

#### **MOUNTAINSIDE'S NEWEST EAGLE SCOUT - JACOB QUISUMBING**

Jacob Quisumbing of Mountainside achieved the rank of Eagle Scout on October 22, 2022.

Jacob is the son of Albert and Mimi Quisumbing. He is a member of Boy Scout Troop 177 of Mountainside, chartered to the Community Presbyterian Church. Jacob has been a Scout for ten years, including his years as a Cub Scout in Pack 177.

To earn the rank of Eagle, a Scout must earn at least 21 merit badges and demonstrate leadership and community service by organizing and carrying out an Eagle project.

During his time as a Boy Scout, Jacob earned 26 merit badges, served actively in leadership positions of Scribe and Assistant Senior Patrol Leader for his Troop, and also participated in community service events like the annual Thanksgiving Food Drive. In his later years of

scouting, Jacob was inducted into the Order of the Arrow and is a Brotherhood member of Woapalanne Lodge 43.

Jacob's Eagle project entailed building a commemorative garden for the Mountainside Rescue Squad to honor their service during the COVID-19 pandemic. He recruited, worked with, and managed a team of volunteers, logging a total of 64 man hours, which included meeting with Rescue Squad officials and fundraising. Jacob raised over \$1,000, doubling his initial project fundraising goal. He was able to donate the remaining funds to the Rescue Squad for their future maintenance of the garden.

Jacob is a Class of 2022 graduate of Governor Livingston High School and is currently attending the University of California, Berkeley. He plans to pursue a dual degree in industrial engineering and data science.












































#### **MOUNTAINSIDE TREE LIGHTING**

#### 'MINDING YOUR MIND' AT GLHS

#### Berkeley Heights Public Schools

As the Student Assistance Counselor at Governor Livingston High School and Columbia Middle School, Ms. Madison Rowohlt is charged with providing mental health resources to students.

"One of the things I do in my role as a student assistance counselor is act as a resource to students and educate them about the importance of taking care of their mental and emotional health. I accomplish this by providing Mental Health and Drug and Alcohol Programs. My role differs from my colleagues in the counseling department because I do not provide academic or college/career counseling," said Ms. Rowohlt.

She continued, "In looking at my goals for the year, I felt the need to bring more mental health programming to the school. Students are aware of mental health issues and open to learning more about recognizing the signs and symptoms of mental health issues, so I wanted to provide opportunities to them to express themselves and seek the help they may need."

Minding Your Mind is a national non-profit organization that "is dedicated to ending stigma and destructive behaviors associated with mental health issues, moving away from a crisis-based response to prevention through education." Minding Your Mind uses the power of storytelling to provide evidence-based education on mental health challenges to audiences by having a person, a young adult typically, come

and tell their story so that there is an element of relatability for the students with the speaker.

Mountainside Municipal Alliance. The hope is that the program will continue to be recognized

In mid-October, GLHS conducted two days of assemblies with 9th and 11th graders who heard from a young man about his struggles with mental health, his drug and alcohol experiences, and his road to recovery and health and wellness. He shared his story, as well as the signs of anxiety and depression, and concluded by giving students ideas on how they can ask for help.

Ms. Rowohlt and the counseling team used the assemblies as an opportunity to speak to students about the mental health services that the school and district provides. According to Ms. Rowohlt, "After every presentation there were students who approached the speaker to either thank him or to share personal experiences. They really connected with him and it made an impact. It served as a great conversation starter for students to seek support."

"We strategically timed this program to take place at the beginning of the year because we want students to feel they have a supportive community at GLHS and that they have supportive staff members to rely on," said Ms. Rowohlt. "By bringing in a relatable person to tell their stories to students, the stigma around mental health decreases. We hope our students will ask for support and identify when they are struggling as a result of the presentation."

Minding Your Mind was made possible thanks to funding provided through a grant from The Mountainside Municipal Alliance. The hope is that the program will continue to be recognized for its value and funded annually so that it can be offered to students year after year.

Madison Rowohlt earned her undergraduate degree in Criminology, as well as her Masters in Counseling, at TCNJ. She has been a student assistance counselor at GLHS since March 2021.



Elizabeth Coalition to House the Homeless

Mikaela Santos came into our lives in the summer of 2022. In July, we received an email from Karen Gilmour, a yoga instructor with Alluem Yoga in Cranford, telling us about a young student with a desire to give back to the community, especially homeless children. She wanted to collect backpacks full of all the necessary school supplies to start the year off right. Mikaela, together with her instructor Karen, her sister Vivienne, her mother Yesica, her Aunt Natalie, and her good friend, Marielle, started a giving tree with the backpack needs of nearly 50 children in our housing programs.

A few weeks later at the beginning of the 2022 school year Mikaela passed away. Mikaela was just 11 years old. She lived most of her life in and out of hospitals because she had childhood cancer. So briefly did we know her yet how profoundly she affected us all. She left everyone she met with a sense of love and light. And it is her story we want to share with you today.

Just days after her death, her mother, sister, aunt, and friend delivered her backpack project to the Elizabeth Coalition. We were amazed at the love and care that went into creating each individual backpack. Mikaela willed her idea into being...she really made it happen!

What made Mikaela so special was her ability to transform her experiences of pain and illness into a project for others. Mikaela was asked what inclined her to helping others when she herself was going through so much. Mikaela answered, matter of fact-ly, "I might have cancer but I also have love, a home, and my family to support me. One thing does not have to do with the other."

Karen remembers Mikaela as someone who always showed up with love...to the studio...to her practice of yoga...to her friendships. "Every moment with Mikaela was a favorite one. I loved her little laugh and her sweet smile. Mikaela was a light in this world...and in my life."

Mikaela's mom, Yesica, recalls how knowing Mikaela made her a different person, "Mikaela was my first-born, she's the reason I became a

mother and then when her sister, Vivienne, was born we were complete. Knowing Mikaela makes me feel honored and proud to be her mother." Mikaela's precious spirit burns brightly in memory for those who loved her most but also for those lives she touched so briefly with her creativity, her giving, and her compassion.

The children who received a backpack wrote notes and drew pictures to thank Mikaela. Some notes make mention of an angel, which is how they choose to remember her and her supreme act of bravery in being a force for good in the world. To be so young and yet full of such a wise mind and kind heart, sharing her blessings with others, is a page from her remarkable story that we can all learn and grow from.


