The Just Kidding 4-H goat club was presented with national awards in the Junior American Citizens contest at the Somerset County 4-H Association meeting on September 21. The club placed first in the nation with their community service project. Members of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) presented the awards at the Ted Blum 4-H Center of Somerset County in Bridgewater.

"We are very proud of these young people and all that they managed to accomplish even with the pandemic," said New Jersey DAR 4-H Liaison Holly Jean Dunbar. The club collected 192 books that were donated to members of the military, at home and abroad, via Operation Paperback.

Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter DAR sponsored the 4-H club in the contest. Chapter members presented the 4-H'ers with their awards that included ribbons, certificates and a medal that represented the four judging levels of the competition, local, state, division and national. As a special treat, DAR member and 4-H alumna Dorothea Borkowski presented each child with home-baked goat-shaped cookies. DAR members

assisting in the awards presentation were Vice Regent Marti Kalko, a 4-H volunteer, and Librarian Susan Dobrinsky, a 4-H alumna, both of Green Brook, along with Chaplain Karen Miller and Historian Lynda Pasko from Dunellen.

4-H club leaders Beth Kavanaugh and Nicole Perry had expressed their gratitude for the help provided by Marion McGlyn of Operation Paperback. Every 4-H club is asked to complete an annual service project. Studies have shown that as adults, 4-H alumni are twice as likely to be civically engaged and four times more likely to participate in community service.

Along with congratulating the 4-H club, Dunbar, who is a 4-H alumna and volunteer, also thanked the members of the 4-H Association and 4-H Agent Lisa Rothenburger and staff. "This is the fifth Somerset County 4-H club that has received a national DAR award for service since 1993," said Dunbar. "This is just a phenomenal record. And it proves that you must be doing something right."

The DAR is a nonprofit service organization open to women 18 and over who can trace their descent from a man or woman who aided the cause of American independence. For more than a century, the DAR has promoted historical preservation, education, and patriotic endeavor. 

Most donations came from families of students at IEF elementary school in Green Brook and from other Scout families. The Scouts went to Union to drop off the coats and get a glimpse of the operation they were helping.

Mike Boll, President of NJVN, did a good job of explaining the reason for collecting items like this and gave them a brief tour of the NJVN collection. He explained that they collect items like dress suits and nice attire to help veterans feel good and be more presentable when applying for jobs or going to their jobs. In addition, they collect mobility devices like various types of walkers, women's clothing (because many do not realize the ever-growing amount of female veterans with needs), and coats to help homeless and in-need veterans keep themselves and their families warm.

The Pack leaders are very proud of the boys for taking on such an endeavor to help those who sacrificed so much for our freedom and security.



"OUR CITY" PUBLIC AFFAIRS TELEVISION SHOW

Long-time Green Brook resident Michele Ford, President & CEO, Inroads to Opportunities, was a recent guest on 'Our City' – an Elizabeth, NJ based television show. Inroads to Opportunities is a Union County, NJ, non-profit human services agency that provides programs and services to individuals with disabilities ranging in age from 16 to retirement.

The show is hosted by Elizabeth Mayor Christopher Bollwage. During a lengthy conversation, Bollwage and Ford discussed the significance of National Disability Employment Month, which falls each year in October. Ford emphasized the importance for individuals with disabilities to be able to find gainful employment.

According to Ford, "We need employers to be more diverse and inclusive. That's always going to be the issue, there are plenty of us around who are doing the service work, but we really need the partnership with employers." As the interview continued, Ford outlined the numerous benefits both the employer and the employee with a disability gain from each other.

With over 35 years of experience, Ford has made a tremendous impact on the lives of employees and participants in the Inroads to Opportunities program. Demonstrating selflessness and compassion, Ford has dedicated her life to support individuals with disabilities.

Within the last year, Ford has been recognized as a '2022 NJBIZ ICON' by NJBIZ, given the Shero Award by the Union County Board of Commissioners, as well as received the 'Inventive Leader in Adult Services, Courage and Compassion Award' presented by the NJ Association of Mental Health & Addiction Agencies (NJAMHAA).

A life-long advocate, Michele has been a champion for this most vulnerable population by serving on the Union County Nonprofit Consortium, Union County Crisis Consortium and most recently addressing members of the US Commission on Civil Rights in Washington, D.C. to raise awareness of choice in defense of employment options for individuals with disabilities.

The Volunteer Fire Department of Green Brook has continued this tradition since 1948. The original 20-foot-high Star was constructed in 1947 and made of old wooden boards, planks and other salvaged pieces. It was hauled up the mountain by a tractor and attached to a tree. The power to light it was generously provided by a power line from a nearby house. Sometime later, PSE&G installed a pole and meter and the Star has been on that pole at the back of Fire House #2 ever since, shining brightly for viewers to see for miles.

In 1959, a new 20-by-20 foot stainless steel aluminum star was built by the volunteer firemen in the basement of Joseph Van Dzura. It consisted of seven separate sections that were joined together outside Mr. Dzura's residence. The star held 150 100-watt bulbs. The firemen hoped to have the Star reflect the spiritual meaning of the Christmas season, remembering that the special Star from almost 2,000 years ago marked the way for the Wise Men from the East to find Jesus, the





Christ Child.

Interestingly, in 1973, the 500-pound Star was not displayed due to the energy crisis. It would have cost too much to display. It was lit in 1974, but with dimmer light bulbs.

The 50th anniversary of the 1959 star was celebrated on December 5, 2009. Bill Coughlin, President and Firefighter/EMT of Green Brook Fire/EMS mentioned that sheet metal and electric renovations were begun in2002 and finished in 2009. "We purchase new light bulbs every year. I just picked up 138 bulbs from Home Depot and got a surprised look from the guy in that department!"

Renovations have been made over the years, to reflect the changes in technology. By 2018, the Christmas Star was lit by 130 energy-efficient LED light bulbs.

The long-standing tradition will celebrate its 75th anniversary next year. It has served as a beautiful beacon of light, hope and peace for many years. Take time to gaze up and enjoy it during this special, festive season!
