#### MOM AND DAUGHTER RAISE AWARENESS OF ORGAN AND TISSUE DONATION

New Jersey Sharing Network

Jane Fischer and her daughter, Suzy, understand what it takes to overcome some of life's greatest challenges. As they celebrated Suzy's 48th birthday on July 18, they both took time to reflect on the gift of life and the miracle of organ and tissue donation.

On the day Suzy was born, doctors told Jane and her husband, Al, that their daughter would never be able to talk or walk or play like other children. While Suzy's special needs were great, Jane and Al kept hope alive that they would be able to persevere on the difficult journey ahead.

"Suzy proved them all wrong," said Jane. "Over the years, she has kept defying all the odds through her tenacity, courage, and strength. She surprised some of the best pediatricians and neurologists in our area by constantly working hard to develop and learn to do all the things they said she could never do."

While Suzy's life seemed to be filled with endless obstacles, she began to develop critical health issues shortly after turning 24 years old. Her kidneys began to fail, and she was soon placed on dialysis.

"It seemed like there were complications in nearly every one of her dialysis sessions," said Jane. "It took its emotional toll on Suzy and all of us, but she always did her best to keep her smile and the staff at the dialysis center loved her"

In December 2000, the Fischer family was in an airport in Jacksonville, Florida, when Jane's pager kept beeping and buzzing. "At the time, I mistakenly thought it was due to air traffic signals creating interference," said Jane. "But when we arrived home in New Jersey after our flight, we received an urgent phone call from our transplant coordinator at Saint Barnabas (Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center). They had a donated kidney for Suzy!"

Suzy received a successful kidney transplant, and the family is forever grateful to the 64-year-old woman who gave the gift of life. For 13 years, Suzy's transplanted kidney restored her health and she continued to fight through other serious health issues, including thyroid cancer that forced her to undergo a thyroidectomy.

In 2013, Suzy's transplanted kidney began to fail, and she faced another uphill struggle as dialysis loomed as the only treatment option. However, Suzy received encouraging news when another donated kidney became available for transplant. This time, her donor hero was a 24-year-old man who passed away in a tragic motorcycle accident.

"Suzy definitely had a lot of survivor's guilt," said Jane. "It helped ease her pain when I explained to her that the young man would have wanted his kidney to go to her to keep his memory alive."

Today, Suzy continues to thrive and enjoy

life's most precious moments thanks to her organ donor heroes. Suzy and Jane have made it a priority to support NJ Sharing Network, the nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue in the Garden State. By sharing their story with others, Suzy and Jane hope to encourage more people to register as organ and tissue donors.

"The most important thing is to get others to understand the need for organ and tissue donation and how it saves and enhances the lives of others," said Jane. "We also want to keep hope alive for those waiting for a life-saving transplant. We want to encourage them to never give up. I do not know why Suzy's life has been so hard, but I have always believed it has been to help others and make a difference in someone else's life."

According to United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS), there are over 100,000 Americans – nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey – waiting for a life-saving transplant. One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and enhance the lives of over 75 others.

"We forever honor our donor heroes, as well as their supportive families, for their selfless decision to save and enhance the lives of others. Because of them, Suzy and all transplant recipients now have more birthdays, holidays, and special moments to share with their loved ones," said Joseph S. Roth, President and CEO of NJ Sharing Network.

#### A GHOST STORY IN TIME FOR HALLOWEEN

A secluded Victorian styled mansion in a remote part of town, a mysterious fire, shadowy apparitions, and eerie noises in the night, create the ideal scenario for this Halloween offering.

To fully understand this story, one needs to know something about the peculiarities of the area where it takes place. Early on in Rahway's history, the town was settled and developed into four sections, mainly due to the branches of the river quartering the city. The smallest section and the farthest removed from the other more populous and prosperous sections, was Milton which was located on the west side of St. Georges Avenue between Central Avenue and Lake Avenue. The few, scattered homes were on Jefferson, Maple and West Hazelwood Avenues. Everything west of Jefferson was open fields and woodland. The Milton section did not have a good reputation. Residents of the more gentile sections of the city viewed the neighborhood as a rough place inhabited by any number of unsavory characters. This was the section that had been the scene of the infamous unknown woman murder in 1887 and several suicides. It was not unusual for strange things to happen in Milton.

