico and brought joy to the families they assisted. It wasn't all work; they spent their downtime in rustic Camp Galilee, nestled among the West Virginia hills, enjoying the fields and lakefront, playing volleyball and cornhole, and getting to know each other through late night water balloon fights. Accompanying the teens were adult volunteers - some first time participants and others veterans of past trips - who ran their jobsites, prepared meals, drove cars, led reflections and provided guidance.

On Saturday August 6, the group returned, tired but happy, brimming over with stories of new friends, long car rides, and humming John Denver tunes about country roads.

This trip marks the twentieth year since St. Vincent de Paul Parish youth first ventured to West Virginia to participate in the Diocese of Preston County's Summer Home Repair Program. What makes this trip so special that teens and adult leaders keep returning?

Paul Delaney thinks it's the opportunity to learn new skills in a fun environment that makes the trip so special. Returning for his tenth year, Paul is a New Jersey contractor who travels to West Virginia ahead of the trip to scout job sites that the teens will work on over their week-long trip. He looks for jobs that require the right mix of skill levels for the group, so the teens who do the work will learn something new while making a difference in the Appalachian community.

Marie Baeyens thinks it's the beauty of West Virginia that makes the trip so special. Marie

attended the trip for the first time this year, along with two of her children, but has heard stories about Terra Alta from her older children who attended the trip before her.

Chris Fernandes, who attended past trips as both a teen and an adult leader, thinks it's the camaraderie that makes the trip so special.

Mary Knell, who attended for her first time this year, thinks it's the opportunity to give to others that makes the trip so special. Mary retired in June and volunteered to run the kitchen along with her friend Sandi Schaefer.

Father Richard Carton, Pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Church, thinks it's the opportunity to put into practice Jesus's call to genuine service to the least of our brothers and sisters that makes the trip so special.

Abby O'Mullan, a rising freshman at Watchung Hills Regional High School, had heard about the trip from her older siblings who attended in the past, but she wasn't sure what to expect. said Abby. Her older brother, John O'Mullan, who participated in the trip as a teen and returned this year as an adult volunteer.

Two decades of history testifies to the importance of this trip to the youth of New Jersey and to the people of West Virginia. This year's participants came together again on September 24 at St. Vincent de Paul Parish to reflect on their experiences, learn about other local service opportunities and look forward to next year. Plans are already underway for next year's trip, which is scheduled for July 30 to August 5, 2023. All those interested may contact St. Vincent de Paul parish house for more information.

The Flintlocks, BSA, Inc. are a group of retired scouters who dedicate their time and talents to helping the Boy Scout Camps in northern New Jersey. They annually donate approximately 5,000 hours of skilled labor to the scouts. The group includes many tradesmen, but also volunteers of every background. Most are retired, but some still work full time, and occasionally people volunteer to help for a day here and there. It is a very friendly group with a good sense of humor. When one member reached age 100, they designated a parking spot reserved for all Flintlocks over 100 years old.

The Flintlocks meet every Thursday at Camp Winnebago, Rockaway, NJ, all year round. They are organized as a 501c3 non profit corporation. All of the members are registered with the BSA. They provide a variety of skilled services to the Council. They have built cabins, picnic tables, painted the dining hall, built the archery range, built all the structures at the waterfront, financed, built and equipped the STEM Lab at Allamuchy Scout Reservation, repaired damage to camp structures, etc. In addition to building structures and doing repairs and maintenance, they also volunteer at many Council activities throughout the year. More than half of the Flintlocks have been awarded the Silver Beaver or have received other Council and National Awards. They typically provide approximately 5,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor every year. Previous years

were interrupted by COVID shutdowns, and the camps were not operational some summers, but now the Flintlocks are all vaccinated and have been back to work. The Council most recently opened the summer Scout camps again, and the Flintlocks have brought them up to code to receive campers.

DOCUMENTING VETERANS OF "FORGOTTEN WARS"

County of Morris

The signing of the Korean Armistice Agreement 69 years ago on July 27, 1953, officially ended the brutally destructive, large scale military actions that defined the Korean War, which left more than 5 million dead after three years.

But no peace treaty was ever signed, and hostilities continued over the decades, particularly from October 5, 1966 to December 3, 1969, when North Korea launched dozens of violent, armed incursions into South Korea. United States military personnel were on the ground to repel the attacks each time, and they have remained there with nearly a hundred Americans making the ultimate sacrifice in what are called America's "Forgotten Wars."

Morris County's Office of Planning and Preservation is documenting its "Veterans of the Z," those who served in the formal Korean War and those who have served since 1953 along the volatile and dangerous Korean Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) - a 2.5-mile wide, heavily militarized dividing line between North Korea and South Korea by the 1953 armistice.

"The Korea veteran listing is anticipated to be a unique one, encompassing not only the Korean conflict from 1950 to 1953, but the considerable tensions in the ensuing decades," said Jan Williams, Cultural and Historic Resources Specialist for the planning and preservation office.

"Along with the original soldiers that served during the 1950's, many veterans in the 1960's were sent to Korea instead of 'Nam. The expectation is that the public will be submitting names of Korean veterans from 1950 all the way up to soldiers that served in 'The Z' quite literally through yesterday," she added.

In 2012, the Office of Planning and Preservation began the task of listing Morris County veterans from several conflicts. The undertaking was inspired by a WWII veteran from Rockaway, Mr. Peter Chipko, who said

that history would forget the military service and sacrifice that the men and women of Morris County rendered to the country.

The list, known as the Morris County Veterans Compendium, is releasing this latest effort to capture veterans' histories regarding Korea.

To add a soldier or sailor to any of the lists, please send an email to Jan Williams: jwilliams@co.morris.nj.us.

The criteria for listing in the Morris County Veterans Compendium remains the same as what has been established for listings of Morris County Veterans who served in Vietnam, WWI, WWII and other conflicts. They must have been born in Morris County or lived in the county for ten years. If a veteran meets the criteria, but has retired out of state or passed away, they remain eligible for listing.

The basic information required for listing is the veteran's name, Morris County municipality of birth or residence and the military branch in which they served.



SIBLINGS WIN GOLD AT JIU JITSU WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Michael and Samantha Sarreal of Millington both won GOLD at the Pan American Kids IBJJF Championship Tournament in Florida on July 23 and 24, 2022.

The Pan Kids event is the world's largest and most prestigious BJJ tournament for kids aged 4-15. It is a 2-day event held annually by the International Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu Federation (IBJJF). There were about 2000 competitors, displaying many of the most talented and dedicated youth Jiu-Jitsu competitors from all over the world.

Michael, 13 years old, competed as a yellow belt in the Teen 1 division which had 14 top competitors, including previous Pan Ams medalists and IBJJF champions. In the Finals match, Michael defeated the Brazilian National and South American Champion by submitting him in a bow and arrow choke.

Samantha, 11 years old, competed as a grey belt in the Junior 2 division which had 9 elite competitors. In the semifinals, she defeated a competitor by triangle submission in only 12 seconds. The finals match went the distance for the full 4 minutes and Samantha won by points 10-0.

This was Michael and Samantha's first international tournament and first Pan Kids. Michael has been training jiu jitsu for about 3 years and Samantha for about 2 years. Michael and Samantha train a minimum of 5 days a week. They believe that dedication, discipline, hard work, consistency, and faith in God are keys to their success. "Sometimes you just have to show

up. Those days when you want to stay in bed are usually the ones ending up being the best training sessions. It was an amazing experience to compete with top athletes. A heartfelt thank you to all our family, friends, coaches, and training partners, who supported and cheered us on."


