Historic site plaques were presented to two of Long Hill Township's oldest churches by the Long Hill Historic Preservation Advisory Committee (HPAC) at the September 14, 2022, Township Committee meeting.

Long Hill Township Historian, Sam Cornish, presented the plaques to Rev. Victoria McGrath of the All Saints Episcopal Church and Joyce Koenig, the Ruling Elder of The First Presbyterian Church of Stirling. All Saints Episcopal Church was built in 1905 with stone donated by the Millington Quarry. The First Presbyterian Church of Stirling dates back to the founding of Stirling. Its cornerstone was laid in 1872.

## **APHASIA COMMUNICATION GROUP OFFERED**

The Adler Aphasia Center is currently offering an Aphasia Communication Group for stroke and brain injury survivors with aphasia in Scotch Plains, NJ. This group provides those diagnosed with aphasia an opportunity to socialize with others who share similar experiences, provide tips to communicate more effectively, and time to practice communication skills in a natural environment. Aphasia is a language disorder caused by stroke or other brain injury. It affects spoken language, reading, and writing, but does not affect one's intellect.

This group is facilitated by a licensed speech language pathologist and is offered two Fridays of each month for two hours. A person with aphasia may join the group at any time but must pre-register. There is a nominal charge, but we never turn people away for lack of funds, we offer scholarships to those who are not able to pay \$80 for eight sessions.

Adler Aphasia Center, a non-profit organization with three full-service facilities based in Maywood, West Orange, and Toms River, NJ and Aphasia Communication Groups located throughout the state, is an innovative, post-rehabilitative program that addresses the long-term needs of people with aphasia and their families. Aphasia is a communication disorder that impairs the expression and understanding of spoken language, reading, and writing. It occurs most often from a stroke or other brain injury. It affects a person's ability to communicate, but not his or her intellect. This communication disorder affects 40% of all stroke and brain trauma survivors. The Center is considered a world leader in long-term, post-rehab community-based care for people with aphasia. With 2.5 million people diagnosed with aphasia in the U.S., the Center is the only one of its kind in NJ, an area with an estimated 70,000 people living with aphasia. ## FIRE PREVENTION WEEK TEACHES FIRE SAFETY

More than 300 children and their teachers eagerly received fire prevention training and learned what to do in the event of a fire. This program is conducted annually by members of the Stirling Volunteer Fire Co. during Fire Prevent Week (2nd week of Oct.). The children in the classes were taught to "Get Out and Stay Out" when they hear a fire alarm sound, to have a meeting place to go to once they are out of the house so that everyone can be accounted for, and to Stop Drop & Roll if their clothes catch on fire.

They also learned fire safety tips, got to sit in the fire engine, and to their delight – ring the bell on the fire engine. Upon completion of the class each child was given a firefighters helmet and fire safety coloring book. All was provided free through a grant from the State and from donations from the public.

The schools that participated in this important

annual program were the Gillette Elementary School, the Little People's Playhouse, Goddard School, Hudson Immersion School, Small Society Academy, Long Hill Montessori, and the two The Uncommon Thread schools.

Fire Prevention Week was capped off with an open house at the Stirling firehouse where adults and children were allowed to climb aboard a fire engine, learn about fire prevention and fire safety, and talk with firefighters. The week's events were a complete success thanks to many of Stirling Fire Company's firefighters who freely gave of their time.

Anyone who would like to become a Stirling firefighter is invited to contact them at stirlingfire.org. Training and equipment are free. Male and females age 16 and older are eligible. It is a great way to give back to your community and join a fraternity of local heroes.





After a 3 year delay because of the pandemic, Lodge Linne #429 VOA will once again be sponsoring their annual Import Sale on Saturday, November 19, 2022. The 42nd annual Scandinavian Import and Gift Sale will be held at Salt Brook School, 40 Maple St, New Providence, NJ (off Springfield Ave,). The sale will be open to the public between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. and is handicapped accessible. Admission is free.

The sale will feature a variety of traditional holiday and everyday Scandinavian items made from silver, amber, wood, paper, wool, straw, and other materials. These gift and handicraft items are either manufactured in one of the Nordic countries or are designed in a Scandinavian style or motif and manufactured elsewhere.