After the Civil War, Charles B. Pratt, a successful New York broker, constructed a large two-and-a-half story, 20 room mansion in a secluded wooded area on the outskirts of the Milton section. The house, one of the largest in

the city, stood alone approximately 200 yards from the Maple Avenue Bridge and even further from its nearest neighbor. The only entrance to the estate was a long, narrow, gravel drive that meandered through the thick woods until opening to a beautifully landscaped expanse with a scenic view of Milton Lake.

Pratt, his wife and four sons lived in the elegant home for several decades and were active in the life of the city. Pratt died in 1891 and by the 1920s the mansion was showing signs of disrepair and neglect caused by the ravages of time. As family members passed away or moved to other places, it became more and more difficult to maintain the property. One son, Charles E. Pratt, a bachelor, remained the sole occupant, his only companion, his pet bulldog.

In February, 1923 Charles hired a young couple from New York to oversee the estate as he was often away and feared vandals would do damage to the property. Less than a month after the caretakers arrived, disaster struck. In the early morning hours of Friday, March 9, with Charles off the premises, the couple was awakened by the frantic barking of the bulldog coming from a room at the other end of the house. They quickly rushed into the hallway only to be overcome by the smoke and heat of a raging fire. Unable to make their way to save the pet, whose barking had stopped, they ran out of the house to safety.

When the firemen arrived, the mansion was a roaring furnace. To make matters worse. because hydrants had never been installed in the Milton section, fire hoses had to be dropped into the river so water could be pumped to the site. Water pressure covering the long distance to the inferno was so low the hoses were rendered almost useless. When the fire was finally extinguished and the firemen gone from the scene, only the walls of the once proud Pratt mansion were left standing. The cause of the blaze was never officially confirmed, but it was believed that sparks from a stove in the room

where the dog was kept ignited a stack of wood.

Unusual sights and sounds around the charred ruins began to be reported by residents of Milton shortly after the conflagration. The mild weather of spring brought the curious out at night and those who were brave-hearted enough began to venture closer to the grim remains despite the "No Trespassing" signs posted along the driveway. It didn't take long for the residents of Milton to believe the place was haunted. The police were called to the neighborhood numerous times and given descriptions of phantoms and gray apparitions flitting about the place. Young boys were known to run wildly back to their homes claiming to have heard the barking of Pratt's bulldog. Reports were given that ghosts had fired a gun in the air. Organized searches were planned, but never set off. There were those who swore they would never go near the place and warned others to stay away.

The authorities reasoned that the curious were being frightened off by any number of individuals who might be hiding on the property on any given night. The Pratt's were a wealthy family and there were those who went to the site with hopes of discovering valuables in the ashes. Their shadows and noises might have frightened people off. Bootleggers would find the location to be a good place to hide and would probably take pleasure in scaring any intruders. Tramps would find the ruins a good place to spend a night. The secluded area was also a magnet for young couples who when startled might easily have been mistaken for ghosts as they ran off and melted into the night. Some discounted the stories as just a product of the imagination.

The legend of the haunted area began to die down in the late 1930s when the property was finally cleared and 12 homes were built on Midwood Drive. Lakeside Drive and Crescent Drive would not be developed until the 1950s.

This writer is not aware of any reports having been made over the past 80 plus years concerning strange or unusual occurrences in the area. But then again... Happy Halloween!

#### **AUTUMN**

Many folks consider fall their favorite season. The cooler evenings are welcome after a blistering hot summer like we had this year. The changing tree colors we enjoy in the northeast are famous worldwide and my reason is the end of mosquito season.

Now that autumn is officially here many people will begin the annual ritual of decorating their homes with Indian corn and pumpkins. For gardeners fall is the second planting season. Shrubs, trees and spring flowering bulbs are planted now. Perennials can also be divided now and most have an advantage in the spring when root growth gets an early start. Check your plants requirements before digging them up.

Autumnal leaves in vibrant hues are a beautiful part of the season, but those leaves are also a vital part of keeping trees alive

Trees that have leaves that change color in fall are deciduous. (Evergreens are trees with needles, which stay green to continue the photosynthesis process through the winter, are coniferous.) Deciduous trees usually have large, broad leaves.

