# **APHASIA COMMUNICATION GROUP OFFERED**

The Adler Aphasia Center is currently offering an Aphasia Communication Group for stroke and brain injury survivors with aphasia in Scotch Plains, NJ. This group provides those diagnosed with aphasia an opportunity to socialize with others who share similar experiences, provide tips to communicate more effectively, and time to practice communication skills in a natural environment. Aphasia is a language disorder caused by stroke or other brain injury. It affects spoken language, reading, and writing, but does not affect one's intellect.

This group is facilitated by a licensed speech language pathologist and is offered two Fridays of each month for two hours. A person with aphasia may join the group at any time but must pre-register. There is a nominal charge, but we never turn people away for lack of funds, we offer scholarships to those who are not able to pay \$80 for eight sessions.

Adler Aphasia Center, a non-profit organization with three full-service facilities based in Maywood, West Orange, and Toms River, NJ and Aphasia Communication Groups located throughout the state, is an innovative, post-rehabilitative program that addresses the long-term needs of people with aphasia and their families. Aphasia is a communication disorder

that impairs the expression and understanding of spoken language, reading, and writing. It occurs most often from a stroke or other brain injury. It affects a person's ability to communicate, but not his or her intellect. This communication disorder affects 40% of all stroke and brain trauma survivors. The Center is considered a world leader in long-term, post-rehab community-based care for people with aphasia. With 2.5 million people diagnosed with aphasia in the U.S., the Center is the only one of its kind in NJ, an area with an estimated 70,000 people living with aphasia. 



Reporter Mark Di Ionno spent most of the Award for column writing. summer in Ukraine volunteering to bring needed supplies to people affected by the Russo-Ukrainian war. On Wednesday, November 30, from 7:00-8:30 p.m., he will speak at the Summit Free Public Library and discuss some of the people he met and the journeys he took.

Di Ionno went to Poland during the first weeks of the war to assist Ukrainian refugees fleeing Russia's missile attacks and military advances. He was in Ukraine for the majority of Summer 2022, delivering supplies to both refugees and to the Ukrainian military, often very close to the Russian border.

Di Ionno was raised in Summit. He was a longtime columnist at The Star-Ledger and was a Pulitzer Prize finalist in news commentary in 2013 for his coverage of Hurricane Sandy and other local events and issues. He is a six-time winner of the New Jersey Press Association

"We are grateful for the opportunity to partner with HomeTowne Television and Mark Di Ionno to bring a discussion based on his recent experiences in Ukraine to the community," said Amy Behr Shields, Director of the Summit Free Public Library. "The Library strives to bring programs that allow for public discourse about current events, and this collaboration does just that."

The program will be held in the Liss Meeting Room on the library's lower level, and later broadcast on HomeTowne Television. This event will feature a Q&A, where participants can ask questions directly with Di Ionno.



Cut butter into ½ in cubes, then mix all dry ingredients (including sugar) in a large bowl. Add in cubed butter and Squish with fingers until there

> Papple Pie Filling Ingredients: 3 large granny smith apples, 2 Bartlett pears, 1 heaping teaspoon of cinnamon, 1/8 teaspoon of nutmeg, zest and juice of one lemon, ½ cup of brown sugar, +1/2 cup white sugar

> Wash and peal apples and pears, then slide them into ½ inch slices. Put in large bowl and add lemon (juice & zest), the 2 sugars, nutmeg, and cinnamon.

> Cut pie crust in 2 and roll both out, put one in pie tin, and cut the other into long strips. Poke holes in bottom of pie crust and cover with a layer of brown sugar. Put filling in and cover with lattice, then bake for 55 minutes at 400


The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad is of charge and funded entirely through private king area residents to support the vital, lifedonations.

The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad is not a city agency and receives no funding from the municipality; it relies solely on private donations to fund the purchase of medical supplies, equipment, and for professional training of its members. In addition to its 65 adult members, the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad includes 20 junior members, high school students ages 16 and older that assist in emergency calls.





The Flintlocks, BSA, Inc. are a group of retired scouters who dedicate their time and talents to helping the Boy Scout Camps in northern New Jersey. They annually donate approximately 5,000 hours of skilled labor to the scouts. The group includes many tradesmen, but also volunteers of every background. Most are retired, but some still work full time, and occasionally people volunteer to help for a day here and there. It is a very friendly group with a good sense of humor. When one member reached age 100, they designated a parking spot reserved for all Flintlocks over 100 years old.

The Flintlocks meet every Thursday at Camp Winnebago, Rockaway, NJ, all year round. They are organized as a 501c3 non profit corporation. All of the members are registered with the BSA. They provide a variety of skilled services to the Council. They have built cabins, picnic tables, painted the dining hall, built the archery range, built all the structures at the waterfront, financed, built and equipped the STEM Lab at Allamuchy Scout Reservation, repaired damage to camp structures, etc. In addition to building structures

and doing repairs and maintenance, they also volunteer at many Council activities throughout the year. More than half of the Flintlocks have been awarded the Silver Beaver or have received other Council and National Awards. They typically provide approximately 5,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor every year. Previous years were interrupted by COVID shutdowns, and the camps were not operational some summers, but now the Flintlocks are all vaccinated and have been back to work. The Council most recently opened the summer Scout camps again, and the Flintlocks have brought them up to code to receive campers.