Many of the traditional Scandinavian decorating items will be offered, including a large variety of elf-like tomten, Jul Bock or straw goats in many sizes, and many Christmas ornaments. Among paper items for sale will be a wide selection of advent calendars, including those filled with chocolate candy, Carl Larsson calendars, Christmas cards, and stationary. An assortment of table linens will be available including runner fabric by the yard for both Christmas and everyday use. For the home one will find trays, baking needs, aprons, knives, Danish wrought iron candleholders, and wooden candleholders for Christmas and general use. Personal items will include lovely sweaters from Dale of Norway for men and women in both cardigan and pullover styles. The jewelry department is selling necklaces, earrings, and

We will be selling a large variety of Scandinavian baked goods, such as limpa bread, coffee braids, and pastries. ## **BROOK ARTS CENTER COMMUNITY PLAYERS PRESENT SEUSSICAL: THE MUSICAL**



## **MOM AND HER DAUGHTER RAISE AWARENESS ABOUT ORGAN AND TISSUE DONATION**

#### New Jersey Sharing Network

Jane Fischer and her daughter, Suzy, understand what it takes to overcome some of life's greatest challenges. As they celebrated Suzy's 48th birthday on July 18, they both took time to reflect on the gift of life and the miracle of organ and tissue donation.

On the day Suzy was born, doctors told Jane and her husband, Al, that their daughter would never be able to talk or walk or play like other children. While Suzy's special needs were great, Jane and Al kept hope alive that they would be able to persevere on the difficult journey ahead.

"Suzy proved them all wrong," said Jane. "Over the years, she has kept defying all the odds through her tenacity, courage, and strength. She surprised some of the best pediatricians and neurologists in our area by constantly working hard to develop and learn to do all the things they said she could never do."

While Suzy's life seemed to be filled with endless obstacles, she began to develop critical health issues shortly after turning 24 years old. Her kidneys began to fail, and she was soon placed on dialysis.

"It seemed like there were complications in nearly every one of her dialysis sessions," said Jane. "It took its emotional toll on Suzy and all of us, but she always did her best to keep her smile and the staff at the dialysis center loved her."

In December 2000, the Fischer family was in an airport in Jacksonville, Florida, when Jane's pager kept beeping and buzzing. "At the time, I mistakenly thought it was due to air traffic signals creating interference," said Jane. "But when we arrived home in New Jersey after our flight, we received an urgent phone call from our transplant coordinator at Saint Barnabas (Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center). They had a donated kidney for Suzy!"

and the family is forever grateful to the 64-yearold woman who gave the gift of life. For 13 years, Suzy's transplanted kidney restored her health and she continued to fight through other serious health issues, including thyroid cancer that forced her to undergo a thyroidectomy.

In 2013, Suzy's transplanted kidney began to fail, and she faced another uphill struggle as dialysis loomed as the only treatment option. However, Suzy received encouraging news when another donated kidney became available for transplant. This time, her donor hero was a 24year-old man who passed away in a tragic motorcycle accident.

"Suzy definitely had a lot of survivor's guilt," said Jane. "It helped ease her pain when I explained to her that the young man would have wanted his kidney to go to her to keep his memory alive."

Today, Suzy continues to thrive and enjoy life's most precious moments thanks to her organ donor heroes. Suzy and Jane have made it a priority to support NJ Sharing Network, the nonprofit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue in the Garden State. By sharing their story with others, Suzy and Jane hope to encourage more people to register as organ and tissue donors.

"The most important thing is to get others to understand the need for organ and tissue donation and how it saves and enhances the lives of others," said Jane. "We also want to keep hope alive for those waiting for a life-saving transplant. We want to encourage them to never give up. I do not know why Suzy's life has been so hard, but I have always believed it has been to help others and make a difference in someone else's life."

Suzy received a successful kidney transplant, Sharing (UNOS), there are over 100,000 Americans – nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey – waiting for a life-saving transplant. One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and enhance the lives of over 75 others.