Most of the year, these leaves are green because of the chlorophyll they use to absorb energy from sunlight during photosynthesis. The leaves convert the energy into sugars to feed the tree

As the season changes, temperatures drop and days get shorter. Trees get less direct sunlight, and the chlorophyll in the leaves breaks down.

The lack of chlorophyll reveals yellow and orange pigments that were already in the leaves but masked during the warmer months. Darker red leaves are the result of a chemical change: Sugars that can get trapped in the leaves produce new pigments (called anthocyanins) that weren't part of the leaf in the growing season. Some trees, like oaks and dogwoods, are likely to produce red leaves.

How much and how fast leaves transform varies by location on the globe. The best colors are produced when the weather is dry, sunny and cool. Places that are cloudy, damp or warm won't see the same degree of changing color.

Then, of course, the leaves fall. Trees start building a protective seal between leaves and their branches as the weather turns. They take in as many nutrients as possible from the leaves, but leaves wouldn't survive the winter and would make trees vulnerable to damage if they remained. When the leaves are cut off from the fluid in the branches, they separate and drop to the ground.

As the leaves decay on the forest floor, they release nutrients into soil which will feed the trees and micro-organisms in the following spring.

One of the best things we can do for our garden soil is add chopped oak leaves in the fall and allow it to decompose. Your earthworms will do the rest.

#### **RESEEDING LAWNS**

No matter how beautiful your lawn is it will greatly benefit from reseeding. All plants including grass have a certain life span. As the older grass dies away it leaves spots where weeds can take hold next spring. The best way to avoid that is with think lush growth. Since we cut our lawns often, they are not able to reseed themselves.

September and early October is the perfect time to reseed your lawn. As the summer heat fades weeds and wildflowers begin to wane, dying back in the fields and on our lawns. This will give your grass seed plenty of space to germinate and grow without competition for sunlight, water and nutrients. The cooler weather and increased rain and even the morning dew will keep your seedlings moist until they become established.

Grass seeds do like to be kept moist so a light water when it is dry will be appreciated. Lawns do best with one inch of water a week. More that is harmful rather than helpful, producing weak root systems and encouraging fungus and diseases.

September seeding will also give your young grass a few weeks to sprout before the leaves fall, blocking the greatly needed sunlight.

In order for the seed to germinate it must make contact with the soil for the roots to take hold. Thatching, raking and aerating will greatly improve your success level.

There is far too much information to give in this one article, from how and when to thatch to seed selection.

Luckily for us Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Union County will supply this information free of cost.

The Helpline office also sells Soil Test Kits. This \$20 kit will give you valuable information on your soil and how to improve it.

#### FLINTLOCKS READY FOR ACTION

The Flintlocks, BSA, Inc. are a group of retired scouters who dedicate their time and talents to helping the Boy Scout Camps in northern New Jersey. They annually donate approximately 5,000 hours of skilled labor to the scouts. The group includes many tradesmen, but also volunteers of every background. Most are retired, but some still work full time, and occasionally

people volunteer to help for a day here and there. It is a very friendly group with a good sense of humor. When one member reached age 100, they designated a parking spot reserved for all Flintlocks over 100 years old.

The Flintlocks meet every Thursday at Camp Winnebago, Rockaway, NJ, all year round. They are organized as a 501c3 non profit corporation. All of the members are registered with the BSA.

They provide a variety of skilled services to the Council. They have built cabins, picnic tables, painted the dining hall, built the archery range, built all the structures at the waterfront, financed, built and equipped the STEM Lab at Allamuchy Scout Reservation, repaired damage to camp structures, etc. In addition to building structures and doing repairs and maintenance, they also volunteer at many Council activities throughout the year. More than half of the Flintlocks have been awarded the Silver Beaver or have received other Council and National Awards. They typically provide approximately 5,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor every year. Previous years were interrupted by COVID shutdowns, and the camps were not operational some summers, but now the Flintlocks are all vaccinated and have been back to work. The Council most recently opened the summer Scout camps again, and the Flintlocks have brought them up to code to receive campers.



#### **MEET FERNANDO PORRAS OF CLARK**

By the time this goes to press, my three-month internship will have ended. What will endure, is getting to know and work alongside my fellow intern Fernando Porras. In addition to stepping up to serve as an intern a year ago — and working some 20+ hours a week since in that capacity — he is an active CASA volunteer, well into his second case as a child advocate.

