HAPPY BIRTHDAY VICKIE!

November 15, 2022, will mark a special day for Kenilworth resident Victoria "Vickie" Cadena Shear, for she will be celebrating her 100th birthday! Victoria is the daughter of Spanish immigrant Aurora and Mexican immigrant Prudencio Cadena. Both were immigrants who had come to America and traveled from Texas to Oklahoma in a covered wagon. Vickie was born in Oklahoma on November 15, 1922. In 1926, the Cadena family moved to Congress Street in the Ironbound section of Newark, New Jersey. There Vickie lived with her parents and siblings Larry, Oscar, Steve, and Beatrice. They moved around several times while living there but remained active within the Spanish-speaking community in the area.

As a young girl, Vickie attended dances sponsored by the Spanish-American clubs of Newark. These clubs were sponsored in the hope of raising money for soldiers fighting in the Spanish Civil War of 1936 -1939. Instead of attending high school, she attended vocational school in Newark. During her senior year, the attack on Pearl Harbor occurred and as a result, she began working at a civilian defense plant during World War II. There they manufactured wire for airplanes needed by the allied forces overseas. During the war, her three brothers served in the military. Her brother Larry served in the Army Air Corps, Oscar in the U.S. Marine Corps, and Steve in the Merchant Marines.

Following World War II, Victoria moved to Union, New Jersey, and married Theodore Shear in 1948. At the time she was working at W.B. Driver, Newark, New Jersey before becoming pregnant and starting a family. Together, she and her husband had two sons Steve and Rick. Following the birth of her two sons, she began working for Tuscan Dairy in Union and retired after thirty years of employment.

When asked about the biggest change that she has seen in her life she stated, "The war years were the biggest change that I had seen. The whole country was united, and everybody worked together. I was so proud of my brothers and so proud to be a witness to that era."

When asked to reflect on her life Vickie commented, "I don't know why I have lived this long but I have had a good life. I had two wonderful sons and have a wonderful family today. Everybody in Kenilworth has treated me so nicely since moving here."

Throughout her life, Vickie has remained extremely active within the community. She has traveled to nearly every state in the United States and was a member of the Union Senior Citizens Center before moving to Kenilworth in September 2019. Today, Vickie is a member of the Kenilworth Senior Citizens Center and frequently attends events held at the Kenilworth Public Library. She resides with her son and daughter-in-law Rick and Jaye Shear. Vickie is constantly in touch with her loving family and friends including her sister Bea, brother-in-law Vinnie, and many nieces and nephews.

the blink of an eye. To help students prepare for their not-toodistant future, David Brearley Middle-High School hosted a college fair on Wednesday, October 19, in the main gym. Representatives from 40 colleges and universities were available to talk with students and provide information on educational opportunities. All freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors attended the morning event during a portion of their class time.

"This is a great exposure opportunity for our students and can provide inspiration for our high schoolers," said Jeremy Davies, Brearley principal. "When they have a conversation with a college representative, reality may set in that they need to focus better on school and formulate a goal for their post-secondary life."

Brearley also recently held a Freshman College Experience to nurture a future-focused mindset among the high school's newest students. During this series of workshops, staff members introduced freshmen to concepts such as learning what a Grade Point Average (GPA) is and how their transcript develops over time.

The students were also given a career inventory test and asked how they envisioned themselves in four and eight years. Six workshops were held to help motivate and inspire the freshman class.

WHAT WHERE AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH **MONUMENTS TO OUR LOCAL VETERANS: 1924 TO 2022**

There are likely will be few people if any who heroes until May 1959. will attend the Kenilworth VFW Veterans Day program this coming November 11, who know about the history of the veteran monuments adjoining the Veterans Center on So., 21st St. That history dates back 98 years.

In May 1924 the Rotary Club donated a bronze plaque to VFW Post 2230 to honor local residents who served in WWI. When accepted by the VFW there was no stone monument upon which to place it. The local Citizens League approached the school board for approval to erect a stone monument on school grounds. On June 6, 1924, the board granted approval.

Local resident and architect Joseph A. Bailey designed a monument with a stone base shaped like a star that supported a seven-foot obelisk. In 1928 it was erected on the lawn between the old McKinley School and Harding School. The bronze plaque donated four years earlier was secured upon the obelisk. That the monument was the local gathering place for Veterans Day and Memorial Day services honoring Kenilworth

The old monument had insufficient room to post the names of local veterans who perished in WWII and Korea. A decision was made to erect a larger monument in the park adjacent to the Kenilworth Veterans Center on S. 21st St. to recognize the sacrifices of veterans of WWI, WWII, and Korea who perished as a result of serving in those wars. The new, much taller obelisk, was dedicated on September 19, 1959 with much fanfare. A big Boulevard parade concluded with a large assemblage of veterans, residents, and local officials who gathered around the new S. 21st St monument. The crowd heard speeches and witnessed the unveiling of the new monument. The original 1924 bronze plaque is on display in the Kennedy Room of the Veterans Center.

In 2003 the Kenilworth Veterans Center, at a cost of nearly \$60,000, added three large granite markers, each one dedicated to the memories of those who served and perished as a result of service during WWI, WWII, and Korea.

Landscaping, pavers, and other improvements were made at the time.

In 2011, the park was named "The Robert E. Jeans, Sr. Veterans Memorial Park" to recognize the dedicated and unwavering service of VFW Post 2230 Commander Robert E. Jeans, Sr., in revitalizing the post and for his ongoing leadership. A decorated, purple heart, Vietnam War veteran, Sgt. Jeans continues to serve as post commander.

Commander Jeans has extended an invitation to all residents to attend the outdoor service at 11:00 a.m. on November 11. In event of inclement weather, the program will be held inside the Veterans Center. Complimentary refreshments will be provided following the program.

FLINTLOCKS READY FOR ACTION

The Flintlocks, BSA, Inc. are a group of retired scouters who dedicate their time and talents to helping the Boy Scout Camps in northern New Jersey. They annually donate approximately 5.000 hours of skilled labor to the scouts. The group includes many tradesmen, but also volunteers of every background. Most are retired, but some still work full time, and occasionally people volunteer to help for a day here and there. It is a very friendly group with a good sense of humor. When one member reached age 100, they designated a parking spot reserved for all Flintlocks over 100 years old.

The Flintlocks meet every Thursday at Camp Winnebago, Rockaway, NJ, all year round. They are organized as a 501c3 non profit corporation. All of the members are registered with the BSA. They provide a variety of skilled services to the Council. They have built cabins, picnic tables, painted the dining hall, built the archery range, built all the structures at the waterfront, financed, built and equipped the STEM Lab at Allamuchy Scout Reservation, repaired damage to camp structures, etc. In addition to building structures

and doing repairs and maintenance, they also volunteer at many Council activities throughout the year. More than half of the Flintlocks have been awarded the Silver Beaver or have received other Council and National Awards. They typically provide approximately 5,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor every year. Previous years were interrupted by COVID shutdowns, and the camps were not operational some summers, but now the Flintlocks are all vaccinated and have been back to work. The Council most recently opened the summer Scout camps again, and the Flintlocks have brought them up to code to receive campers.
