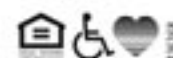

Harrison James, 11, of Chatham will receive the first-ever Junior Volunteer of the Year Award for his extraordinary service to the homeless. Harrison's gifts of time and talent the last four years provided much-needed linens, clothing, and so much for the homeless shelters and transitional homes at Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Newark.

Harrison will receive his award during the Catholic Charities' Fifth Annual Benefit to Help our Homeless to be held at St. Philomena Church in Livingston on Sunday, October 9, 2022.

Harrison's involvement began four years ago when he and his aunt, Mary Walsh of Madison, joined the Shelter Urgent Needs Shopping Club

run by volunteers at Catholic Charities. "Helping out feels good," says Harrison, a 6th-grader at Chatham Middle School in Chatham. "Seeing the Shelters when we deliver the needed items gives me an opportunity to get out of my neighborhood and help those who are struggling. As my grandfather would say, 'We're all in this together!'"

"Harrison's big heart helping our Homeless is inspiring!" says Catholic Charities CEO John Westervelt. "We're so grateful to have him on our Team, and no one deserves this honor more. We expect great things from this amazing young man!"

We meet every Saturday morning at the Kitchell Rd. parking area of nearby Loantaka Park. Meet time is 8:30 a.m. April-October and 9 a.m. November-March. 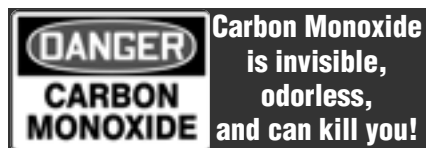

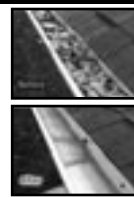