From processing donor thank yous, navigating excel spreadsheets, seeking community involvement amid a virtual fundraising campaign, to shooting videos for social media, sorting and hauling holiday wish list toys, and even donning superhero costumes for Adoption Day, Fernando has been a patient, committed role model for CASA's critical work. His mantra, "Anything for the kids," is one I've heard him say countless times but seen him put into action even more.

While being an advocate and yearlong intern is plenty for a CASA of Union County highlight, it's his personal journey, and all he's made of it, that shines even brighter. After his first CASA a 13-year-old boy - closed, he immediately began his current case, advocating for 5- and 10-year-old brothers. His visits, he says, often include intense Beyblades battles. "I remember playing with Beyblades at that age, so it's even more memorable to bond over something I'm familiar with. Also, superheroes! Maybe I'm still a kid at heart," he quips, adding, "As an advocate, you read about their life in stacks of paperwork, but being able to spend time with them as they enjoy the little things? It gives me such a different perspective on life." When he sees their smiles, he says, he's overcome with joy.

And joy is something — like every CASA youth — that Fernando deserves. In April 2018, a month before his college graduation, he was diagnosed with leukemia. He says, "Though I was told the diagnosis was just a matter of 'bad luck' ... my life turned upside down." Sparing the details of hospitalizations, procedures and finishing the tail-end of college amid unknowns and medical crises, let's take Fernando's lead and focus on the positive: August marked three years

in remission. Continued monitoring from his medical team as well as navigating other lifelong health challenges resulting from the very treatments that saved his life are now his norm.


Fernando continues, "In summer 2019, I started trying to piece my life back together. I was discussing the future with a hospital social worker and she told me CASA would be a perfect fit. I'm so glad I took her words to heart; I did my research, went to an information session, and the rest is history."

In addition to advocating for three youth, the 25-year-old cancer survivor used the yearlong intern assignment as a sabbatical of sorts, undergoing an intensive and thorough LSAT study period and he's now amid the nervewracking law school admissions process. I asked him how he juggles it all, when each ball carries great weight: "I've always been a 'yes' person. If something needs to be done, I'll do it. Some may not see that as a positive as I do ... but there's always time to do more."

In addition to enduring love and respect for his close-knit family, Fernando's fondness for travel also keeps him on his toes. Before he embeds himself in a law school lecture hall, there are plans to travel as much as possible, amid Covid-restraints and minding his health, of course. He recently visited family in Ecuador and soon will share his unwavering support for his beloved Atletico de Madrid soccer team with a jaunt to Spain.

When life was suddenly outside his firm grasp, Fernando reached wider and gripped harder, there's no question. Still, he's always sure to make time for the betterment of others' lives. He fondly quotes an uncle, "Never say you 'can't' do something, because what it really means is that you 'won't.' It's stuck with me and allowed me to work outside my comfort zone ... comfortably."

While experiences make you who you are — and in Fernando's case that certainly proves true —he also reminds me that people make those experiences. For us at CASA, that's Fernando. For Fernando, that's his family, including grandparents who modeled resiliency and hard

work, lessons for which he is grateful. When, during the last weeks of his internship, Fernando unexpectedly lost his beloved grandfather, colleagues at services saw firsthand his tightly woven net that is family, and that his commitment to life and bettering it comes from a deep well of connection, generations old.

Asked to look back on recent years, when bestlaid plans didn't happen and an unexpected diagnosis did, he offers: "I truly think everything happens for a reason. I'll always have an endless number of unanswered questions — but at the same time, I'll always be grateful that I found CASA of Union County."

In addition to serving as a fall marketing intern for CASA of Union County, Jahi McDonald is a 2020 graduate of Rutgers University-New Brunswick, with plans to begin a career in public relations and marketing.

Volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County serve as extra eyes and ears for family law judges hearing cases involving the county's abused, neglected or abandoned children removed from home and placed in foster care.

CASA volunteers have court-ordered access to all parties in a foster child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate into court reports findings from these contacts as well as from their own time spent with the youth. Advocates ensure a youth's needs are met and their time in care is as short as possible.
