

Central School's grade three students from Mrs. Nicole Evins's class filed into their modernized library on Thursday, September 8, for their first Innovation and Design class of the school year with Dr. Susan Kline, one of the

district's REACH teachers.

As the students took their seats and Kline introduced their first lesson on Lego Robotics, the children promptly expressed their excitement with high fives and smiles. Seated in pairs, the group listened carefully as Kline reviewed the guidelines and goals of the activity. The students were going to program a motor that would eventually push a small Lego boat into a simulated body of water.

Kline emphasized the importance of sharing the responsibilities of the programming project. One student per group was assigned to the Materials Manager role while the other became the Builder. The Materials Manager had to review the blueprint and select the correct pieces for their design, while the Builder was responsible for assembling the structure.

Kline circulated the room, encouraging the

students to follow their blueprints carefully. As the period progressed, group by group, the students eagerly raised their hands to display their finished products.

Robotics is integral to the next evolution of Warren Township Schools Innovation & Design program. According to Dr. Kline, "It is rare to find a modern-day, man-made device that does not contain a computer-controlled element. Intelligent products are oftentimes more efficient, greener, and convenient. Our students need to understand how to design modern-day products and know when and how to integrate appropriate coding to make them operate."

Innovation & Design is a hands-on program developed by Warren Township Schools to teach engineering skills to students. All K-8 students in Warren Township Schools participate in the Innovation & Design program.

WOODLAND STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THE EGG DROP CHALLENGE

Warren Township Schools

Each year, grade five students at Woodland elementary school in Warren Township, NJ, participate in an Egg Drop Activity to promote student teamwork and cooperation.

For the 2022-2023 school year, Mrs. Nicole Panos, grade 5 teacher, was inspired to bring the Egg Drop activity to a higher level. Panos coordinated with the Washington Valley Volunteer Fire Company to have a bucket truck at the event.

Similar to previous years, the students worked in small groups to design contraptions made from

materials such as balloons, bubble wrap, cotton balls, foam, cloth, and paper plates to protect the egg from breaking when dropped from a fifteenfoot ladder.

On the morning of September 8, students had the opportunity to test their egg projects in their classrooms. Out of the seventeen experimental drops, all but three eggs survived the first experience.

Recognizing an opportunity to reinforce a Growth Mindset lesson, homeroom teachers Ms. Alexa Barber, Mrs. Melanie Morales, Mr. Adam Yenish, and Panos encouraged their students to

adjust their projects and try again.

That afternoon, thanks to Jim Devizio, Captain of the Tower, and Fire Chief Charlie Bochen of the Washington Valley Volunteer Fire Company, the students had the opportunity to have their egg projects raised by the bucket truck and dropped from as high as seventy feet! Eleven of the seventeen eggs survived the drop.

According to Panos, the entire event was a success. "Woodland School really appreciates the participation and enthusiasm we received from Washington Valley Vol. Fire Co. We hope to make this an annual event with them."

MIA KOLB OF WARREN AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP

The Sharing Network Foundation's Hearts for Emma Partner Fund has awarded a scholarship to Mia Kolb of Warren, NJ, for her passion and dedication to raising awareness of organ and tissue donation. Kolb was presented with her scholarship award at NJ Sharing Network's headquarters in New Providence during a ceremony with her family members in the Landscape of Life Meditation Garden.

Kolb, a 2022 graduate of Gill St. Bernard's School, plans to attend the University of Notre Dame in the Fall. Her powerful connection to organ and tissue donation and transplantation began nearly 14 years ago when her younger brother, Christopher, was born with a tumor that caused him to be placed on critical life support in dire need of a heart transplant.

"We were powerless to do anything except hope and pray that a donor would be found in time," said Kolb. "Thankfully, he received the gift of life and is now a thriving teenager."

Shortly after she turned 12 years old, Kolb began volunteering with NJ Sharing Network to educate others about the importance of organ and tissue donation. As president of the Gill St. Bernard's Donate Life Club, Kolb coordinated guest speaker presentations to encourage her

classmates to register as organ and tissue donors. She also organized several donor registration drives and fundraisers to support the Sharing Network Foundation. Kolb is currently focused on earning the Girl Scout Gold Award for her outreach efforts in supporting NJ Sharing Network's life-saving mission.

"I strive to educate those in my community about the importance of organ and tissue donation so that our family's miracle can become a reality for other families," said Kolb. "Registering to be an organ and tissue donor should be an easy choice, but there is an abundance of misinformation that hinders many from making this decision. Some people worry that doctors will not try to save their lives if they are registered donors. I am working to help dispel these myths. By sharing my family's experience, I have been able to influence others to make the right choice to register as donors."

The Sharing Network Foundation's scholarship program provides an opportunity to recognize and award graduating high school seniors who advocate for and/or whose lives have been touched by organ and tissue donation and transplantation.

The Hearts for Emma Partner Fund, a program of the Sharing Network Foundation, was created in recognition of the successful heart transplant of Emma Rothman of Cranford. It supports the production and distribution of educational materials and programs to help promote the importance of organ and tissue donation. The Fund has raised nearly \$80,000 since its inception and has helped educate more than 100,000 students about donation and transplantation through NJ Sharing Network's high school outreach program. Last year, Rothman celebrated the 10th anniversary of her life-saving heart transplant and graduated from Syracuse University with a degree in Food Studies. Rothman remains humble and always thankful for her donor who gave her the gift of life and made her achievements possible.

"Hearts for Emma is focused on educating present and future generations to ensure everyone understands the importance of organ and tissue

donation and transplantation," said Nancie Rothman, Emma's mother and Founder and President of Hearts for Emma. "Mia serves as a perfect example of what it means to take an active role in supporting these important outreach efforts."

Scholarship applicants were measured on academic achievement, community and volunteer efforts, extracurricular activities and advocacy for organ and tissue donation. The application process included a thorough review by Nancie Rothman and JoAnne McGovern, Recording Secretary of Hearts for Emma, as well as members of the Hearts for Emma scholarship committee and the Sharing Network Foundation's Board of Trustees.

"We are grateful for the generous support of the Hearts for Emma Partner Fund and their ongoing commitment to rewarding students who share a commitment to our life-saving mission," said Amanda Tibok, Interim Executive Director, Sharing Network Foundation. "We know that Mia and all of our scholarship recipients will continue as strong leaders educating others about donation and transplantation throughout their college years and beyond."


